Our Servant Queen Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

It was a day we all knew would come... for some time our Late Queen Elizabeth had been struggling with ill health and decreased mobility, yet, as news of Her Majesty's death flooded through our media on the eve of Thursday 8th September, many of us were still overcome with feelings of shock, devastation and brokenness. Allthough we may not have met the Queen, or known her personally, we were aware of the great loss – the loss of a Queen who has served

this Nation, Church and Commonwealth, with integrity, devotion and wisdom for more than 70 years.

The day after the Queen's death, we hosted a short service of Prayer and Thanksgiving at All Saints– and at this service I shared my initial throughts which I include again now:

I wonder what stands out in your memory about The Queen? What will you always remember about her?

For me, I don't remember a time without her...

Our Queen was steadfast, dutiful, and faithful. She served and loved this nation, and the Commonwealth, with integrity, fidelity, and humility.

The fact that Her Majesty the Queen was performing public and private duties the day before she died, aged 96, is utterly characteristic of her whole life.

Aged 21, she declared that 'my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service'. She asked for God's help 'to make good her vow', and for the prayers of the nation. She did make good that vow.

Her whole life was characterized by unfussy, unflashy, unfailing faithfulness. Her whole life, her words, her actions, pointed in the same direction, and therefore had integrity and impact. It also made her a reassuring symbol of reliability and dependability.

The Letter

Her Majesty prayed this prayer as she prepared for her Coronation:

"Into thy hands, O Lord, we commend ourselves. Be with us in our going out and our coming in. Strengthen us for the work that thou hast given us to do. Defend us with they heavenly grace, that we may continue thine for ever and daily increase in the Holy Spirit more and more, until we come to thy everlasting Kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

The Queen has now come into that Kingdom. And I'm sure God has welcomed her, 'well done, good and faithful servant'.

For a nation hasn't just lost its Queen, a commonwealth its sovereign, or a family its beloved mother and grandmother. Political leaders have lost a confidante, and the world a standard of public leadership that was "driven by faith, propelled by duty," as one royal correspondent put it.

Driven by faith. Yes. Every Christmas Day she reminded us of it - that she looked up to another Crown, bent her knee to a Greater Sovereign - King Jesus.

If we're looking for the source of her loyalty and service, there it is - and will be for all who would follow her example.

God saved the Queen. May a new King now lift his eyes heavenward. Amen

Now, as we've all had opportunity to reflect, we continue to give thanks for the life of Queen Elizabeth, we remember and pray for the Royal Family in their ongoing grief and loss, and we pray for our new King Charles III, that he, too may have God's help in all that lies ahead.

So generally, our regular trips fall into three categories, all providing a door-to-door service:

Shopping Every week we have a trip to Morrisons, Horndean on a Tuesday morning and once a month there is a trip to Sainsburys, Waterlooville on a Wednesday afternoon.

Village Activities at the Village Centre on School Lane The minibus supports people going to the Weekly Luncheon Club on Thursdays and to the Monthly Afternoon Social Club on a Tuesday afternoon.

Denmead Walks 8

This walk from the Harvest Home pub is quite long but there are no steep inclines, however it can be shortened if starting and finishing at the Chairmakers pub, but permission to park must be obtained from either pub. The route takes in lanes, footpaths and bridleways and also passes through woodland to the west of Denmead, yet be aware that it can be very wet underfoot in sections if attempted after prolonged heavy rain.

WALK DETAILS

Length 10.7 km (6.7 miles) Duration 2h 45m Walk Grade EASY (2/5) Stiles 6

From the Harvest Home car park go R and head across the roundabout toward Southwick. Continue up Bunkers Hill before crossing the road at the 40mph traffic sign into woodland opposite. Follow a winding path and go R when it emerges onto the wide track that passes through the western section of Creech Woods.



2.2km/1.37miles On leaving the woodland turn L onto Apless Lane and walk some distance passing a holiday let named The Old Stables and Upper Beckford Farm. A little further along the lane turn R onto the Alan King Way footpath at the metal swing gate and continue across a couple of fields keeping close to the fence or hedge on the R.

Part way around, the path bears R after crossing the first stile on the walk before it follows a clearly defined farm track with an electric fence to the L. Eventually this leads to another stile that gives access to Fareham Road at a point between the Chairmakers and the Horse and Jockey pubs.

3.7km/2.3miles Go L on reaching the road but be careful walking along the uneven verge of this busy road. Just after the Horse and Jockey cross the road and turn R into Bunns Lane. Stay on the lane passing several dwellings including Bunns Lane Farm until eventually coming to metal gates on the LHS.

4.83km/3miles Go through the narrower gate, continue along the wide track (do not deviate to the R further along the farm track,) cross a short bridge

over a stream (the latter is usually dry in summer) and head for another stile on the far side of the second field, then keeping close the hedge on the RH side another stile gives access to a bridleway.

Turn R onto the rather pitted surface of the bridleway which soon goes to the L then R when passing a spacious dwelling on the left named Oak Tree Cottage; a wide driveway which passes over a small bridge part way along its length leads to a lane.



5.6km/3.5miles At the lane, which is called Martin's Corner, go R and walk as far as the cross roads at Rudley Mill. 6.2km/3.9miles Continue along Bent Lane in the direction of Hambledon.

After a double bend about 500m along the lane go R into woodland. On coming to a junction of

paths about 150m into the wood, go straight ahead and a short distance further cross a shallow stream and earth mound heading for the fencing. Here it is necessary to turn R before following the enclosed Alan King Way FP in a straight line after an initial dog leg.

7.43km/4.6miles At the end of the straight section of FP a stile appears on the RHS, there turn L and at the end of the final stretch of enclosed path cross the last stile of the walk. Proceed in the same direction downhill past the fairly



recently built Meadows Farm on the R and original farmhouse on the other side of the wide track.

7.8km/4.9miles Turn R on reaching the Fareham Road but take care walking the final stretch on this busy road toward the Chairmakers pub. Turn L toward Denmead at the road junction, but try to cross immediately onto the far side where there is a

verge to walk on. Branch R after the pub into Apless Lane.

8.5km/5.3miles On coming to the western entrance of Creech Woods turn L and retrace your steps along the wide **track**. Bear L onto the minor path at the junction of paths just before the main road at the far end of the woodland.



It's all about the Bulb at the Horticultural Society

The Horticultural Society Show in August enjoyed lovely weather and lots of people came to enjoy the exhibits and entertainment, especially the popular dog show.

We resumed our evening meetings in September with an excellent talk on bulbs by Tim Woodland of Directbulbs. Many bulbs will naturalise in grass but it's important to let the leaves die down naturally before cutting the grass. Of the smaller bulbs; chionodoxas, the large flowered Dutch crocus, species tulips and anemone blanda establish well. Tim advised us to soak the dry



anemone corms for four to five hours before planting. In longer grass and damp areas try camassias and snakeshead fritillaries.

Most bulbs will come back year after year and benefit from feeding with a high potash and phosphate feed such as bonemeal – do this at the leaf and flower stage to encourage them to set flowers for the next year. Tulips however are best treated as annuals as although they produce new bulbs from the base these take many years to grow to the flowering stage.

Bulbs grow well in pots including some of the smaller ones such as muscari and dwarf iris. For growing indoors buy prepared bulbs such as hyacinths, paperwhite narcissi and hippeastrum and use special bulb fibre as this contains charcoal to keep the compost fresh. There are many more bulbs than can be stocked by garden centres (20,000 registered varieties of daffodils alone!) so seek out specialist suppliers for something different. Tim's talk opened our eyes to the wonderful variety of bulbs available and many of our members bought some to take home.

On 4th October we have a talk on Dahlias by John Wood, the head gardener at Hinton Ampner, 7.30pm at the church hall, visitors welcome.

Our Pumpkin and Apple Show is on 25th October. We will be pressing apples for juice so if you have apples to spare bring them along. The show is open from 6 – 8pm. This is Half Term, children are welcome and we will have several activities for them to try and fancy dress is optional, for adults as well! The show schedule is on our website or pick up a copy at Parkers.


At our regular lunchtime meeting, a sit down lunch is followed by a talk from a guest Speaker.

District Council Up-date October 2022

It's normally a generally a quiet month in August with only the Planning committee meeting. This year there have been several bodies meeting, mainly due to the emergence of the new Local Plan which is due to be published for consultation in its Draft form in the Autumn this year.

The New Plan will be a roll forward of the existing document but requires to be scrutinised as new sites for development have been identified and assessed for suitably of inclusion.

Denmead's Local Neighbourhood Plan group (DLNP) have been very active for over 12 months as Denmead opted to produce its own updated Neighbourhood plan, in line with the National Planning Policy Framework and the local authorities proposed plan. The Portfolio Holder for Planning and local ward member Mike Read (who is Shadow Portfolio Holder) met with the Denmead Group for an up-date on the parishes plan. It is a challenging job for the local community of volunteers and is led by Cllr Kevin Andreoli, but they are on top of the game. We as ward Councillors are supporting the Parish Council over reducing the building allocation numbers required from Denmead.

Unlike the last Local Plan which had to publish a separate Gypsy and Travellers Supplementary Document, on this occasion it will form part of the Local Plan Documentation

The timetable for the Draft Local Plan is to present it to the decision day on 3rd October. Prior to that it will go to the Scrutiny Committee who have invited the Local Plan Advisory Panel on 22nd September. The feedback from this will feed into the decision day paper. The Regulation 18 local plan draft will then be published for consultation. It is hoped to still meet the original publication date in early 2023. "It is a very ambitious timetable." said ClIr Mike Read.

I would encourage all residents to understand how this new plan will impact us and take the opportunity to comment of the Draft Plan not only here in Denmead but the whole of the Winchester District.

We would welcome you to visit us at a Local Government Surgery to speak to us, your ward Councillors, about the local plan or any other issues you would like to raise. Surgeries are held on the first Saturday of each month from 10am to 12 noon in the Heath Room, All Saints Church. No appointment is required.
