
#### **Church News**


This is always a very popular event and we look forward to many local artists showing their work. Comealong and enjoy the paintings, and maybe buy a gift for someone – or for yourself!

#### Around the Green

#### A Special Village Association Meeting

Didyou know that Special Constables were introduced in Anglo Saxon times to keep the peace?

Local lad and Special Superintendent, Russell Morrison, gave an astonishing account of his role within Hampshire Constabulary. His presentation to the DVA was an enlightening experience for us all as he provided examples of the involvement of Specials in major events, along with some of the history such as Charles II in 1673 ensuring that any citizen could be sworn in as a temporary constable, should there be threats of disorder.

The role was extremely important during times of crisis including the World Wars, the Police strikes of 1918and 1919, the General Strike in 1926and the 2012 Olympics. Officers have also been on duty throughout Covid, enforcing and supporting as required.

The murder of Glenn Goodman by the IRA in 1992 is a significant point in the history of the role as it showed that special constables were undertaking more frontline positions and facing the same threats alongside their regular police colleagues.

Russell providedimages of the different uniforms including the 'Woolly Jumpers' and handed around his kit for members to investigate, including his heavy body armour. He discussed the difference in badges, uniforms and ranks over the years and the fact that he has three different uniforms depending on the situation. His radio is a vital bit of kit as it is linked to the control room—if the panic button is hit they will hear what is happening and he can also send texts, images and converse with other officers. Body-wornvideo is essential in protecting both the officerand public and can be downloaded for

evidence. Notebooksare being phased out in favour of electronic devices as irrefutable evidence.

Attitudes have changed and now Special Constables are part of the 'police family' whereas in the past they had been regarded as only attending fetes and the like and were accused of 'stealing overtime' by some regular officers.

Specials have to undergo a year's training, an exam and swear an oath before a magistrate before being enrolled. This is followed by another year on the street,

supported by tutors. Training is on-going to cover Personal Safety, Emergency First Aid and fitness. A commitment of 16hours a month is required with no salary but expenses can be claimed.

Special Constables can be assigned to support the regular police, taking on shifts such as Responseand Patrol, prevention of anti-social behaviour as well as working with community groups. Some have been trained as community first responders and carry first aid kits while other teams can be deployed as search parties or to support CIDor cyber security, particularly if that may be part of their own employment and expertise.

Russell discussed the use of taser guns and truncheons and how the police are trained to hit large muscle groups but never on the head. No Special carries a gun, these are for specially trained officers only.

Russell's role, as a senior officer, includes frontline support, strategic involvement and decision making, the welfare of his Specials, discipline, line management, dealing with policy and procedures, recruitment and more.

Russell also described how he is an Ambassador of the College of Policing and a White Ribbon Ambassador to end men's violence against women.

Russell previously worked in the aerospace industry with the Red Arrows and space satellites. He now teaches Computer Science in Fareham. Russell describedhow he was always verypassionate about his local community, so did youth and voluntary work. At a crossroads in his career about 18 years ago, he became a Special Constable to see if a career in the police force was for him.

Specials come from all walks of life including teachers, taxi drivers and stay-at-home mums. Their motivation takes many forms; some wish to give back to the community or try out the role prior to joining the regular police force, others see it as a challenge dealing with confrontation or just learning how to negotiate complex situations.

Locally Special Constables are involved in speeding issues around Denmead, flytipping and the Christmas drink/driving initiative. There are currently around 230 Specials in Hampshire, all of whom do a great job in supporting front line officers. With Russell at the helm and his dedication to his team and Hampshire, we are very fortunate have such great support!

#### Around the Green

#### **Denmead Walks**

This quite long walk is to the east of Denmead starting at the Harvest Home, passing through Creech Woods before heading to Sheepwash. After joining Wayfarers Walk for a little way the route then goes through woodland before crossing Newlands Lane when it begins the second leg as it picks up the Berewood Trail. Therefollows a section along ClosewoodRoad and through the golf links before the final stretchon the village greenways back to the pub.

**WALK DETAILS** 

Length 10km (6.25 miles)
DuraDon 2h 30m
Walk Grade EASY (2/5)
SDles 1

This walk can start at a number of points, but directions are from the Harvest Home pub. Go R from the pub CP, cross the roundabout and head up Bunkers Hill going left at the 40mph sign into Creech Woods. Head uphill along this



track and bear L on reaching the road that leads to the CP, but turn L a short distance further on not continuing through the CP. After about 30m go R passing between two posts flanking the CreechWoodsWalking Trail.

Continue for some distance until the track bends to the R - this leads to a junction where paths cross. Hereturn L and continue along this straight path for 400m. Take either the bridleway or FP to exit the woods.

I.7km/I.1milesOn reaching Furzeley Road go R, then after about 100m go R again heading in the direction of Sheepwash. Stay on this road for about 600m, pass Belney Lane at Threeways junction and continue for about the same distance as far as Sheepwash Farm.

3.1km/1.9miles Crossthe short bridge after the farmhouse and go R passing through a gate onto Wayfarers Walk. After 300m go L, crossing a stile while following the green WWsign. About 100m further on go around a metal gate and head diagonally R across a field on a well-defined and signposted FP. At the next gate follow the path that goes R about 20m further on before continuing on the LHside of woodland.

3.9km/2.4miles Another gate soon appears and after passing through it again follow the WWsign this time to the L. Stay on this track through the woodland for about 300m then turn Lat the crossroads along a wide track following the yellow FP sign. After about 200m the track goes downhill, crosses a short bridge just after which another gate provides an exit from the



woodland following a shortuphill climb.

4.47km/2.8miles Turn L at this point and stay on the path which runs at the bottom of three successive fields. The FP in the third field initially goes uphill then starts heading downward when two gates soon appear on the L. Pass through each before going R and walking the very short distance to Newlands Lane.

5km/3.3miles This is a very busy and potentially dangerous cornerso listen for



traffic before crossing the road then pick up the FP opposite. After about 10m turn L onto the Berewood Trail and stay on this track for some distance.

6.55km/4. I miles Crossthe first of two bridges and carrystraight on until the trail starts to go uphill.

7.28km/4.5miles Lookfor a large flat-roofed building on the RHS and when nearly level with the latter go L onto a partially concealed FP-look for a yellow FP marker on the LHS. Note, there is a FP opposite with logs cut into seats that leads toward the estate. The footpath to take is just over I 50m long and leads to Closewood Road, which on reaching go L and walk along the road for about 500m until a green Wayfarers sign is seen on the R. Go along


this path then head diagonally Racross the field on a well-defined path as far as the edge of the golf course.

Again, this is a potentially dangerous area as one could get hit by a golf ball, so it is essential to be vigilant and observantwhen crossing the coursein three stages. Firstly, head for the bridge, then across to the next section which is slightly to the R then head for the brown fencing on the edge of the woodland.

On entering the woods go L at the fence and continue along the narrow FP with the paddock on the RHS. After passing the brick-built stables, also on the RHS, the path opens onto a wide driveway that leads to Furzeley Road.

8.5km/ 5.3miles Go R at this point and walk as far as the junction with Forest Road. Crossthe road and go along the pedestrian pathway turning Lafter about 100m into Mead End Greenway. It is then a matter of continuing along the greenways passing through Forest Mead and Home Mead before coming to CreechView. Staying on the greenway the path eventually passes the wetland area adjacent to the small playing field/common. Herego Laround the common on the path and on reaching the houses go R and the pub will be straight ahead.




The Cubs, Scouts and Leaders had a great time and are eagerly anticipating next year's Summer Camp.




