earFriends, As I write this letter, the sun is shining and there are birds looking for berries in our garden, where one or two butterflies can be seen on the few remaining flowers. But it is noticeably colder in the morning and evening now, the daylight disappears much earlier, greens are turning to gold and, by the time you read this, autumn will be all around us and the warmth and joy of summer just a memory.



We are fortunate though to have those memories; an inability to rememberis, at best, embarrassing and frustrating, but it can become a risk to health and safety and affect a person's identity and behaviour, and that is why the work which is done to help people with dementia and other memory-loss conditions is so important. To be able to recollect events, knowledge, stories, people and places from our previous experiences and to share those with others is indeed a blessing. And these memories, even the nightmarish ones we might ratherforget, all help to shape who we are.

For All Saints' Churchand for the village, Novemberis verymuch a month of remembering. On Wednesday 2 Novemberat 7pm we shall be holding a special All Souls Service of Reflection, Remembrance and Thanksgiving, in church. This is a beautiful, gentle, contemplative service of hymns, prayers and moments of silence, during which we remember family members and friends who have died in this past year and those who died longer ago but whom we still hold dearly in our hearts, giving thanks for the times and for the love we shared together and for the ways in which they influenced our lives. Therewill also be an opportunity, for those who wish, to light a candle in memory of a loved one.

Novemberis very much a month of remembering

On Sunday 13 November, we shall be commemorating and paying tribute to those who sacrificed their lives for our freedom in two World Warsand in many other conflicts. We shall begin by holding a short Remembrance Service with Communion at 8:30am in church before

we join with local councillors, uniformed groups, local schools and adults and children from across the area for a village Act of Remembrance at 10:45am by the memorial on the green. This year's event is given particular significance by the ongoing conflict in Ukraineand, as well as remembering, with heartfelt gratitude, those people who gave everything that they had in conflicts past to secure our future, we also pray for those who continue to be caught up in the horror of war, for those working to bring relief to the suffering and offering a welcome and support to refugees, and for those working for peace, reconciliation and justice for all of humanity.

Memorials, photographs and videos, and written texts such as letters, diaries and biographies can all help us to remember people from the past, especially people who remain important to us. For Christians, perhaps the most important biography is that of Jesus Christ, contained in the Bible in four different accounts, the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Lukeand John. These recollections of Jesus' life, ministry, teaching, persecution, suffering, death and resurrectionhave inspired countless people for almost 2000 years and have helped to persuade them to follow Jesus and, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to try to live their own lives based on his values of humility, compassion and selfless giving, secure in the knowledge that their future with Jesus in God's

Kingdom has been assured by the grace of Godthrough Jesus' death and resurrection.

Each time we celebrate a communion service in church, we remember with grateful thanks and humble hearts lesus' self-sacrifice for us and, on the last Sunday of the Church'syear, which this year will be Sunday 20 November, we celebrate the feast of Christthe King, on which we look back and remember and proclaim the risen and ascended lesus' universal sovereignty overall creatures. The following week, Sunday 27 November, we celebrate Advent Sunday, on which we begin to look forward again to the birth of Jesus and remember and proclaim the bright hope for all of humanity which this promises.

Finally, some words of scripture from Lamentations 3:21-23in which the writer remembers God's great faithfulness amidst the disappointments and hurts of their daily life.

This I call to mind, and thereforel have hope:

the steadfast love of the Lordnever ceases,

his mercies never come to an end; they are new everymorning.

Whatever memories November may hold for you, may you treasure those new mercies each morning.



All about Dahlias at Denmead Horticultural Society

In his Octobertalk, head gardener John Woodtold us that dahlias have been grown at Hinton Ampner since the 1930s when Ralph Dutton, the then owner, designed the garden. They can be seen today in many of the beds in the formal garden and in the Tudor

walled garden.

Thereare over 30 species of dahlia and John grows the dainty pink flowered D merckii and the tree dahlia, D imperialis which can reach I 5ft. Dahlias are octoploids meaning they have eight sets of chromosomes whereas most living species only have two. This explains how they can be bred to produce flowers in so many different forms, sizes and colours – there are over 57,000 registered cultivars.



At Hinton Ampner the dahlias are dug up after the first frost and stored upside down in a frost free shed. In January they are put the right way up into compost and in April they go into the polytunnel. By June they have produced shoots and are planted out. Newshoots can be used as cuttings and the tubers can be divided so long as each piece has an eye at the base of the stem. They are 'shortday length' plants which explains why they give us so



much colourand interestin late summer and autumn. John brought buckets full of cut flowers to pass round and there was much note taking – this was a fascinating talk and a very popular subject.

Our meeting on Ist November is the AGM followed by a cheese and wine party, visitors welcome.

Denmead Walks

WALK DETAILS

Distance: 10.3km (6.4 miles) Duration: 2h 30m Walk Grade: MODERATE(3/5) Number of Stiles: 6 The route of this walk is mainly along lanes with the exception of some horse paddocks to cross. It can therefore be undertaken at any time of year, but is ideal for a winter stroll. Highlights include views toward Hambledon when going down the lane near Bury Lodge, rolling countryside from the top of Cams Hill and some interesting buildings along Hoe Street.

Leave the Denmead Community Centrecar park by the main entrance, turn L then at the junction head up the hill on Hambledon Road. After passing Lincoln Green Nurserycontinue along the pavement soon passing the entrance to Uplands Road; carefully negotiate a section just after where there is no pavement.

0.83km/0.5mile Slightly further on cross the road into the lane on the RHS at Forest Gate and continue as far as the Rookwoodjunction. Go straight on in the direction of Hambledon and after just under a mile finally reach the pond at Rushmere.



2.35km/1.5miles Turn L at this junction and soon the lane goes downhill then around an S bend before passing BuryLodge on the LHS. At the bottom of the lane take care crossing the main road before turning R and heading for the Old Forge Tea Shop.

3.5km/2.2miles Bear L just in front of the latter along Cams Hill Lane. At the first junction go straight ahead up the steep hill. Wherethe lane levels out enjoy the view on

the LHS, but ignore the footpath signs on both sides of the lane while continuing to Hoe Cross.

4.9km/3.1miles Turn L here and head down Hoe Street as far as Rudley Mill. Do stop to admire the thatched house part way down the road.

7.2km/4.5miles On reaching the cross roads at Rudley Mill go Lalong

Bent Lane, but look out for a cat with a hearing problem!

After 1km/0.6mile go over the stile onto the FP on the RHS - ignore two other footpath signs before reaching the correctone. Be aware that there are often horses in the fields that have to be crossed, so if you are concerned about this it is advisable not to undertake this route but continue to the end of Bent Lane - this will add approximately 0.7km/ 0.4mile onto the total length of this walk. Thereare now six stiles in all to negotiate along with a short



wooden bridge. If continuing to the end of Bent Lane, go R at this junction onto Fareham Road and walk as far as Broad Lane – take great care on the often very busy Fareham Road.

8.7km/5.4miles Dolisten for traffic while climbing over the final stile. Turn R on stepping onto Fareham

Road then walk for about 80m before turning L into Broad Lane. Walk uphill passing several dwellings before coming to a crossroads.

Gostraight across the latter into School Lane and proceedup the hill at the top of which is the Fox and Hounds pub. To return to the community centrego downhill in the same direction.

This walk is one in a series of 37 routes compiled by Martin and Judith Lewis designed for anyone to undertake as selfguided strolls through areas accessible by foot from Denmead. For the full list either

The Balloon Man delivers flowers to the Evening W.I.


