

The days are getting longer and lighter as each week passes bringing hope of warm summer days. Easter is late in the year, and at the beginning of this month following Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday we enter a time within the church year know as Lent.

A very brief history about the origins of Lent! ...

The First Council of Nicaea in 325 AD settled on the 40day fast period for Lent for the reason that it has roots in biblical writings. God sent rain on the earth for 40 days and 40 nights when Noah and his family went into the ark (Genesis 7:4). Moses sat at the summit of Mount Sinai



receiving instructions from God for 40 days (Exodus 24:18). Elijah "walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb" when he fled from Jezebel's wrath (1 Kings 19:8). The 40 days of Lent, however, are predominantly identified with the time Jesus spent in the desert fasting, praying, and being tempted by the devil (Matthew 4:1–11). But though the length of Lent was set by the council, it's start date in relation to Easter was still undecided.

In was not until AD 601 that the date when Lent would start was set. Pope Gregory moved the start of Lent to 46 days before Easter, and established Ash Wednesday at the same time. This allowed for 40 days of fasting – where only one full meal and no meat were to be consumed – with six Sundays counted as feast days, when fasting does not apply, for a total of 46 days. Travelling through Lent bridges the space between looking back from celebrating the birth of Jesus,

...six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to the present remembering Jesus's death on the cross and resurrection and to the future as we wait in anticipation of the return of Jesus.

Many people I talk with don't look forward to Lent, or they see it as a challenge to be completed. Childhood memories of giving up chocolate or nice things to eat come immediately to their minds. Words like "sacrifice," "discipline," and "self-denial" are often used in ways that suggest that Lent is something to be endured rather than a time of grace and spiritual growth.

However, have you ever thought about seeing the

period of Lent through a different lens? What about thinking of Lent as a yearly "second" chance? Each year during Lent we are given six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to see if our values and priorities are in line with God's desires for us. Since most of us find that we've wandered from God's path, Lent becomes that "second" chance, or an opportunity, to "return to God with our whole heart." Lent could be a meaningful time of prayer and reflection, where we give God the best of our time - not the left-over bits of our time.

Here are just a few ideas of ways we can reconnect with God during Lent.

...give God the best of our time - not the left-over bits

Take time every day in Lent to draw a prayer in a sketchbook."God Time." Taking time each day to reflect on God and your relationship with God.

There are always nice things that we would like to do, but never seem to make or find the time for: writing a letter to a friend, visiting a lonely person, phoning a distant friend. At the beginning of Lent, write down 40 ideas, one per little slip of paper, and put them in a jar. Then, each morning of Lent, pull one out and make the time to do what is written there. Giving thanks to God for opportunities to make a difference to somebody's day.

Think of people who have had an impact on your life in some way. Take the time to arrange to meet for a coffee, make a phone call, write a letter to tell them the difference they have made and how much you value their support.

Instead of listening to music or the radio in the car, take that time for prayer and to listen to God. (don't close your eyes when praying though!)

Read a book to help you reflect this Lent, this year All Saints is reading "The Whole Easter Story" by Jo Swinney. Looking at why the cross is good news for all creation. More details can be found on page 8.

Take time to talk with family and friends during Lent about their thoughts and hopes for a reset in Lent. Encourage one another in whatever you choose to do.

As we journey through Lent this year, through this annual "second" chance, remember that each step we take, the time we spend is bringing us closer to the welcoming arms of our loving and eternal God.

ALL SAINTS ENCOMPASS

In January we had our first meeting of Encompass. This group has evolved from the Bereavement Support Group which had been running in All Saint's Church Hall for many years. We wanted to expand the brief of the Bereavement Support Group to continue to be available for those who have been bereaved, but also to encompass general health and wellbeing for the older age group, whether they had experienced the loss of a loved one, or simply felt they would like to learn more about how to care for themselves.

In addition to looking at our own needs we wanted to learn more about the work of local or national charities and organisations in our area so that we could support them in any way we can. In our January meeting we enjoyed a fascinating talk from the RNLI where we learnt a great deal about the inspiring volunteers who do so much to keep us safe around our coasts and rivers, often in the face of great danger.

On February 26th we have one of our own helpers talking about Lasting Power of Attorney and Mental Capacity, from her experience in working in a Senior Role with the NHS. So, we will have a chance to think about when and what help we might need as we get older, in dealing with our finances. How to do that safely and in an appropriate way.



On May 28th we have Jess Sullings coming to talk to us about Podiatry and foot care. On July 23rd we have Mr Rob Heard MBE, Founder and Chair of the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Older Driver's Forum, coming to talk to us about the problems faced by older drivers and keeping ourselves and others safe on the road. There are various other speakers who have yet to confirm, but a full programme should be available in a few weeks.

We meet on the fourth Wednesday of every month in All Saints' Church Hall at 2.00pm, usually until 3.30/4.00pm. At every meeting we have a delicious home cooked tea after the main speaker, and often a fun and sometimes related quiz, which we work on in groups. No expensive prizes, just the opportunity to keep our brains active and the glory of getting the highest score!

You are very welcome to come along to this new group to find new friends and learn more about caring for your own health and wellbeing.

Lent 2025

Lent begins this year on Wednesday 5th March. The day before we will mark Shrove Tuesday with a BIG Pancake Party in church for young and old – more details feature on page 14.


Then at 7pm on Ash Wednesday we will hold a Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes service, to which all are very welcome. If you have previous Palm crosses at home, you are welcome to return these to church and leave in the Vicars' pigeonhole, or hand in at the office by Friday 28th Feb. These will be burnt to create the ashes ready for this year's Imposition.

During Lent itself, the staff team are recommending this year's Bible Reading Fellowship book, 'The Whole Easter Story – why the cross is good news for all creation' written by Jo Swinney. Jo Swinney works for A Rocha International. A Rocha – which means 'The Rock' (Jesus) – is a Christian nature conversation charity working all around the world to care for God's creation. A Rocha also runs Eco Church – an award programme encouraging green/eco living in churches and communities. As a church, we have a bronze award and are working on our silver status.

Jo's book explores the profound meaning of Easter beyond our own personal relationship with God. Jo acknowledges that the Christian faith is not just about our own growth, purpose and spirituality. There is no doubt that each of us has a place in the Easter story, but what happened on the cross is not just a story of me and Jesus – rather it is far deeper and wider than that.

Through Lent, Jo explores the broader impact of the Easter story on God's relationship with

creation. Through Bible readings, reflections and stories from A Rocha's global conservation efforts, discover that the cross transforms not just own connection with Jesus, but also our relationships with each other, with creation and our world. The death and resurrection of Jesus changes everything!



There are four main sections to the book – each with ten days – so forty days in total, read Monday to Saturday with a rest on Sundays. This book can be read individually or in a Home/Study Group (at the back of the book there is a six-week group discussion guide). We will also be exploring this book in our Sunday teaching each week, at both our 8am and 10am services, picking up on key themes.

So, we commend this book to you this Lent. You can purchase your own copy from our welcome area in church. They are $\pounds 8$ each – monies can be place in an envelope and left in our church wall safe, behind the font. Or you can order with Eden: www.eden.co.uk at $\pounds 8.79$ plus P&P.



Time to Renew the All Saints Electoral Roll



Once every six years the Parochial Church Council must renew our Electoral Roll for All Saints, Denmead. Anyone who is lay, aged 16 and above, is baptised, and either lives in the

parish, or has worshipped at All Saints for at least 6 months, can apply to be on our Electoral Roll.

Anyone wishing to be on the new Electoral Roll must complete a new application form (Form 1) - even if they were on the previous roll.

Copies of Form I can be picked up from our welcome area in church, filled in and retuned to the church parish office. Forms must be returned by Friday 25th April 2025 ready for revision before our Annual Meeting (AGM/APCM)

Denmead Walks

This is an easy grade walk from Denmead Community Centre to the west of the village through fields, woodland and along a section of the Alan King Way before the return leg through World's End via Ervills Road.

WALK DETAILS: Distance 5.4km/3.4miles

Duration 1h 25m Walk Grade EASY 2/5 Stiles 3



Leaving the community centre car park (CP) by the main entrance go R heading along School Lane passing the Fox & Hounds pub before going downhill as far as the crossroads. Turn L at the crossroads heading down Dirty Lane in the direction of Worlds End as far as Ervills Road.

I.52km/0.95mile Turn L at the bottom of the hill, pass the gates to the fisheries then pick up the FP on the other side of the road. Listen for traffic and take care crossing at this point. Go over two stiles and continue along the footpath keeping the woodland on your LHS.

Newly installed stile on FP

1.9km/1.2miles Bear L into woodland and follow footpath (FP) to junction of paths where the yellow direction marker points straight ahead. At this point

go L at the same time joining the Alan King FP. After a short distance cross a shallow

ditch and turn R on reaching a narrow path with fencing each side.

Continue along this FP which runs in a straight line eventually ending with a stile on the RHS.

2.75km/I.7miles With the stile on your RHS bear L

soon coming to the final stile of the route. Pass a barn and modern farm on the RHS and the Meadow Farm House on the other side of the lane.

3.1km/1.9miles Turn L at the main road taking care while walking along Ervills Road. At the end of this stretch carefully negotiate a double bend in the road, pass the gates of Willow Fisheries on the RHS.

3.9km.2.45miles Just after passing the gates of the fisheries retrace your steps to the R up Dirty Lane at the top of which go R again along School Lane in the direction of Denmead/Waterlooville.

5.4km/3.4miles Perhaps a stop for refreshment could be taken at the Fox & Hounds en route back to the community centre.



DVA learns of Antarctic Expedition

The January meeting of the Village Association was chaired by Tony Jarrett, who conveyed best wishes to Chairman Neil Rusbridger concerning his health issues. Tony then outlined the proposed changes to the Constitution, with all the present members voting in favour. He reminded members that the Secretary wished to stand down and Martin Clay was elected.

Then the speaker, Terri Bryant described boarding MS Roald Amundsen, an environmentally friendly vessel which includes a science centre and expedition team, experts in their respective fields. Terri joined the ship in Valparaiso which has a Mediterranean climate; moving southwards there is a temperate and glacial climate.

The Antarctic peninsula is very cold!! In summer the temperature is an average 2° and in the winter -9°. In Antarctica the temperature varies between -60° and -20°. Clothing is worn in layers – about six in all. The tenders for going ashore are inflatables, known as zodiacs. The ship uses GPS positioning, instead of an anchor, to keep it in place so the seabed is not damaged.

The Antarctic Treaty was signed in 1959, originally by 12 countries although there are now 58 involved. This protects the indigenous flora and fauna – there are only two species of plant and no land-birds or land-based animals. There are sea birds such as penguins and sea animals like seals. The Treaty protects the Antarctic environment from damage through industry such as mining.

The current which flows around Antarctica is known as a Circumpolar Current, and feeds into other ocean currents. The scientists on board conduct various experiments and record relevant information. The British Antarctic Survey has three research stations in Antarctica and, along with many others such as the Australian Research Council and the Chilean and Argentinian Research stations, they are securing the environmental future of Antarctica. Terri concluded by reminding the meeting that everyone can do something to help the environment by making small changes. Why not join the DVA? They meet on alternate months in All Saints Church Hall to learn of developments in the village and enjoy hearing speakers on a variety of subjects, many of local interest. The next meeting will be on Friday 21st March. The annual subscription is £10 but a first visit costs just £2.



HCC Devolution Update

Hampshire County Council has been accepted onto the Government's fast-track Devolution Priority Programme (DPP) – marking a significant milestone in the journey towards devolution for Hampshire and the wider area.

Earlier this month HCC, together with Southampton and Portsmouth City and Isle of Wight Councils put in a 'Hampshire and the Solent' devolution bid to central Government which seeks to bring power and money from Westminster and provide greater local control over areas such as education, transport and health services – giving people more power to shape the things that are important to them and provide robust local accountability.

As part of devolution, a Mayor would be elected in spring 2026 to head up a new Combined Authority across the wider region of HCC, Isle of Wight Council, Portsmouth City Council and Southampton City Council, in line with the Authorities' expression of interest submitted to the Deputy Prime Minister last summer. As well as promoting the interests of the wider region to central Government, the Mayor would work together with local council leaders, to make decisions about how to allocate regional funding. Greater collaboration across boundaries would be particularly effective in areas such as transport, skills and employment support, housing and planning, and tackling climate change.

Devolution represents the biggest change to local government in a generation and to be accepted onto the Government's DPP as a fast-track to delivering devolution for the area is an opportunity to self-determine and shape devolution proposals in the best interests of residents and communities.

Hampshire is one of a select few nationally to join this fast-track programme. This selection also includes upper-tier partners, Isle of Wight Council, and Southampton and Portsmouth City Councils and with a combined population of over 2 million residents, 90,000 businesses, and an economy generating around £80 billion annually, Hampshire and the Solent region are pivotal to the UK's economic landscape.

Benefits

Devolution will transfer greater powers and flexibilities from Westminster to Hampshire and the Solent region, accompanied by additional funding and investment. This shift will enable local authorities to make crucial decisions closer to where residents live and work, driving economic growth, innovation and productivity. The Government plans to consult with Hampshire residents soon to gather feedback on the prospect.

Local Government Reorganisation

Additionally, the Secretary of State has confirmed that Hampshire will be formally invited to submit proposals for local government reorganisation. The reorganisation aims to replace the current two-tier council system with new unitary (all-purpose) councils, simplifying how councils are organised and run.

Postponement of May's Election

Due to selection for the DPP, the Government has also determined that the Council's elections, originally scheduled for May, should be postponed for 12 months as an essential step to enable the Council to give necessary focus to preparing for devolution and local government reorganisation, and allow for a Mayor to be elected in 2026 so the benefits of devolution can be delivered as swiftly as possible. Any by-elections, if required during this period, would continue to go ahead. Reorganisation would then be expected to be in place by either April 2027 or April 2028.
