As I sit to write this letter, we have heard this morning of BorisJohnson's resignation as ConservativeLeader, and of his commitment to step down as Prime Minister once a new leader is found. In many ways it comes as no surprise; for some time, there has been a growing sense of dissatisfaction, and in recentdays, an unprecedented number of Members of Parliament - including Cabinet Ministers - have resigned, all citing a lack of trust and confidence in leadership.

Nowl realise I am treading on eggshells, for we will all have different political views and opinions, and my intention is not to align myself one way or another. But politics and religion must mix, for both are concerned with support for the



vulnerable, care for those who have least, and issues of justice, fairness, and equity for all. Some will be delighted at the news today; others will be angered or disappointed – but for many the overwhelming sense will be: what next? What next?

We are journeying through difficult days

As a nation we're still emerging from some very difficult years, as we've struggled (and continue to struggle) through a CovidPandemic; and now we face significant increases in the cost of living, prompted especially by rises in the cost of food and fuel that have impacted the lives of many, and will continue to affect many more in the days, weeks, and months ahead. We are challenged with difficult decisions

world-wide as we work in partnership with other leaders and nations to promote ways of peace and reconciliation. We are journeyingthrough difficult days, at home and abroad, and now,

more than ever, we need a government and leadership that will exhibit wisdom, discernment, integrity, and humility.

we need to be committed to praying for our politicians

As Christians, followers of Jesus' pattern and example, we need to be committed to praying for our politicians. Indeed, Scripture actively encourages us to pray for all those in positions of authority, those with influence and leadership. And so can I urge us all to be praying that the hearts and minds of all politicians – whatever their particular creed - might be turned and attuned to the values and priorities of Christ's kingdom – so that their intellect and energies might focus on serving the people, promoting the common good, and formulating policies, procedures and practices that enable all to flourish.

We need to recognise that leadership is never easy; but let us pray continually that our politicians, cabinet members, and indeed a new Prime Minister are motivated not by their own personal ambition or selfglory, but by a committed and passionate desire to serve, and to promote all that is good, true, and honourable. We need to pray that each will discover the strength, hope and wisdom that only God can give.

This August, a month in which life slows slightly, and patterns are perhaps different or changed, can I urge you to find some space, each day, to pray for the life of this nation and its leaders, in the hope that together we may embrace a future based on integrity and humility - a future in which God's kingdom of justice, peace, and love might be furthered, both in our nation and in the world at large.

Horticultural Society Village Show - something for everyone!

At our July talk from Katherine Lee we learnt that, having always loved gardening and after twenty years in the city, she retrained as a garden designer. Interestingly the job is mainly about problem solving; considering the soil, drainage, client needs and assessing the hotchpotch of plants that have been added over time. Key points to the design include; the unity of the garden with the house and the surrounding landscape, scale in relation to buildings and size of plants; time and how plants, especially trees, will grow and change the character of the garden, and finally space and how it is divided. Katherineshowed us many examples from well-known gardens and tookus through the design process from initial survey to presentation to the client. We saw some of her lovely completed designs and she gave us plenty of ideas to consider in our own gardens.

Also in July we attended the Infant & Junior Schools' Fayre for the first time to publicise our show with a fun activity for the children. Jo, one of our helpers, said, "Wehad a great time planting microgreen seeds with the children and seeing their expressions; from being introduced to these tiny seedlings, watering them and then carrying them away looking dead chuffed with themselves. It was also really encouraging talking to so many younger adults who said how they remembered being taken to the show by their grandparents as kids, but thought that as they didn't grow vegetables that it wasn't for them. Until they learnt about the other activities on offer. Yes, we have a dog! Oh, I love baking and crafts stalls! We'refree that day, see you there!"

Lesley Rose, Advice Services Manager for Citizens Advice WinchesterDistrict gives advice on what to do if your flight is delayed or cancelled this summer.

I'm due to fly to Spain during the school summer holidays. After hearing about all the problems at airports, I'm really worried.My family have been looking forward to this and it's cost us a lot of money. What do we do if ourflight is cancelled or delayed?

A lot of people will be worriedafter seeing the recent news about flights. If you face issues, the Citizens Advice website has lots of information about what to do when your flight is delayed or cancelled.

If you're already at the airportwhen they announce the delay, the airline should give you food and drink, access to phone calls and emails. You should also get accommodation if you're delayed overnight (including journeys to and from the airport).

Your airline might offer you vouchers to pay for these or advise you to keep receipts to claim back expenses later. They will only refund 'reasonable' expenses, not expensive meals or luxury hotels.

What counts as a long enough delay to get this help depends on how long yourflight is. A short flight only needs to be delayed two hours, whereas a flight of more than 3,500km needs to be more than four hours. Full details are on the Citizens Advice website.

It's worth knowing that if your flight is delayed for more than five hours, you don't have to take it. The airline legally has to give you a full refund for that flight (and any onward flights and returnflights if you're part-way through a connecting journey). Talk to someone from the airline as soon as you decide you don't want to fly.

If yourflight is cancelled altogether, you've a legal right to either a full refund or a replacement flight to get you to your destination. The refund includes any onward flights and money for a returnflight if you're part-way through a connecting journey. Ask about this at the airport you can.

Don't just rebookanother flight yourself - check with the airline first

because it's their responsibility to sort out your replacement. If you do have to rebookit yourself, keep any receipts and evidence of why the airline couldn't do this for you, for example screenshots



of live chats. If the cancellation ends up delaying you getting to your holiday by two or more hours, you're entitled to help with costs.

Checkif you're entitled to compensation for a delayed or cancelled flight. Again, this will depend on how long the delay was, the distance, and whether it's the airline's fault.

The Citizens Advice website has details on claiming compensation for delays or cancellations from the airline. You might also be able to claim from your travel insurance – check if your policy covers this.

Denmead Walks

This walk takes us through woodland and along sections of both Wayfarers Walk and the Monarch's Way. The route is only possible in summer or early autumn as Harrowgate Lane is impassable at certain times of the year, however there are lovely views to be enjoyed after a strenuous climb from Fiveways junction toward Old Mill Lane.

Around the Green

WALK DETAILS Distance 8.8 km (5.5 miles) DuraĆon 2h 20m SĆles 8 Grade MODERATE (3/5)

Park at Denmead Community Centreand leave by reargate turning L and continuing uphill as far as Lincoln Greennursery. Herecross the road and walk along the FP then either go over the stile on the official path or take the parallel permissive path through the woodland.

I km/ 0.6mile Both routes lead to the Wayfarers Walk footpath. On reaching the latter turn L (through the gate off the permissive path) and after 500m reach a second gate. After going through the latter turn L then almost immediately R into Harrowgate Lane. Continue on this lane to Pithill then go straight on as far as Fiveways junction.

2.78km/1.73milesAt this point go over the stile on the right adjacent to the metal gate which soon becomes a steep climb, however near the top take the time to turn around and admire the


view across the valley, this being the best of the walk.

The path then goes through a gap in the hedge continuing across a field – if the FP is unclear head for the larger tree slightly to the L on the far side of the field. The field beyond is accessed through another metal swing gate. A similar gate on the far side of this field leads to a narrow footpath with a dwelling to the left.



3.63km/2.2miles Passing through a wooden gate go across Old Mill Lane heading in the direction of Lovedean. Partway along this lane go R at the fingerpost following the direction of the latter passing an electric pylon while heading toward Mill Copse.On reaching this woodland,

bear L along its perimeterand at the end of the trees follow the Monarch's Way direction marker around the edge of the field. With paddocks and the top of the nearby sub-station visible on the RHS, cross a series of five stiles and after the final



4.51km/2.8miles The canopy of trees continues for a short distance after which the road goes downhill passing Lovedean electricity sub-station. Shortly afterwards there

busy lane so GREATCAREIS NEEDEDwhen walking a distance of about 120mto the entrance of Broadway Farm.

5.26km/3.28miles Turn R at the farm entrance and remain on this straight track for some distance eventually passing through a farm yard. Just before an open barn on the R, bear L then almost immediately R before passing the farmhouse and coming out onto the lane. Bear R passing a semidetached dwelling and the Crossroadsjunction is about 400m ahead.

6.5km/4miles Goover the low stile next to the

Edneys Lane sign and continue across the field on a well-defined footpath at the end of which go L in front of Little Denmead Farm. After passing the neighbouring dwelling, Bleak Cottage, go R onto the footpath, cross the stile further along the path then walk around the right-hand perimeter of the field. On reaching Kidmore Lane after climbing over a stile, go L and after about 50m turn R passing through the metal gate. Stay close to the hedge on your R then turn L at the fencing.

Usually, a sprung electrical fencing is in place further on, but the orange holder on one side can be pulled out in order to gain access to this part of the route - please replace after passing through. Walk along this straight footpath keeping close to the fence and hedge with the outbuildings of Pyles Farm to the L. The path eventually drops downhill, then, after going over the last stile of the walk, bear L on Wayfarers Walk for a short distance before taking a R toward Harts Copse.

7.9km/4.9miles On reaching the latter go L, walk along the farm trackand wherea gap occurs cut into the woods on the RHS. Follow one of several tracks that eventually leads to the main path through the woodland and the five-bar gate adjacent to the B2150. After crossing the main road go R, walk 100m and the community centreis straight ahead.




Family fun at annual Denmead Scout camp



Emergency defects are usually made safe within two hours. These repairs may be temporary with permanent repairs being made later. Other defects become part of the maintenance programme and are usually repaired within two months. Larger or more complex works, such as major resurfacing, are generally scheduled separately.

In an emergency, or if you suspect you or someone else is in immediate danger, phone 999.

Free Shingles Vaccine for 70 – 79 Year Olds

A vaccine to prevent shingles, a common, painful skin disease, is available on the NHS to people in their 70s. The shingles vaccine is given as an injection into the upper arm. Unlike the flu vaccine, you'll only need to have the vaccination once and you can have it at any time of the year.

Most people will only need one dose, but some people who cannot have the routine vaccine for health reasons will need two doses. The shingles vaccine is expected to reduce your risk of getting shingles. If you do go on to have the disease, your symptoms may be milder and the illness shorter. It's fine to have the shingles vaccine if you've already had shingles. The shingles vaccine works very well in people who have had shingles before, and it will boost your immunity against further shingles attacks. Your GP will tell you how long to wait after you recoverfrom shingles before having the shingles vaccine. This may be up to one year.

You are eligible for the shingles vaccine if you are aged 70 - 79. The shingles vaccine is not available on the NHSto anyone aged 80 or over because it seems to be less effective in this age group.

Once you become eligible for shingles vaccination a GPor practice nurse will offer you the vaccine when you attend the surgeryfor general reasons. However, if you are worriedthat you may miss out on the shingles vaccination, contact your GP surgery to arrange an appointment to have the vaccine.
