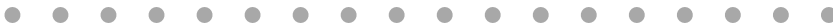
## **A Fund-raising Evening for the Cystic Fibrosis Trust**

Cystic Fibrosis is an inherited condition caused by a faulty gene. This gene controls the movement of salt and water in and out of the cells, so in a person with CF, the lungs and digestive system become clogged with mucus, making it hard to breathe and digest food. There are approximately 10,000 people in the UK with CF; each week, five babies are born with it, and two people die.

There is currently no cure for CF, but many treatments are available to manage it, including physiotherapy, exercises, medication and nutrition. Forty years ago, children with CF were not expected to live past their fifth birthday. Now, half the CF population will live past 41. Research by the Gene Therapy Consortium has progressed to the clinical trials stage, but there is still a long way to go before this becomes a possible 'cure'. The CF Trust has supported the GTC's gene therapy research for 15 years and has just committed a further £500,000 for further CF clinical trials. New fund-raising initiatives are also now being put forward by the CF Trust for research into other areas like stem cell research and genetic editing.

We do hope you will join us and our families for what we hope will be a fun evening, and help us raise some much needed funds for the Cystic Fibrosis Trust – and give our 19 year old grandson with Cystic Fibrosis, and all other sufferers, a chance to live a longer and healthier life.

## **Denmead Horticultural Society**

In June Kevin Hobbs talk on pruning took us through the year with practical advice on taming a wide range of shrubs, trees and other perennials. He started with the basic rules of cutting to a bud, making a sloping cut and sterilising blades with bleach or disinfectant. This is particularly important with the arrival of diseases such as sudden oak death. Phytophthora is prevalent in viburnums, conifers, pieris, junipers and Japanese maple and is easily transferred to other plants. Browning of a branch may be due to drought the previous summer but if it is still there the next year cut out and burn the diseased growth.

Pruning can improve flowering and fruiting and control the size and shape of plants so you can fit more into the space available. Some plants such as echinacea prefer to be cut back in spring as they have attractive seed-heads over winter and as with penstemons the old growth protects the crown from cold. In June we visited the inspiring Tuppenny Barn project at Southbourne. Maggie Haynes showed us round the thriving organic fruit and vegetable garden which supplies their shop and told us how she involves local schools who planted the orchard and groups who come to help and learn how to grow food. Courses are held in the circular eco build education centre. On Tuesday 7th July Sarah Furey's talk is 'Creating your Herbal Medicine Chest'. She is a qualified medical herbalist and will guide us through the uses of plants found in summer hedgerows & chalk downland. Visitors (£2) are welcome, 7.30pm at the Church Hall.

## Neighbourhood Watch

### Recent Scams

Criminals in the area are continuing to line their pockets with a number of scams, leaving victims often losing many thousands of pounds. Anyone can be a potential victim, so be aware and alert.

**Cold Calling.** The caller telephones you, and claims to be from the Police or Fraud Squad. They say that your bank account or credit card has been compromised and ask you to call your bank immediately. They keep the phone line open, and despite dialling the correct number you end up talking to the people who called in the first place who now pretend they are from the bank. Various ploys can then be used to either get you to hand over the details of your bank account, or go and withdraw cash from your local branch. In the latter case the cash is then collected from the victim later in the day. Recent losses of £17000 & £13000 by senior citizens show that the threat is serious.

**Ticket Fraud.** Fraudsters are actively monitoring social media to source pictures of event tickets. The

fraudster then makes counterfeit copies of the tickets and sells dozens of the counterfeits via ticket resale platforms. Purchasers of the tickets then find themselves turned away at the venue. Lessons : don't show off your tickets on social media sites, use official ticket outlets, buy tickets using a credit card.

**Emails re iTunes.** There has been a wave of spoof emails purporting to come from iTunes. They give details of a recent 'purchase' you made from iTunes, but also provide a link to click if you think you have not actually purchased the item. Needless to say this link leads to a webpage asking for card and other personal details which, if completed, gives the fraudsters what they need to remove some of your cash. This is only one of the mountain of spoof emails being distributed. Many look remarkably like the genuine article from the bank, HMRC or other organisation concerned, and you must be vigilant. ## **Hampshire County Council**

### **Denmead Enhancements**

Some of you may have seen the environmental enhancements which are taking place at the roundabout at Hatchmore, close to the Harvest Home. These enhancements were initiated by Hampshire County Council and myself, using monies from developers. By replacing tarmac roundabouts with a greener and 'softer' environment, to include planting of shrubs, it will improve the rural landscape. Local residents and users of Creech Wood will also be pleased to learn that a new pavement is being constructed to give safer access to leisure facilities and dog walking!

### **Hambledon Access**

The £4 million Hambledon Flood Alleviation Scheme is being lead by the County Council. Phase two is the 'big pipe' phase of the work and has now started with Mildren Construction Ltd appointed as the contractor.

Mildren's normal working hours will be Monday to Friday from

7:30 am to 5.00 pm. The County Council will have at least one Officer on site at all times during the works.

Traffic management arrangements for Phase Two - due to the limited space, it will be necessary to close sections of the road while work is being undertaken. Signed diversion routes will be in operation depending on where the contractor is working. Buses will be re-routed using the same system as during the floods with a shuttle bus. Once the works pass Old Barn Crescent, buses will use it as a turning area allowing the Hambledon service to resume.

### **Free Driver Awareness Workshops for 60+**

Hampshire County Council is running free driver awareness workshops across the County

over the next year for motorists aged 60 and over. It wants to help people to keep driving safely for longer. However, their eyesight, hearing, reaction time and judgement of speed and distance may not be as sharp as it once was and, in the event of an accident causing injury, they can take longer to recover.

# CAB

**Q I work full time but have recently been ill.What happens to my holiday if I am off sick?**

A If you are off sick, you will be entitled to build up statutory paid holiday while you are off work. When you return to work, you can ask your employer if you can take the holiday you have built up before the end of the leave year. If you have had your employment terminated while you were off sick, you are entitled to be paid all the statutory holiday pay you have built up.

If your employer refuses to let you take holiday on your return to work or refuses to pay you statutory holiday pay you have built up if your job has ended, you can ask an employment tribunal to enforce your rights. You may be able to make a claim for all your unpaid holiday pay. You must make a claim within three months of the last date you were not paid holiday pay.
