New life, new starts, new hope!

I, like many, struggle with the winter months, particularly January and February which seem never-ending, the days so dark, damp and cold! Over the last few weeks it has been wonderful to witness new life emerging, daffodils, primroses and crocuses bursting forth...



New life is amazing and wonderful: be it new life in nature, the joy of a new baby, or fresh, creative idea. Researchers,

astronomers, geneticists and scientists are constantly discovering new life and are often astounded at the complexity, design and wonder of it all. New life holds within it potential and growth, hope and purpose, meaning and creativity. New life marks a new beginning – a new start.

This Easter our churches will be decorated in gold and white, the symbolic colour at Easter, representing the light and joy, the hope and promise that Jesus Christ is risen and in Him we can all experience and know everlasting life – eternal life. For several weeks, the church celebrates and rejoices – the best news of all.

So, this Easter, give and receive an egg, share time with family and friends, enjoy the long weekend, go for a walk in the countryside and look for signs of new life, but do more than that – why not come along to church this Easter (Sunday 9thApril or in the weeks thereafter) and hear the best news ever – Jesus is risen! Alleluia!

Step out, give it a go, start a new life today....

Thunderbolts and Remembrance at the Afternoon W.I.

March's meeting included a talk entitled "90 Minutes at Entebbe" by Lt. Col. Jeremy Prescott describing Operation Thunderbolt to rescue the passengers and crew of a hijacked Air France plane in Uganda in 1976. Jeremy explained that he had been an army officer for 26 years and that he gave talks to raise awareness of sacrifice and remembrance. This included getting forgotten memorials reinstated and to assist relatives in visiting them.

The Air France plane, hijacked by members of the PLO in June 1967, was flown to Entebbe Airport in Uganda where the passengers and crew were detained. Israeli authorities formed a special unit to release the hostages and flew into Entebbe under radar detection. The incident has been depicted in a number of films.



Around the Green

Denmead Walks

This is an easy circular route from the Harvest Home pub that is suitable as a walk during any season of the year. Initially passing through the greenways then the centre of Denmead it then heads in a clockwise direction on lanes

WALK DETAILS

Length: 9km (5.6 miles) Duration: 2h 20m Walk Grade: EASY (2/5) Number of Stiles: 4 (Shorter route: 7km/4.4miles – 1hr 50m approx. – no stiles)

surrounding the village. It is mainly on metalled surfaces with a short section on a footpath between Closewood Farm and Sheepwash Farm.

Cross the road with your back to the pub then bear L along the path that runs parallel to the fence bordering the road before going R then L toward the houses on the gravel path. Walk between the houses and at the junction go R and shortly after L into Lowland Road.

Turn R onto the greenway in front of the gates that lead to the pavilion with the playing fields beyond. Bear L further on into Ashling Park Road keeping the field boundary on your LHS. On reaching the end of the greenway, opposite James

Howell Court, turn L and continue along the road as far as the village centre.

1.1km/0.68mile With the Denmead Health Centre opposite turn R and pass the shops then use the crossing. Pass the church eventually turning L into Kidmore Lane. Walk as far as the junction with Tanners Lane then go R. At the end of Tanners turn R into White Horse Lane, walk as far as Edneys Lane bearing slightly R on entering the latter.

2.56km/1.6miles At the junction with Anmore Road go L in the direction of Catherington. Turn R further on into Clifton Crescent which leads into Soake Road. On reaching the latter bear R and stay on this road as far as the main road.

3.77km/2.35miles Turn L and walk a short distance up the road before

crossing into Closewood Road – great care is needed crossing this busy main road. Walk the length of this road. If you want to take an alternative shorter route, go R on Wayfarers Walk partway along the road and take the footpath across the field before crossing the local golf course. This leads to Furzeley Road where you turn R and continue the junction with Forest Road. Directions back to the pub as from * below.



5km/3.1miles On reaching Pipers Hill junction go L and continue for about 250m as far as Closewood Farm. Here go R over a stile on the footpath that leads through the farm. Follow the path around the perimeter of the field (electric fencing on the RHS) crossing three more stiles before emerging onto Sheepwash Lane. Turn R, go over the bridge, pass Sheepwash Farm and continue to Crossways Junction.

Pipers Hill Junction

6.55km/4.1miles Remain in the same direction heading back to Denmead eventually bearing L at the next junction into Furzeley Road. In dry conditions it is possible to return to the pub by turning L into Creech Woods about 150m

after the junction. In winter it is better to stay on Furzeley Road as far as the junction with Forest Road.

7.86km/4.8mil *Turn L and walk as far as the roundabout – the pub is on the RHS. However, a more pleasant route back to the Harvest Home is along the village greenways.

Lesley Rose, Advice Services Manager for Citizens Advice Winchester District gives advice on what to do if a company you've ordered from goes out of business.

Q I ordered a watch online with personalised engraving for my partner's birthday. The company has since gone out of business. I keep phoning and emailing them but can't get through. I'm assuming they can't fulfil my order, but I'd paid for the watch upfront and can't afford to buy another gift until I get my money back, please help?

A I understand the frustration you must be feeling - especially as you've already parted with your money and presumably spent time searching for a suitable gift. I assume you haven't had a dispatch note yet, which suggests the order isn't on its way.

If the company's gone into administration, it may still be able to fulfil outstanding orders, but if the company is already in liquidation, you'll need to try to get your money back. If you're unsure about what state the company is in, the Citizens Advice website has information on how to find out.

As the company hasn't responded to your calls or emails, is there a shop or office you can visit or write to, to get an update on your order, or request a refund? If that isn't possible, the next steps depend on whether it's a limited company (it will have ltd or plc after its



title) or if it's a sole trader (someone who runs their own business) or partnership.

If it's a limited company, you'll need to get details of the administrator or receiver - the person dealing with settling the trader's debts. The names of those administrators will usually be on the website of the company that's gone bust. You should register your claim as a creditor on the GOV.UK website. Fill out the form with details of what you're owed and send it to the administrator dealing with the trader's debts. Unfortunately, there's only a small chance you'll receive any money back because you'll be last in a long list of creditors who need to be paid.

As the order was online (and I'm therefore assuming you paid by debit or credit card) you could also try getting your money back with a Section 75 claim or a chargeback claim to your card provider or bank. Full details about both these types of claims can be found on the Citizens Advice website.

If the seller was a sole trader or partnership and not a limited company, pursuing a Section 75 or chargeback claim is your best option. Every case is different when traders go under, but you can call the Citizens Advice





Horticultural Society brings the focus inside

The Denmead Horticultural Society, affiliated to the Hampshire Federation of Horticultural Societies, attended its AGM at Sparsholt College in February. Denmead entered the Inter-Society Quiz and was delighted to beat six other teams to win the SCATS trophy for the first time in 68 years! We had once previously been runners up but now Denmead's name will be added to the trophy. Thanks to Rosemary Bell and Phil Stock for joining me on the team.

Liz Penman of Rose Clover gave an excellent talk on house plants at the March meeting. She explained that, wanting a career change from advertising, she took a



floristry course and, working in a florist shop, noticed that plants took second place to the flowers for sales. She decided to specialise in indoor plants and started on a market stall until opening her shop in 2018.

Liz told us about the history of indoor plants and their current popularity. They are beneficial for health and are popular with those working from home and those living in flats. She started with some of the easiest plants including the Zizi plant from Africa and the Snake plant from Madagascar also known as Mother-in-laws-tongue. These are tolerant of drought and low light so only need watering occasionally. Many plants are killed by over-watering so Liz recommended using a moisture meter to check the level at the bottom of the pot. She showed us lots more plants from her shop, some more tricky to care for and gave us tips on location, bug control and repotting.

On 4th April Chris Bird's subject will be No-Dig Vegetable Growing. Chris is a horticulture lecturer at Sparsholt College and his talk will look at the benefits of the no-dig method and the importance of adding organic matter to the soil surface to maintain its structure and support the millions of beneficial micro-organisms living there. Bring your questions on veg growing for Chris at 7.30pm at the Church Hall, visitors welcome £2.

We are looking forward to our Spring Show on Saturday 1st April and hope that, in spite of the current weather, there will be some Spring flowers to see. Do join us for tea and cake from 1-4pm.

Increased payments for all Homes for Ukraine hosts

The County Council has increased payments made to all Hampshire residents hosting Ukrainian guests as part of the Government's Homes for Ukraine Scheme from £350 to £500 per month. The county of Hampshire has welcomed the third highest number of Ukrainian nationals in England, with more than 1,450 families residing locally.



Council Tax



HCC's council tax precept for the financial year beginning 1st April 2023, will increase by a total of 4.99%, of which 2% will go specifically towards adults' social care, in line with Government policy. This equates to an annual charge of \pounds 1,460.25 for a Band D

property – an increase of £69.45 per year or approximately £1.34 a week. The increase will generate £37m of vital extra income towards the delivery of crucial services to the people of Hampshire in 2023/24 and still means that Hampshire has one of the lowest council tax precepts of any county in England.

Alongside revenue budget plans, the Council has approved new capital spending of $\pounds 645.3$ million over the next three years. This provision for Hampshire's infrastructure brings the Council's four-year total investment in the fabric of Hampshire to $\pounds 927.3$ million.

New Local Plan for the Winchester District

Cllr Derek Green, who had been on a leave of absence since September 2022, resigned as the Mayor of Winchester and the Deputy Mayor Cllr Angela Clear was installed as the Right Worshipful Mayor of Winchester at the February meeting of the Full Council.

Over the past few months the main council meetings have been transferred from the Guildhall to the council chamber in the Castle, home of the County Council. The preparation of the New Local Plan is moving forward and, like Denmead, a number of other Parish Councils have decided to go down the route of preparing a Neighbourhood Plan which will be incorporated into the Winchester Local Plan. The Neighbourhood Plan is a way of developing one's own community by meeting the requirements of the overall development for the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). In Denmead's case the Parish Council has formed a team of local members of the public to allocate the areas of potential development land in order to create a viable way for the village to grow, this is under the chairmanship of the Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council Cllr Kevin Andreoli. Periodical meetings with both officers of the city council, together with the Portfolio Holder, ensure that the DNP is keeping within the framework

of the NPPF with District Councillors also invited to join the meetings.

The New Winchester Local Plan is in line to be published in 2024 (a final consultation will also be published) when it will be submitted to the Secretary of State for sign off (Adoption). I would encourage all residents to understand how this new plan will impact us, not only here in Denmead but the whole of the Winchester District and to take the opportunity to comment on it.

We welcome you to visit us at a Local Government Surgery to speak to us, your ward Councillors, about the local plan or any other issues you would like to raise. Surgeries are held on the first Saturday of each month from 10am to 12 noon in the Heath Room, All Saints Church. No appointment required.
