ear Friends,

This is the first December letter I've written in recent years; both 2020 and 2021 were wiped out due to the Covid Pandemic in which we were forced to suspend this Parish Chronicle. As we return to a more 'normal' Christmas one notable difference will be that our Christmas broadcast will no longer be delivered by our late Queen Elizabeth II – something which I'm sure will bring a sombre pause to our hearts. Our late Queen embraced the Christmas message, delivering it faithfully year on year, and always speaking of the love, forgiveness found in Jesus Christ.

In 2014 the Queen shared this:

"For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Peace of Peace, whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, is an inspiration and a role-model in my life. A role-model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands, and his arms on the cross, in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek and respect and value all people of whatever faith or none."

The Letter

As I consider the story of Christmas, it refreshes my soul - it brings hope and excitement, despite the world's current trials and pains. It is a light in the darkness of our disenchanted. confused and fear-driven world. It is a candle of hope for the future. It is the greatest story ever told. It is the miracle of God's surprising love, of a young maiden's faith, of a child from the heavenly realms and of a 'moment-intime' that has transformed the future of humanity.

What is worrying you? What are you fearing? What are your hopes and dreams for 2023? May I suggest that you put before you the Christmas story and like the Virgin Mary, 'ponder these things'. Fill your thoughts with the wonder of God's great gift - Jesus Christ.

During Advent we will be preparing our hearts for Christmas - getting ready to welcome again the Christ child into our hearts. Inviting Him to dwell with us; to change us and transform us, so that we might work in partnership with Him, to be a part of the solution for our broken, dreary, bleak world.

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6)

This is the new reality, and it means everything for you and me. Let this

child fill your life with hope and transform the way you live in this world.

My prayers are with you, and your family, for a blessed and holy Christmas filled with the peace and light of Jesus Christ the King.

But as you arrive at Christmas, don't let the story stop there! For Christmas is more than just a child born. This year can I encourage you to take from the carousel in church a small booklet called Follow The Star - The Great Invitation.

This book offers 12 reflections on the theme of invitation, one for each day from Christmas to the Epiphany on the 6th January. Each reflection is by a different contributor and contains a picture, a short Bible passage, an invitation to action, and a simple prayer. Together they form a journey that will help you take encouragement and hope from the Christmas story into the year ahead.







Denmead Remembers



Over the last six years it has been a great joy and privilege to work in close partnership with Denmead Scouts and Denmead Parish Council to organise and plan an Act of Remembrance each Remembrance Sunday here in our village. Our local Act of Remembrance brings all our community groups together, with representatives from many local interest groups involved. This year more than 1100 locals gathered to pay their respects and honour all those who have given their lives in service, not only the thousands of men and women who gave their lives in the two World Wars, but also those who died in a host of campaigns since, so that we might live in peace and freedom today.

The Act of Remembrance begins

with children in the local uniformed groups, including Brownies, Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Explorers joining with children from Denmead Infant and Denmead Juniors schools, along with Local and District Councillors and members from All Saints church in a parade through the village. Led by our local Bagpiper. Cam. we process through the centre of our village to our village green where the main Act of Remembrance takes place by our war memorial. This year we were joined by our local Member of Parliament, Flick Drummond.

The Act of Remembrance includes all the traditional elements, the Last Post and Reveille played by local resident Mark Webb, the lowering of


the flag, the laying of wreaths, Laurence Binyon's poem 'For the Fallen' read by Navy Officer Richard Hurman, the Kohima Epitaph read by veteran Steve Lane, and the National Anthem, but also includes the children and youth as much as possible. Members of the Scouts read the names of those who gave their lives from Denmead, children lay wreaths and plant individual, home-made poppies on our war memorial. In our reflection, we used our poppies to guide our thoughts and prayers.



A local resident, Carole Goldsmith commented, "Again thank you for a very moving service. It was great to see so many Denmeadians gathered, also seeing all the children placing their hand made poppies on the memorial."

Commemorating Remembrance Sunday in this way has become very significant and poignant for all members of our community, young and old, as together we long for that day when there will be no more tears, pain or suffering, and God's kingdom, of peace, justice and love will be known in all the earth.

Denmead Walks

Winter Walk from Denmead Community Centre

This is an easy route that could be undertaken by anyone with a reasonable level of fitness. It is ideal for winter walking as it is entirely on metalled surfaces although there is a shorter 'around the block' option for families with young children; another shorter route is included which involves taking the Wayfarers Way footpath, however this is usually very muddy during the winter months.

Please note that permission should be sort from the manager to leave vehicles at the community centre.

Leaving by the main entrance of the community centre initially turn right out of the main entrance heading up School Lane eventually turning right into Thompsons Lane [0.5km/0.3mile.] At the end of this road is another right turn into Uplands Road [1km/0.6mile.]

On reaching the main Hambledon road go left - an alternative very short route for families is to the right down the hill. If undertaking the main route keep well into the side of the road for about 50m as there is no footpath. Please take great care during this potentially hazardous section. A little further along the road cross over into the lane at Forest Gate before heading toward Rookwood Farm. Again, extreme caution is needed when crossing the

main road at Forest Gate.

At Rookwood Cottage [2km/1.25miles] carry straight along the lane in the direction of Rushmere and Hambledon; the road firstly goes slightly downhill then begins a steady ascent. Part way along this stretch is another alternative path which is to the right along Wayfarers Way for those wishing to go along this muddy but shorter route. Walkers opting for this path should keep the hedge to their right until they come to a gap which takes them along a clearly marked path that ends near the bottom of the



hill below Rookwood.*

If undertaking the full walk conĆnue steadily uphill as far as the pond at Rushmere. [3km/1.9mile]. Here go right at the main juncĆon before again



branching right aĂer about 100m in the direcĆon of Pithill. ConĆnue downhill for some Ćme on this lane which then rises sharply before again descending

on the approach to Pithill.

At Pithill crossroad the route joins Harrowgate Lane.

[4.7km/2.9miles] Here turn right passing a farm and woodland on the leĂ. *Further on the Wayfarers Walk footpath emerges from the RHS before the lane reaches another juncĆon. [5.2km/3.25miles]



Bear right at this juncCon heading up hill in the direcCon of Forest Gate and at the top of the hill turn leĂ retracing the earlier route back to the main Hambledon road. [5.7km/



is to remain on the Hambledon Road.

3.6miles] Again take care when crossing and walking along the short secCon where there is no pavement.

Support Package for Pupils

HCC has set out a financial support package to help schools cover school meal costs and contribute towards school uniform for vulnerable families this winter. This comes as the County Council calls for adequate Government funding for school meals as the costs of ingredients, energy and staff wages increase. To avoid significant losses, the County Council school meal provider, HC3S, increased school meal prices by 20p per day from 31st Oct.

The increase will have an impact on parents who pay for school meals, as well as individual schools. While schools are funded by the Government to provide Universal Infant Free school meals for Key Stage 1 pupils (those in Reception and Years 1 and 2), this funding is no longer fit to cover the full associated costs. Schools also cover the costs of free meals for eligible older pupils from their wider funding and so the increase will place additional pressure in all areas. Consequently, HCC is now set to step in with a package of support to help schools bridge this funding gap over the winter, while continuing to encourage paying parents of older children to check their eligibility for free school meals. The

funding being made available will also be targeted to help parents struggling with school uniform costs. Families can check if they are entitled to free school meals on the HC3S website -




pay in an additional £2 towards payment for your qualifying childcare. If you have already registered, sign into your childcare account regularly to ensure you keep your details up to date.

Winchester City Council - Your Place Your Plan

WCC is undergoing a change, with next month seeing the start of two new Directors together with several Assistant Directors. Responsibilities will be redirected in line with their new commitments, this in turn will mean that the holders of the various portfolios will also be re-aligned. Watch this space!

Your Place Your Plan 2019-2039

The Cabinet in October decided not to amend several of the recommendations brought forward by the Scrutiny Committee so the draft plan has been undergoing public consultation for six weeks before the start of the next phase. It will be this document that will be judged as to whether it is a sound document in planning terms.

40% of Winchester District is situated in the South Downs National Park which is responsible for its own development, however the National Park works under a different set of rules to the metropolitan authority. Development is a low priority for it so the number of required buildings is generally built in the rest of the district.

The Denmead Parish Council has undertaken a Local Neighbour Plan so it is the responsibility of the PC to explore the way in which the village will develop. Any comments on the proposed New Local Plan should be submitted to WCC asap in order to be considered prior to publication of the final deposit plan where it will be examined by Planning Inspectors to ensure that it meets the strong conditions as the next Local Plan moving forward, before receiving the endorsement of the Secretary of State and become a Legal Planning Document.

On the first Saturday of each month we hold a local surgery in the Heath Room in All Saints Church Hall to listen to any concerns you may have regarding the services of the City Council between 10am to 12 noon. No


