This is a time to press the reset button...



DVA Makes Discoveries about Henry's Warship

The Village Association held its AGM in November, at which the Officers and committee were all re-elected, before Chair, Neil Rusbridger, announced the winners of the photograph competition for the village diary. He then introduced Carole Frampton, a Denmead resident who is also a guide on the Mary Rose. Carole's interest started ten years ago when she visited the Mary Rose, and she was so fascinated by the history of Henry VIII and details of the Mary Rose's history that she decided to volunteer.

Carole captivated the meeting talking about King Henry's youth and his love for his favourite ship, which sailed for 34 years. Many of the personal items found on board give a new insight into Tudor life and the craftsmanship of the time.

It was in 1545 that the Mary Rose sank but it wasn't found until 1846 when fishermen found something underwater was snagging their nets.

However, it wasn't until the early 60s that she was located, partly because in the meantime she had become buried in silt. By 1971 all that could be seen were three timbers which lead to many dives and the discovery of thousands of artefacts but it took another 11 years to bring her up when she was taken into dry dock and spraying began. For 11 years she was sprayed with water and for 9 years with polyethylene. In 2013 a museum was built around the ship at a cost of £35m.

The infinite number of facts and stories Carole told whetted the appetite of all our members to visit the Mary Rose and, in fact, the DVA is planning to arrange a visit next year.

The next meeting will be at 7.30pm in All Saints Church hall on Friday 17th January. Annual subscription is $\pounds 10$ with visitors paying $\pounds 2$ for their first visit. The group enjoys speakers on a variety of subjects, many of local interest.

Denmead Walks

This is an interesting walk initially heading toward Hambledon on a familiar footpath off Uplands Road. Further on a potentially flooded area adjacent to the Hambledon Road could be encountered in winter. After passing the delightful garden of Hole Farm there are several footpaths which eventually lead back to Hoe Street. A section of permissive footpath through woodland leads to Bent Lane followed by more woodland walking en route back to Denmead.

WALK DETAILS:

Distance 9km/5.6 miles Duration 2h 30m Walk Grade 3/5 Stiles 6

Leaving the community centre CP by the main entrance go R heading along School Lane. Turn R up Thompsons Lane and on reaching the junction with Uplands Road take the footpath slightly to the L on the other side of the road. On emerging from the narrow section of the path go slightly R heading downhill then walk alongside the hedge as far as the end of the field. Go through the gap in the hedge and continue across the field on the welltrodden path.

I.8km/I.1miles Go downhill through a narrow copse and just before the gate, adjacent to the main road, go L on the wide path between the paddocks. Go through 2 gates and cross a ditch via a wooden plank that lies between them. After the last gate take care crossing the lane before climbing the bank opposite and pass through another gate.

If a sprung electric fence is across the path simply unhook then replace after passing



through. There are 2 more gates while waking uphill, and after the last, bear R on the footpath through Madam's Copse

2.5km/1.6miles Turn L on reaching Menslands Lane and continue for 450m before going R over a stile into woodland. After about 60m go over another stile (or around the gate, if there is room) and stay on the FP keeping the woodland on your L. Eventually come to a gate then head diagonally across the small field where another gate is found in the corner. Pass through a narrow copse before turning R through a further gate. Continue downhill on the RHS of a field adjacent to Hole Farm

3.8km/2.45miles On reaching Hole Lane pass through two gates, one on each side of the lane, remain in the same direction going uphill staying parallel to the drive leading to the farm. Go over the stile at the far end of the field onto Hoe Street. Cross the latter taking the lane opposite and walk around 700m passing the entrance to a green lane followed by Russell's Farm, both of which are on the RHS. About 50m beyond the farm bear L on the signed FP across a field heading toward woodland.

5km/3.15miles The path eventually goes through a narrow copse where it is necessary to go over a stile. Head toward the RHS of the field (direction 2 o'clock) to a stile situated part way along a wire fence. After going over this latest stile continue in the direction indicated on the marker post, which I must admit seems to be heading nowhere. Nevertheless, by making your way in the direction indicated

and walking some distance a gate finally appears on the L. Go over a stile then head along a narrow, covered FP passing a house on the RHS.

6.1 km/3.8 miles The path soon emerges onto Hoe Street and here go R whereupon continue along the metalled surface lane past Kellanne Stud Farm on the L and Hoegate Farm. A little further along Hoe Street look out for an 'unofficial' path on the LHS and follow this route through woodland for 400m eventually emerging onto Bent Lane.



7km/4.4miles Go straight across the lane into the woodland opposite and walk about 200m as far as a yellow marker post - at this point turn L. At the end of this path go over a ditch on a short plank. Follow the FP by bearing R walking in a direction parallel to the woodland on your RHS. At the end of this stretch pass through the last 2 gates of the walk and turn L on reaching the road between Hambledon and Worlds End. Again, take great care at this point as it can be a busy road, and the crossing point is close to a blind bend. Pass the gates of Willow Fisheries on the R before turning R into Dirty Lane.

7.8km/4.9miles Continue uphill and at the junction of Uplands Road, Broad Lane and Dirty Lane go R into School Lane again ascending while at the top of the rise is the Fox & Hounds pub. The final section of this route is mainly downhill and after passing the junction with Inhams Lane the community centre CP is on the LHS.

HCC Update on School Relocation, Instrument Loans and more

Proposed Relocation of Henry Cort Community College

Hampshire County Council is opening a public consultation on Friday 10th January seeking views on the proposed relocation of The Henry Cort Community College in Fareham, to a new site in North Whiteley from September 2027. The consultation will be published on HCC's website_and will run until Friday 14 February 2025, with no final decision to be taken until June 2025, following local elections.

The proposal to relocate the school comes as forecasts show that the ongoing development of the Whiteley area will result in demand for between 900 and 1,200 secondary school places. A new secondary school in North Whiteley is planned to meet the predicted need for school places across the whole of the Whiteley area, once the new development is complete.



While clearly needed to meet future demand, the planned new school in North Whiteley would also have a significant impact on The Henry Cort Community College in Fareham, which currently takes pupils from across the Whiteley area. As more families in Whiteley are anticipated to move their children to the new school in North Whiteley from September 2027, it's expected that Henry Cort would see a corresponding reduction in pupil numbers, and consequently in its funding from Government, which is allocated on a per-pupil basis.

The proposal to relocate Henry Cort to the new site is considered the most viable option to protect its future while ensuring sufficient school places and good quality education and stability for children across Whiteley and Fareham. If finally agreed, this would not mean that Henry Cort would close but that the school, including its staff and children, would move to the new site.

Free Loans



Young musicians across Hampshire are set to benefit from the loan of 1,000 used string instruments in a range of sizes by Hampshire Music Service (HMS), the Council's music education provider and lead organisation for the Hampshire Music Education Hub, including violins, violas, cellos and double basses.

HMS has opened applications for free long-term loans of the instruments, following the award of a £600,000 Arts Council capital grant. This will enable HMS to purchase new instruments and resources including specialist adaptable instruments for special needs provision for use in schools throughout Hampshire.

Education Catering Service

HCC is to recommend sourcing school meals from other providers, rather than directly providing meals as it currently does via its in-house Education Catering Service. This arrangement would see the local authority purchase and manage the supply of meals from providers on behalf of schools and nurseries who subscribe and would potentially support schools and families to pay a lower price for school meals. If approved, it's expected that the move to the new arrangement will take place by the end of March 2026.
