s I sit writing this, outside is drizzly and grey and I am wearing a jumper, not quite the June summer weather of my childhood memories, but then that's probably just down to a selective memory! Here's hoping that the rest of June was warm and balmy and we could take advantage of those long light evenings.

Usually when we write to you from All Saints, the church is preparing for a seasonal festival such as Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and Pentecost and we invite you to come and share and celebrate them with us.

But now in the church year we have not long entered a period which is known as "Ordinary Time". Ordinary Time is the longest season in the Church's year. Covering thirty-three weeks, it is divided into two parts; one short and the other very long and focuses in a three-year cycle on the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. This year we are looking in more detail on the Gospel of Luke.



The first part runs from the day after we celebrate Jesus' Baptism to the day before Ash Wednesday. The second part, the time we are celebrating now, runs from the day after Pentecost until the day before the first Sunday of Advent. This is where the church year ends with the solemnity of Christ the King. He is enthroned in our hearts as well as in heaven, in order to do his Father's will and restore all things.

The use of the term Ordinary Time in the church year distinguishes it from the other seasons – Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter – which focus on particular aspects of Christ's life: his birth, suffering, death and resurrection.

Ordinary Time in the Church year doesn't mean the ho-hum weeks in between the exciting events of our faith. Instead, it's the time when we celebrate the ordered passage of time. It's when we can deepen our faith in the midst of everyday life.

At moments when we experience chaos and confusion, life at its essence is somehow still rooted in meaning and order and wisdom, even if we don't completely get it. Put another way, it's when we remember that the Incarnation wasn't just something that happened between God the Father and Jesus of Nazareth more than 2,000 years ago; it's the continual

invitation to share in God's love and creativity day after day, week after week, season after season.

During Ordinary Time, we focus on the heart and soul of Jesus' message. We hear him describe the Kingdom of God in concrete terms that people of his time would understand — a mustard seed, some yeast — which invites us to examine our own images of God. We see him heal countless people from all walks of life, which calls us to examine those relationships in our own lives that need healing. We watch him perform incredible miracles, which encourages us to find the parts of ourselves in need of transformation. In this way, Jesus' day-to-day life during his ministry affects our own everyday experiences.

Ordinary Time celebrates Jesus' teaching and ministry. It gives us time to reflect on how we live as Christians.

You might notice during ordinary time that the Altar cloth in our chapel is changed for green. The colour green of Ordinary Time tells us much about its significance in the Church's life. It is the rich colour of growth and new life.

Also, this summer we are exploring in our Sunday services a sermon series on the book of Romans. Romans is a letter from the Apostle Paul to the Christian church in Rome, exploring themes of salvation, faith, and the nature of God's righteousness. It delves into how humanity's sinfulness leads to a need for God's grace, and how salvation is achieved through faith in Jesus Christ. Paul also

discusses the implications of this salvation for Christian living and the relationship between God and both lewish and Gentile believers.

The book emphasizes that salvation is a gift from God, received through faith in Jesus Christ, not through human merit or good works. Paul explores the concept of God's righteousness, explaining that it is revealed through the gospel and is available to all who believe. Romans explains how believers are justified (declared righteous) by God through faith in Christ, even though they are sinners. The book offers practical advice on how Christians should live, emphasizing love, unity, and obedience to God in all areas of life. Sermons will be added to our website each week, and we are following the material from the Bible Society and the thoughts of Andrew Ollerton.

If you would love to find out more about the

extraordinary time of ordinary time, do call in to see us, can I encourage you to take one of our welcome bags which among other fabulous things has a book of one of the Gospels in it for you to read and explore. Ordinary Time deserves to be lived extraordinarily—in the depths of our own hearts, in our families and in the worshipping community. It is important for us to immerse ourselves deeply in the spirituality of Ordinary Time because it contains the essence of who we are in the 'everydayness' of our Christian lives.

In 1955 the Revd. George Greenfield, who was Vicar at that time, started publishing the Denmead Parish Chronicle as "an important means of communication which keeps people informed of matters about the Church and other activities of interest to the village".

Having been editor of the Chronicle since 1998 I have made it known amongst those that regularly attend All Saints Church that I will be standing down from this role at the end of this year – it is high time it was handed on to someone else! Incidentally, I would like to say a big thankyou all those who have assisted in so many ways over the years.

As yet, no-one has volunteered to take this on but in order for the Chronicle to continue beyond December 2025, we do need someone as soon as possible to assist with it.

Many Denmeadians do appreciate this long-standing publication but we are fully aware that many things have changed in the last seventy years, and it could be that the time is right for the Chronicle to change significantly too, or to be discontinued.

On 2nd July the topic will be "International Drug Cartel", we await with interest to see what that will involve!



On Wednesday 4th June, Greening Denmead welcomed members from the Waterlooville Men's Shed, Fox and Hounds Pub, Denmead Repair Café, and South Downs Funeral Services to cut the green ribbon and officially open Denmead's brand new book swap cabinet.

This charming addition to the village is about more than just sharing a good read. It is a practical step towards waste prevention, one of the five core pillars that Greening Denmead champions, alongside Space for Nature, Energy-Efficient Warmer Homes, Health Impacts of Climate Change, and the Cycle of the Seed.

The inspiration behind the cabinet stems from a simple but powerful idea: waste prevention starts not with recycling, but with stopping things going to

waste in the first place. In our throwaway culture, items are often used briefly and discarded. But if

#### **Denmead Walks**

This walk is long and strenuous but ideal for a day route in summer from Denmead. Initially taking Wayfarers Walk toward Hambledon it branches off near Rushmoor before dropping down to the northern end of the village then heading toward Chidden. After Green Lane it takes in Wallops Wood then ascends East Hoe Road from which there are spectacular views both north across the

surrounding countryside then south toward the IOW and Solent. A welcome break at the Old Forge Café could be taken on the homeward leg.

From Kidmore Lane car park turn R then further on go L into Cemetery Lane. At the end of the cemetery bear R on Wayfarers Way before going L then R on the path that runs alongside a wide field. Remain on the path passing through two kissing gates turning L after the second then almost immediately R into Harrowgate Lane.

**1.8km/1.1 miles** Go through another kissing gate slightly further on continuing along the FP that runs diagonally L across the field. Turn L after passing through the hedge at the end of the field then after a bend in the track turn R heading toward the woodland ahead. Stay on this path passing the woods and a horse paddock to your L finally emerging onto Pithill Lane.

3km/1.9miles Go R then almost immediately L through a metal gate and

continue along the wide bridleway to the far end of the field where the path curves to the L and leads to Glidden Lane. Start downhill then soon after go L downhill Glidden Lane.

**4.9km/3.1 miles** On emerging in the village cross the main road and head up the side road opposite. After a double bend soon pick up a FP on the RHS that passes

between the vines. At the far end go over a stile and immediately turn L. At the top of the rise the FP turns R through a kissing gate and along an enclosed path toward a copse. After going through another gate descend through the woodland and bear L with vines on your LHS.

**6km/3.75miles** Go diagonally L partway across the field which leads to Brook Lane. Cross the latter heading along Chidden Holt on the metalled surface road.

**7.8km/4.9miles** On coming into the centre of Chidden go L at the T junction in the direction of Droxford on Chidden Lane. Stay on the lane ignoring a FP on the LHS part way along.

**8.6km/5.4miles** Go L off the Chidden Lane into Green Lane part way along the latter passing Big West End Farm. Remain on the lane and finally take a R turn a short distance after Hook Cottage.

**9.8km/6.1 miles** Walk up the gentle slope which is Grenville Lane at the top of which bear L at the entrance to Wallops Wood eco housing development. Head toward the first of the houses then branch L on the FP that leads to the B2 I 50.

10.9km/6.8miles Take care crossing the busy
B2150 before starting up East Hoe Road enjoying the best views of the
walk to your L when nearing the summit.

12.3km/7.7miles Just after passing the gates of East Hoe Manor pick up Wayfarers Walk again and go L through a kissing gate into the field walking slightly R across the same. On a clear day there are wonderful views over the Solent to the IOW from this FP.At the far side leave the field by another gate and walk along the RH side until reaching a gate on the same side. Go through the kissing gate, keep the fence on your LHS and soon enter Boarhuts Copse. Continue along the path through the woodland.

13.4km/8.4miles Turn R on leaving the woodland enjoying the view down into Hambledon and across the valley. Continue to a gate made of a recycled pallet then turn L downhill but go R at the junction of paths making your way along the bottom of the meadow and over 3 stiles the last of which leads onto Cams Hill.

**13.8km/8.6miles** Go L downhill and there is now the option of a break at Old Forge tea Shop which is at the end of the lane. If not stopping at the tea shop bear R at the main road and further again take care crossing into Bury Lodge Lane.

**I5km/9.4miles** Nearing the summit of the hill after rounding a double bend, pick up the Wayfarers Way FP on your RHS and follow this around the perimeter of two fields turning L at the end of the second soon reaching Rushmere Lane.

**I 5.8km/9.9miles** Turn R and stay on the lane passing Rookwood Cottage and emerging onto the B2 I 50 at Forest Gate.

**16.7km/10.4miles** Cross the main road and go L, take care further on as there is a stretch with no pavement, continue past Uplands Road and as the hill descends cross the road again onto a FP.

17km/10.6miles Follow the footpath into High Wood continuing downhill before emerging from the woodland to walk along a fenced-in FP. On reaching a kissing gate on your LHS turn R and retrace your steps back to the starting point.





#### **Farewell Flowers at Horticultural Society**

June saw an unexpected change to the meeting of Denmead's Horticultural Society due to the late cancellation of the published speaker. However, member Kelly Howe, The Flower Artist, stepped into the limelight and gave an interesting talk on her recent experience working on the Farewell Flowers Directory Stand at Chelsea, a non-profit organisation promoting sustainable and British-grown funeral flowers.

The funeral business is one of the most plastic-heavy areas of floristry – every year,

plastic-heavy areas of floristry

crematoriums alone send 14.670 cubic meters of floral ... one of the most foam and single-use plastic to UK landfills, the equivalent of six Olympic-sized swimming pools! The stand organiser realised that the costs for flowers and other display items would be expensive so sought sponsorship. Disappointed by lack of uptake from undertakers, she found that the crematorium society provided it as they are responsible

for removing and disposing of the displays and pay thousands annually in landfill tax.

The stand was in a graveyard setting with a wicker coffin filled with British grown blooms held in place with a handmade willow framework covered in moss, a substitute for floral foam, with the blooms staying fresh for the whole of the show. To complete the setting, a male figure and dog, made entirely from chicken wire and decorated with blooms, sat on a wooden bench facing the coffin. Kelly and the other helpers, dressed in yellow, gave out yellow tags to tie onto the rope surrounding the stand. 1000 tags with little messages looked particularly eye catching. Kelly explained how she created her own cut flower garden, and where she buys her flowers from, comparing the journey imported flowers take to reach the UK.

After the talk, the floor was opened for an impromptu Q&A with audience members asking about pruning Rhododendron, why peonies didn't flower and if flag irises were correctly planted with answers provided by both a panel and the floor. The flower of the month was won by Ted Hoare with a very pretty frilly rose.

#### Fast-Track Employment Training

The highly successful Hampshire Skills Bootcamps programme is set to run for a third year, thanks to funding of  $\pounds 7$  million secured by Hampshire County Council from the Department for Education – almost double that of the previous year.

The training benefits residents aged 19 years and over, enabling job seekers, as well as those in work, to gain further training, while employers can benefit from upskilling their workforce. Based on local employer demand and the skill-sets currently in short supply, the Bootcamps provide a direct path to employment upon completion, with a guaranteed job interview at the end of each course for those who are unemployed.

Over the last two years, Skills Bootcamps training has given hundreds of working adults confidence in their abilities and advanced their careers. The latest round of funding will enable training to be offered to at least 1,750 learners across a variety of subjects including AI, leadership and management, teaching assistant, data analytics, and B2B sales. Courses are flexible and include a minimum of 60 hours of learning across a maximum 16-week period. Residents can benefit with learning planned to fit around professional and family commitments, allowing people in different circumstances to gain the skills employers are looking for. For most Skills Bootcamp courses, no previous knowledge is needed. Courses can be classroom-based, on-the-job or online. More information and guidance is available at hants.gov.uk/business/skillsbootcamp

For those who need help deciding on suitable courses, an online National Careers Service Skills Assessment is available to establish existing skills and match them to potential careers. See https://nationalcareers.service.gov.uk/

In 2024/25, the Council enrolled over 1,000 learners onto the Bootcamps in project management, digital marketing, data analytics, coding, construction, early years, health and social care, hospitality, film and TV, engineering, and green skills – such as installing residential heat pumps, and electric vehicle repair and maintenance.

help reverse nature's decline. Produced in conjunction with a range of organisations, the strategy maps the most valuable existing habitats for nature, setting out proposals for creating, restoring and enhancing habitats, and suggests priorities and targets for nature's recovery. Among a broad range of suggested priorities and actions, the strategy includes proposals that could:

- shape how future funding for farming and land management is used
- help local planning authorities understand locations important for conserving and restoring biodiversity
- identify priority areas for habitat creation and connectivity
- provide guidance on actions on farmland and woodland to achieve nature recovery and move towards sustainable farming practices
- guide communities with funding applications for nature recovery projects suggest potential measures for embedding nature into urban infrastructure, such as stormwater management.

In 2021, the Environment Act required local areas to produce Local Nature Recovery Strategies. The Government designated HCC as the Responsible Authority for delivering the strategy for Hampshire, including areas covered by Southampton and Portsmouth City Councils, as well as the New Forest and South Downs National Parks (within Hampshire). The final version of the Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Hampshire is expected to be published by the end of the year.

#### Ageing Well

While living longer is something to be celebrated and our ageing population presents opportunities, it also has implications for the economy, services and society. Knowing the size and structure of the population is fundamental for decision makers and policy makers. The latest census data confirms that the Hampshire population continues to age. There are over 300,000 people living in Hampshire who are aged 65 years and over, equating to over one in five of our residents (22%). Hampshire's population is older than England overall where 19% of the total population are 65 years and over.

Across the Hampshire districts there are distinct differences; the area of Rushmoor has a comparatively young population with 15% aged 65 years and over. The New Forest has the oldest population structure where almost one third of the population (29%) are aged 65 years or more. The number of older people is expected to continue to rise substantially, local forecasts show that the biggest increase will be in the 75 years and over population which is forecast to increase by 24% by 2028.
