Practicing the Way...

Dear Friends,

Over the last year I've been working my way through the Shardlake series of historical mystery novels by C. J. Sansom, set in 16th century Tudor England. The series features barrister Matthew Shardlake, who, while navigating the religious reforms of Henry VIII, solves crime and tries to avoid getting caught up in political intrigue!

If you like this sort of genre, each book is a great read. What struck me is everyday life in Tudor England, for many was limited, certainly in comparison to what we regard as normal now. While some people travelled over continents on pilgrimage or crusade, many people never ventured more than a few miles from where they were born. There was little leisure, so there were few leisure activities - no shopping malls or cinemas or restaurants or sports stadiums. Life was about work and home life, set against a background of poverty, plagues and a shorter life span. To stop their days merging into one grey mass of toil, however, society had a lively rhythm of seasons and festivals. Our word "holiday" comes from the Holy Days that peppered their year. Days such as Shrove Tuesday, Mothering Sunday, Passiontide etc.

However, fast forward to 21st century Britain and it feels like we've travelled to the opposite end of the spectrum. Overall, life today is very busy, we can travel easily, at home or abroad, we have endless choices and decisions in so many areas including food, leisure, clothing and home decor. Life has become broader and wider. Our working lives and roles are harder, longer and more stressful. And truth be known we've become so swamped with pressures and demands we've lost our patterns, rhythms and structures. For many of us, we've lost our Holy Days or special moments!

Last month I encouraged us all to spend some time resting and reflecting, at the start of this new year. As I've stopped and reflected, I've recognised a need to re-establish some patterns,

...a need to re-establish some patterns, rhythms and structures rhythms and structures in my own life that would allow me to focus again on lesus and my relationship with God.

I have discovered a wonderful book called 'Practicing the Way' written by John Mark Comer. This book encourages us to spend time with Jesus, that we might become more like Him, and then do as he did. It is a compelling read - deeply challenging and highly inspiring.

With great insight, John Mark Comer returns us to an ancient custom, that of the Rule of Life. The Rule of Life was first established by the early desert fathers. A Rule of Life creates a framework that shapes our daily, weekly and monthly structures, weaving in patterns of prayer, worship, love and service that deepen and grow our faith in God. A Rule of Life allows for a variety and texture to our hours and days, centring us on Jesus. I highly commend this book as a great resource in discovering the beautiful picture of the kind of life Jesus envisioned for his followers and a practical pathway to experience it for yourself. This book allows us to discover holy moments and holy days once more, that we might practice lesus' way.

Denmead Walks

This is a short walk from Denmead Community Centre offering two routes after the initial stage so that anyone not comfortable with crossing several stiles or walking through horse paddocks have an alternative. A warning that sections of both routes can be extremely soft going after heavy rain.

WALK DETAILS:

Distance 5.75km/3.6miles Duration 1h 25m Walk Grade EASY 2/5 Number of Stiles: Route 1 – 8 stiles, Route 2 – 2 stiles

Leaving the Community Centre car park by the main entrance go R heading along School Lane passing the Fox & Hounds pub before going downhill as far as the crossroads.

Route I: Continue in direction of Ervills into Broad Lane that soon drops downhill to the junction with Fareham Road in front of the driveway to Great Ervills House -

1.45km/0.9mile Cross over immediately and turn R but **take particular care walking along the LHS of the road** for about 100m as far as a gap in the hedge. Turn L, negotiate the first of the stiles on this walk, then continue across a narrow wooden bridge toward a second stile. After this stile head for the RH top corner of the enclosed field, then look for position of the remaining two stiles that allow access across paddocks that usually contain horses.

2km/1.25miles After the last stile turn L on reaching Bent Lane before continuing along the

metalled surface as far as the entrance to woodland on the RHS – a footpath from the left also emerges here.

Route 2: Turn L at the crossroads heading down Dirty Lane in the direction of Worlds End. **1.52km/0.95mile** Turn L at the bottom of the hill, pass the gates to the fisheries then pick up the FP on the other side of the road. **Listen for traffic and take care crossing at this point.** Go through two gates and continue along the footpath keeping the woodland on your LHS.

1.9km/1.2miles Bear L into woodland and follow FP to junction of paths where the yellow direction marker points straight ahead. At this point go R and walk the short distance to Bent Lane.

2.3km/1.43miles Both routes join at this point. Go across the lane into the wood opposite and continue through the woodland as far as Hoe Street.


2.7km/1.68miles Here turn L and walk back to the staggered junction with Rudley Mill on your LHS. 3.1Km/
1.93miles Bear L on leaving Hoe Street and head back along Bent Lane.

3.5km/2.18miles In about 400m go over a stile on the RHS and cross the field to the far side then cross another stile. After the latter take the FP obliquely L (not sharp L) and on reaching the crossways of foot paths continue straight on. (An alternative route avoiding two stiles and possible horses grazing

in the field is to continue along the metalled surface of Bent Lane before turning R into the woods, then L at the junction of footpaths therein.)

On eventually leaving the woods bear R keep the latter on your RHS and finally come to a couple of gates about 30m apart; after going through the second cross the Fareham Road. **Take great care crossing this busy road**, go L on the far side passing Willow Fisheries just after which bear R up Dirty Lane. Turn R at the junction at the top of the hill into School Lane.

4.94km/3.1 miles A welcome drink can be taken at the Fox & Hounds while the walk ends back at the Denmead Community Centre.



FWB would like to thank all of the trustees. volunteers and supporters who have worked so hard to make these events possible, fun and successful, as well as running the weekly drop-in.

Numbers of clients visiting our drop-in are increasing, with over 70 people attending each week. Our four regular caseworkers have been assisting around 30 people between them each week and we are in the process of training new caseworkers to join the team as casework becomes more complex and demanding. Numbers of clients attending English lessons is also increasing and it is

great that we have welcomed some new English teachers to the team. Recently we set up a coordinating team to help with form-filling, befriending, reception and welcoming. Our kitchen team have introduced hot food dishes, which have been absolutely delicious and very popular.

Access to Justice had 43 new clients this year, which is a huge increase. The team are now also assisting clients with applications for eVisas with the Home Office digital changeover on 31st December this year.

We are looking forward to setting up a new Family Support Project early next year, in partnership with Homestart and with the support of a grant from the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Community Fund. This will provide a safe, supervised, child-friendly area within our drop-in, providing additional support for lone parents to temporarily leave children in order to access casework and English classes. We also look forward to working with the Lloyds Bank Foundation who have awarded FWB organisational development support with

a Lloyds Bank Regional Manager.

The Government is enabling Local Government to make more decisions on how to spend money on areas like transport if they work together in a programme called Devolution. Funding and decision-making powers could include areas like infrastructure, planning, housebuilding, skills, and employment initiatives, all covering a much larger geographical area making economies in expenditure and resources through economies of scale.

There would be a 'delayering' of authorities so Hampshire County Council and Winchester City Council would be dissolved and an entire layer of government (at District level) removed. So, from our current structure of 14 authorities, we would reduce to probably 4.

If all of the local authorities agree and the government accepts Hampshire and the Isle of Wight into the priority programme, a Public Consultation would take place in the spring for people to have their say. Then if devolution is agreed by all involved, the election of a mayor would take place in May 2026.

Quite what will happen at the local level is unknown! Many of the areas involved do not have Parishes and many Parishes are too small to take on additional responsibilities.

There are many questions and not too many answers at this point, but I will keep you updated!

Devolution

The Government published its English Devolution White Paper on 16th December 2024 setting out a programme of devolution and Local Government reorganisation across England.

The vision outlined by Government is that all parts of England are to be part of regional Strategic Authorities that have a regional Mayor. These Strategic Authorities, working in a similar way to existing Mayoral Combined Authorities, will have responsibility for driving growth and shaping public services across wider regional geographies covering strategic leadership of key place shaping responsibilities such as economic regeneration and growth, strategic planning, skills and employment and strategic transport. Hampshire County Council could be one of the local authorities to be included in the Government's Devolution Priority Programme (DPP).

At the end of August, an agreement was made between the Isle of Wight Council, Portsmouth City Council and Southampton City Council, to submit to Government a joint Expression of Interest (EOI) in forming a single combined authority for the collective area of the four upper tier authorities. Inclusion on the fast-track Priority Programme would be the first step towards creating a Strategic Authority. The Government is also expecting all areas across the country to produce local government re-organisation plans by Autumn 2025, creating new large unitary authorities which, for Hampshire, will mean bringing together the County Council, I I borough and district councils and small neighbouring unitary authorities into a number of new large unitary authorities.

Given that HCC has more than 1.4 million residents and the White Paper requires all unitaries to have not less than 500,000, it might mean some districts/boroughs transition from Hampshire into perhaps Portsmouth or Southampton [each currently have approximately 300,000 residents], although reassurance has been given by Government that every effort will be made not to split a district or borough.

Devolution with elected Mayors is not an option, it is a route required by central Government for all local authorities. For more information read the Government White Paper - <u>https://www.gov.uk/</u> government/publications/
