ear Friends,

I do hope you have all had a happy Christmas celebrating the birth of our Saviour, Jesus Christ with family, friends, and neighbours. I wanted to begin by thanking all those who worked so hard to make our Advent and Christmas celebrations so special here at All Saints. As we look to the start of another new year, we do so with a range of emotion, recognising that change in unavoidable. Maybe like me you can't believe another year has rushed by so quickly and you're not quite ready for another. Maybe you're looking forward to the year ahead. Perhaps you have definite plans in place – maybe a holiday, or a family wedding, something booked and, in the calendar, something you're really looking forward to especially after three years of disruption. Perhaps you have some tentative plans in place – things you would like to do this coming year, people you'd like to catch up with, a job to complete. Perhaps you're just waiting to see what might happen

this year – maybe a change of job or home, perhaps you're awaiting significant news. Or perhaps there is an element of uncertainty, even fear, as you think ahead as you're not sure what may happen with the world in such confusion and disorder.

The truth is none of us know what is coming next – we cannot be certain of what lies ahead. It is perhaps as well that we don't know everything that will unfold.

Jesus said, 'do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.' (Matthew 6: 34) In fact, Jesus repeats this sentiment two more times stressing we must not worry about our lives.

That's not the same as our problems disappearing, but when we trust God, we can learn not to worry about the future.

Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."

So, I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.

As we travel into 2023 can I encourage you to place your hand in God's hand, to hold fast, to seek his ways and trust that He will provide,


Auction of Promises

Denmead Walks

Directions for this walk are given from the community centre, however it can be started from any point in the village as long as anyone undertaking it gets to the junction of Furzeley Road and Forest Road. This is quite a long route that can be completed at any time of year, but as it is entirely on the metalled surfaces of lanes

WALK DETAILS

Length: 15.5km (9.7 miles),

Duration: 3h 45m

Walk Grade: MODERATE (3/5)

There are no stiles

this is ideally suited for winter walking when many footpaths can be impassable. The highlight of the walk is obviously the picturesque village of Southwick, however there are several pleasant vistas at different points.

Leaving the community centre car park by the main entrance turn L. then bear R at the main road heading toward the centre of Denmead. After about 250m as the main road deviates to the L. take the R fork through Green Lane at the end of which cross Southwick Road then continue along Woodrow Green, one of the village greenways. Follow the path passing the pavilion and playing fields on the LHS, then, where the greenway turns L and becomes Ashling Park Road, go straight on into The Willows. Stay on the path until it comes to a small bridge and here turn L just before the bridge which is the start of Home Mead

Follow the greenway through Home Mead then Forest Mead. Further on the path leads in a clockwise direction around a wide green space, passes the old farm house and a play area before eventually coming to the sign for Mead End which is positioned just before a metal barrier. Here go R heading for the junction of Forest Road and Furzeley Road. (2.2km/1.4miles)

Cross Forest Road into Furzeley Road and walk its whole length turning R into Sheepwash Lane as the main road goes around a left-hand bend. (3km/1.9miles) Walk as far as Belney Lane (3.6km/2.2miles) turning R into the latter then remain on this road passing the enormous solar farm along with other farm buildings until there is a R turn signposted Southwick. (5.36km/3.3miles)

At this point the road ahead, which is NOT to be taken, becomes Pigeon House Lane, however go R into Pitymoor Lane. After the initial straight stretch there is a double bend followed by a slight hill at the top of which is Comphouse Farm on the RHS.



Around the Green

Continue straight on until the lane bends to the L. (6.4km/4 miles) If underfoot conditions permit it is possible to walk on Pilgrims' Way by going straight ahead at this LH bend - keep the brick wall of the Southwick Estate on your RHS. This FP, part of the Pilgrims' Way, leads to the main road.

If remaining on the lane continue to the top of the hill as far as the junction with the Southwick road (7km/4.4miles) where a dwelling named Finsley Lodge stands on the RHS. Go R at this point and walk along the grass verge which borders the main road downhill as far as the roundabout on the outskirts of Southwick (8.2km/5.1miles) Turn R at this point taking great care when crossing the bridge as there is no footpath/pavement. At the mini roundabout go L heading uphill passing The Golden Lion pub on the High Street to the small village green where there is seating both outside and under a small shelter. As this is just over the half way point of this walk, maybe take a coffee break - the village store can satisfy your caffeine fix! (8.64km/5.4miles)



Suitably refreshed, continue to the junction opposite the village church before

turning L heading down West Street as far as the junction with Fareham Road and Bridge Street. Here go R then take the second turning R into Common Lane

(9.2km/5.7miles) after which start to steadily climb uphill eventually coming to Beckford Lane. (10.6km/6.6miles) Turn R at this junction.

Initially pass a farm on the LHS before the lane begins downhill at the bottom of which it crosses the river Wallington; on a gentle rise further on the lane passes a

couple of footpath signs before it becomes Apless Lane, but there is no sign denoting this. Continue straight ahead eventually passing the western entrance to Creech Woods. (12.5km/7.8miles)



After the Chairmakers pub (12.9km/8.1miles) cross the road (take great care as this is a busy junction) then bear R in the direction of Hambledon through the hamlet of Worlds End. Stay on this lane but take particular care at a double bend at the far end of a straight stretch of road. Just after the double bend turn R into Dirty Lane (14km/8.75miles) - this is a short distance beyond the entrance gates to the fisheries.


At the cross roads of Dirty Lane, Broad Lane, Uplands Road and School Lane (14.4Km/9miles) turn R into the latter and continue to walk uphill passing the Fox & Hounds pub at the junction between Upper and Lower Crabbick Lanes. Go straight along School Lane as far as your starting point at the community centre.





Tributes and Honours at Denmead Village Association

At our November meeting, the
Acting Chairman paid tribute to our
former Chairman, Neil LanderBrinkley, who recently passed away
unexpectedly. He then introduced
the speaker, Jeremy Prescott and his
talk on the Victoria Cross.

Jeremy first told us of his personal mission to acknowledge the sacrifice made in conflicts by so many and to remember them, as well as his work to combat Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and promote the help available to sufferers.

The Victoria Cross started in the Crimea, when Queen Victoria learned that other countries awarded medals. and it was introduced in 1856 to honour valour. Only 15 have been awarded since the end of World War II and only one woman has ever received it. Queen Victoria was very much involved in the design of the medal and the first was awarded to a Naval officer. The London jewellers Hancocks makes the Victoria Crosses and the metal used is taken from an item stolen from Russia in the Crimea - who had, in turn, already stolen it from China!

There is a very rigorous system for

awarding this honour. One criterion is that the valour displayed must be in the face of the enemy, whereas the George Cross is awarded to those who did not face the enemy during their act of gallantry.

The PDSA (The People's Dispensary for Sick Animals) has its own honour, the Dickin Medal, which has been awarded to pigeons, dogs and a cat in recognition of their service.

Jeremy described several winners of the VC and their brave actions. Since World War II the medal has been awarded for valour in Korea, the Falklands and Afghanistan. It is always presented by the monarch at Buckingham Palace and, at the investiture, the VC takes precedence over all other awards. There are currently nine living holders of the honour.


