ear Friends. Welcome back - we've missed you!

After a lengthier delay than any of us hoped, it is now my great pleasure to send you greetings again from everyone at All Saints. After a significant break, it is wonderful to welcome you; and I hope that you will once again enjoy this community magazine.



The last two years have been difficult on so many levels, for so many people. Like me, perhaps the last two years have all merged – I can't pinpoint events in 2020, nor in 2021... somehow lockdowns, restrictions, hopes, fears, joys, sorrows, and dreams have all blurred into one big canvas!

In the summer of 2020, I can remember thinking that surely this pandemic would all be over by Christmas! Little did I realise that 2021 would be just as messy, just as hard, just as difficult. That there would be more tears and more dark moments, times of frustration, pain, and disappointment.

And of course, as I write now, 2022 is looking like it will be difficult also; Covid numbers are increasing, and there is a foreboding fear as we watch the war unfolding in Ukraine. We all feel a bit helpless and struggle to know what to do. I would urge us all to pray, that the ways of the wicked would be frustrated, and that God's peace and healing will prevail.

But through all this mess I, and many others, have not lost faith. Not because of any great strength or power that I possess, not because I'm the Vicar, far from it, but because each day I choose to trust in the One, who has beaten evil and overcome all darkness, pain, and sin.

This One died and rose again, guaranteeing that love will win! This One is Jesus Christ – God's Son, who came to reveal God and make Him known, to offer healing, forgiveness, strength, and peace. Through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection we see the only One who can bring hope, light, and life to all.

#### The Letter

The last few years have pushed many of us to the edge of our resources – we have run low, or doubted, or got angry. But we can have faith, faith in God. And faith doesn't have to be big, strong, bold; Jesus said it could be as small as the tiny mustard seed (Matthew 17:20).

Faith can mean hanging on to God with little more than our fingertips. God specialises in weak people – not only strengthening them, but even making use of them too.

Now I know that this can sound glib, 'easy for me to say', especially for those who have been bereaved or ill, lost jobs or businesses, struggled with isolation or depression. These words can sound empty, hollow, or plain ridiculous!

But please, don't just take my word for it. Over many years of ministry,

many, many people have said to me, from the depths of their own personal tragedy and suffering, that it is precisely at these times they have known God's grace and love in a newer and deeper way.

And in this present situation, where so many feel beyond the end of their personal strength and resource, I am frequently humbled by people's own stories of the quiet, daily miracle of God's inner strength coming just when needed. Let the witness of those who have found God in the very depths reassure you that He is there for you, too.

And so, as I welcome you back – can I encourage us all to look up, to reach out to God, to trust that He will see us through the past, the present and the future.

Let us, together, look upwards and onward in Hope.

#### The Chronicle Takes Legs!

The Parish Chronicle is now thankfully up and running again, after we had to stop producing and delivering the Chronicle in 2020 due to the pandemic, and we now have a larger team of volunteers helping out with editorial, advertising and distribution.

It was in January 1955 that the Denmead Parish Chronicle was first published. The Vicar of All Saints at the time, Revd. George Greenfield, launched it as a development of the "Parish Notes and News" that used to keep parishioners informed, mostly regarding Church matters. The new Chronicle included a news sheet published by the Diocese but also featured a variety of articles of interest, including household hints and even short stories. Over the years it has evolved, along with the changing nature of village life, and gradually started to contain more information about village clubs and societies.

Various methods of production and publishing have been used, depending on the print technology of the time. Then in 1998, at the

instigation of Revd. Andrew Ashdown, it was decided to produce it completely "in house" using Desktop Publishing software on home computers, a digital duplicator and a collating machine. This continued for many years, masterminded by Capt. John Day. When he was no

longer able to continue, the decision was taken to have The Chronicle professionally printed, giving us the benefit of being able to print in full colour.

It is very interesting to read Revd. Greenfield's thoughts on his "New Venture" in 1955 in which he says:

"I regard the publishing of a parish periodical an important means of communication which keeps

people informed of matters about the Church and other activities of interest to the village. I have felt that there was a possibility of producing a periodical more attractive, with reading matter that would have a wider appeal, and therefore an increased circulation. The Denmead Parish Chronicle is the result of these ideas which have taken legs, and I hope that it will prove of value to the life of the Church and village."

Even in today's world of digital communication and social media we believe that this still holds true - so the Parish Chronicle "takes legs" again!

#### **New Look Tennis Club**





depend on the site's terms and conditions. If you're worried about the event being cancelled, it's a good idea to look at the terms and conditions before booking. If you bought from a private seller, unfortunately it's unlikely you'll be able to recover your money, even if the event is cancelled or rescheduled. We recommend contacting the seller to see what they can do.

Ahead of any events you've booked, keep checking the information from the official seller or organiser to make sure you know straight away about any updates, like changes to the date or cancellations. Another thing to be aware of is that scammers exploit these situations for their own benefit. If your event is cancelled and anyone - whether it's a person or a company - offers their services to try to recover money on your behalf, be suspicious. Make sure that you're aware of the signs of a potential scam and always be on the look-out.

It's understandable to be feeling apprehensive when there's been so much change, and knowing your rights will help you deal with anything unexpected. If you've got tickets to an event which goes ahead, but you change your mind about going or realise you're no longer able to go, you have no legal right to a refund.

However, if the event is cancelled, your right to a refund will depend on how you bought the ticket. If you booked through an official seller and the organiser cancels, moves, reschedules, or makes the event behind closed doors, you should get a refund. This is true even if it's cancelled due to a government ban on large events. If this happens, contact the official seller to find out how you can get a refund.

If you bought your ticket from a ticketreselling website, your refund will

#### Walks from Denmead

This is the shortest in a series of 35 self-guided walking routes from the village and should take about an hour. It is ideal for a pleasant evening stroll from Kidmore Lane car park initially heading toward Sawyers Hill before bearing left off the bridleway and dropping down the steep field into the hamlet of Pithill before returning along Wayfarers Walk to the centre of Denmead.

Leaving Kidmore Lane car park go R up the lane then after about 150m turn R into Tanners Lane. At the end of Tanners Lane bear L going steadily up White Horse Lane passing several dwellings including Little Denmead Farm.



On reaching the Sawyers Hill junction at the end of White Horse Lane, cross the road and continue on the uneven surface of this bridleway. (NB The entrance to the bridleway is very muddy, can be impassable after rain and is particularly bad during the winter months.)

Part way up the lane go L over a stile, but before doing so take note of the footpath direction from the yellow sign adjacent to the stile. If in doubt head slightly to the right of the electricity pylon ahead which will take you toward a second stile on the other side of the field.

Cross this second stile but then pause to enjoy the view before walking carefully down the steep field into the hamlet of Pithill. After going over this latest stile turn R then go L at the junction heading back to Denmead along Harrowgate Lane.

Nearing the end of Harrowgate Lane

the route joins Wayfarers Walk as the swing gate on the R is passed. A little further on turn L at the junction then shortly afterwards go R passing through another gate before walking along the side of the field as far as the final gate on this walk.

Remain on the path which eventually goes to the L then R before passing the cemetery. With the high garden fence in front turn L and head back along Cemetery Lane turning R at the junction with Kidmore Lane. The

CP is a short distance along the lane on the LHS.

Her love of motorbikes grew and later encompassed racing cars. In fact, she won several races at Brooklands!

Normally there would be many social events during the year. However, the last indoor event was nearly two years ago, a line dancing evening, which kept everyone on their toes and helped with their fitness.






we will elect our Officers and Committee.


