May - a month of celebrations!

As I sit writing this, it seems, that at long last the weather has changed – spring is here! The Met Office are now promising plenty of sunshine after the wettest March in over 40 years!

As we look ahead to May we have plenty to celebrate. First, we have three bank holidays to look forward to this month! First the early May Day on the 1st May, then the spring bank holiday on the 29th May and in between, an extra bank holiday, on the 8th May as this year we mark the Coronation of King Charles III.



The actual coronation service of King Charles III will take place on Saturday 6th May. The Coronation Ceremony will take place at Westminster Abbey, London, and will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Compared with previous coronations, the ceremony will undergo some alterations to represent multiple faiths, cultures, and communities across the United Kingdom, and will be shorter than Elizabeth II's coronation in 1953. The ceremony will begin with the anointing of Charles, symbolising his spiritual entry into kingship, and then his crowning and enthronement, representing his assumption of temporal powers and responsibilities. Camilla will be crowned in a shorter and simpler ceremony. The royal family will travel to Buckingham Palace in a state procession and appear on the balcony to celebrate the occasion

The coronation will mark not only a sacred anointing and formal crowning, but also include public celebrations. On Sunday 7th May, churches across the land will be holding special services, to commemorate this special occasion. Here at All Saints, we will be holding one united service at 9am to which all are very welcome. That evening there will be a televised Coronation Concert at Windsor Castle with representatives of the King and



the Queen Consort's charities as well as members of the general public in attendance.

Then on May 8th many local communities will gather for street parties and events to celebrate and to encourage



community service and volunteering through a new scheme the Big Help Out initiative. Here in Denmead the Parish Council, and many community groups have been working hard to plan and prepare an amazing Coronation Street Party from 1pm-5pm. This afternoon will be filled with music, activities for children, petting zoo, magic shoes, facepainting, archery, entertainment, community stalls and much, much more. Please do come along – bring your picnic and eat in the church grounds or there

will also be food stalls.



The church will be covered once more in wonderful red, white, and blue bunting! We are also running a special design your own Crown Competition – all the details can be found on pg......(Steve can you complete please) Now this isn't just for children – all ages are very welcome to have a go!

This will be the first coronation of a British monarch to occur in the 21st century, and the 40th to be held at Westminster Abbey since 1066, so let's celebrate – and more importantly let's be praying for our King and the Royal Family, for our nation and the world.

Then on Sunday 28th May we mark Pentecost Sunday – the day where for nearly two millennia Christians have celebrated the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on God's people.

Pentecost is celebrated fifty days after Easter. For the early disciples they had encountered the risen Jesus; for forty days Jesus had spent time with them, but then he ascended into heaven and the disciples were left on their own again. The disciples remained gathered together in an upper room in Jerusalem not knowing quite what to do. Then ten days later, as they were marking the Jewish festival of Shavuot, the Holy Spirit descends upon them. The disciples hear wind and see flames on one another, and then find they can speak different languages as they are filled with the Spirit. At first sight, some think they are drunk, but the Apostle Peter tells the crowd they are full of the Holy Spirit.

The disciples receive an amazing gift, a person, God himself comes to inhabit them. The Holy Spirit comes as love and truth to dwell in their hearts. The Spirit makes sense of the mystery of the Christ they have encountered and enables them to share that mystery with others, so that

they too will believe and be transformed.

From this momentous day, the disciples filled with the Holy Spirit begin to tell others about Jesus, travelling far and wide, they establish communities of faith, what we now call the church. Pentecost is the birth-day of the global church - the start of a new era. Pentecost is as every bit of a gospel event as Jesus' ministry and miracles, death, and resurrection. The Spirit's coming grants us assurance, hope



and identity as much as a bloody cross or an empty tomb. The gift of the Holy Spirit is part and parcel of Christ's work on behalf of His people.

The Holy Spirit didn't come just once, and that was it! Rather, the Holy Spirit is with the church today. The Holy Spirit continues to fill Christians today, inspiring them, encouraging them, helping them to love, and giving them boldness to pass on the good news of Jesus.

This Pentecost Sunday, All Saints will celebrate Pentecost – a bit like a birthday – we will share cake and sing Happy Birthday. I'm also encouraging everyone to wear something either red, a symbol of the fire and the Spirit.



GHANA

- a link with Denmead through All Saints Church

In 2002, two members from All Saints, Denmead visited their link church of St Paul's at New Tafo Akim in the diocese of Koforidua, Ghana. Since that year there have been visits between the two churches, mainly from the UK to Ghana (only a few from Ghana to UK, due to visa problems).

During that time we have made many friends and started a few traditions.... one of which is Saturday afternoon 'Messy Church'. We take craft materials with us, share a bible story, play some games, sing many songs (some in English and some in Twi) and end the afternoon with refreshments and sometimes some dancing!!

Ghana is a very hot country, with high humidity levels. It is also a very safe country to visit; the people are so helpful and friendly and very joyful. They may not have so much material wealth as ourselves but they have tremendous spiritual wealth in everything they do – two common phrases are 'God first' and 'God willing'.

It is a humbling experience to visit Ghana, when you realise that

their hospitality is second to none – they will offer you food and water, often going without themselves. It is their custom that visitors eat apart from the hosts – and I sometimes wonder if this is because there is not enough food to go round for the family? On first meeting anyone in their own home they greet you with 'Akwaaba' – meaning 'you are welcome'. They offer you a seat and then bring refreshment to you – water or a soft drink (mineral) or 'Malta' (the latter is an acquired taste)!

If you are visiting a chief, it is customary to present him with a bottle of Schnappes, which he then proceeds to open and pour into a small glass and pass it round for everyone to have a sip!!! (Prayer comes in



handy here... a) that you're not going to catch anything from the communal 'tot' and b) that you manage to sip it without coughing and spluttering)!!

In fact prayer comes in handy a lot in Ghana especially when travelling. It is customary to pray for 'travelling mercies' before setting out on any journey. Many roads are untarmacked and full of potholes. The mini-buses or trotros are overcrowded, fairly old and travel incredibly fast. They are only allowed to carry 15 passengers, but that doesn't include children, chickens and the occasional goat – they don't count and go free of charge!

Over the past 20 years, education and healthcare have improved tremendously. Education is now free up to age 16 and healthcare likewise is available to all, at a very small cost or completely free.

It is an intriguing, colourful and amazing country to visit, especially as now, after 20 years, we have made many friendships and we feel very privileged to be part of their lives, as they are part of ours.

Denmead Walks

This is quite an interesting walk to the east of Denmead along a series of footpaths, lanes and bridleways starting at Kidmore Lane Car Park. The farthest point is Eastland Gate which is situated within the Horndean Parish Council area.

Leaving Kidmore Lane CP go R up the lane then turn R into Tanners Lane. At the end of Tanners Lane bear R at the junction with White Horse Lane and continue as far as Merritts Farm (a barn conversion on the LHS) - here go L on the track/footpath passing two cottages before coming to Edneys Lane. With Saltbox Barn opposite cross the lane going slightly R, follow the direction of the finger post then climb over the stile (this is to the R of a wide metal gate) and continue along the footpath which bears L after about 50m.

WALK DETAILS

Distance 6.4km (4 miles) Duration 1h 30m Walk Grade EASY (2/5) Stiles 2

Crossways Junction

Follow the path in a clockwise direction around the perimeter of the field turning R at the far end then R again in front of a wire fence that borders the garden of Hope Cottage. Following the yellow footpath direction sign go L almost immediately on a path enclosed by fencing on both sides borders the garden; continue onto the driveway of the cottage that leads to the lane.

Take care crossing this busy lane before starting uphill on the bridleway opposite. At the top of the slope go R onto a metalled surface passing two houses including Clarendon Farm on the right and a white house to the left. After passing a barn on the right the uneven surface of the bridleway returns; continue in a straight line until the edge of Wecock Farm estate lies ahead.

At the end of the bridleway go around the tree trunk to the L then head for the far right-hand corner of the large field. There is no marked route across

the field so the options are to go around the perimeter in either direction or up to the trees ahead before cutting L across the field. On reaching the far side go L on the farm track and head for the junction passing stables on the L.

Go L with the house in front and after about 80m pick up the FP on the R just after passing the white walled cottages. Stay close to the hedge, pass the pylon then after about 20m go L on a well-marked FP; this in turn goes R as it enters a small copse, then L ending up with a drop into the lane connecting Denmead with Lovedean. Again, listen carefully before stepping down onto the lane.

Cross the lane, go over the stile (this was flattened at the time of writing) then continue in a straight line along the FP going to the L of a small copse part way along - finally the path comes to a farm yard. Here go L, pass through the gate then take a R onto the lane. After immediately passing a semi-detached bungalow on the R it is a distance of about 400m to The Crossways junction.

Go L into Edneys Lane but immediately pick up the FP on the R which is accessed over a low stile. Continue across the field and after reaching White Horse Lane with Little Denmead Farm opposite, turn L. There are 2 routes back to the CP: the first and easier one is to remain on the lane

bearing R at the junction into Tanners Lane - turn L on reaching Kidmore Lane. The second route is to go R on the FP just after Bleak Cottage, over the stile then keeping to the RH perimeter of the field go around the latter until the final stile gives access to Kidmore Lane. Here turn L and return to the CP



Murders & Misdemeanours at the Village Association

The March meeting of the Denmead Village Association saw County Councillor Patricia Stallard talk about the new shop, 'Little GeMs' that she opened recently at Green Meadows Home in Green Lane. Open on Thursdays 10 - 12.30pm, it sells new as well as nearly new items. There was also an update on the traffic improvements in Forest Road.

Another speaker, Philip MacDougall spoke on the 'Murders and Misdemeanours' of Chichester district in the 19th and 20th centuries when 10,000 residents attended hangings, as part of the 'entertainment' of the day. He gave an example of a soldier who was hanged on the evidence of one eyewitness in a trial lasting only a couple of hours! The local police force used to station a constable at The Cross in the city centre, and an untrained night watchman in the evenings. Additionally, the Sussex Militia or Portsmouth Police were drafted in, as well as the Metropolitan Police from London. If a crime could not be solved in four days, Scotland Yard was even asked to help. He told of the early policing of the Goodwood Races started in 1802 and, as the Duke of Richmond had enormous influence. he brought down the Bow Street Runners from London, being the only trained police to deal with the 'mobs'.

Similar arrangements were made for Sloe Fair in 1904 (now held on the Chichester Festival Theatre Car Park).

On 1st April around 40 children attended the DVA's Easter Adventure event at the Community Centre. For a small entry fee plus an Easter egg, they painted eggs and made Easter cards. Refreshments were provided to sustain them while they were busily engaged in painting and, judging by the noise, everyone enjoyed themselves. After the event the Easter eggs which the children had brought were sent to the Waterlooville Food Bank via All Saints church.

The DVA is organising a window decorating competition for all the village shops as part of the King's Coronation celebrations, which will also include a hidden crown competition for children to find in the preceding week. In addition, there will be a king or queen scarecrow competition, using as many recyclable materials as possible with voting conducted by residents.

On 26th May Dr Carolyn Hargreaves, a carer for the Hampshire Bat Group, will give a talk about Bats and Other Wildlife, and there will be an opportunity to view them live and close up. Danny Stallard will also give a short update on his GoWild

Denmead group, as he develops wild areas around the village.

The speaker from the DVA's last meeting, Mark Seaman, will conduct members on a two hour walk over three miles on the Stansted Estate on Thursday 6th July at 10am. Meet at the information board, just inside the entrance to the Estate on the Finchdean Road, Rowlands Castle. Parking and lunch can be had at the

Castle Inn, Rowlands Castle (please register your car with them).

At our April talk Chris Bird told us about soil structure and formation and its importance for vegetable growing. He explained that the "No Dig" method mimics the natural process, preserves the structure of the soil and supports the many beneficial organisms that live there, allowing them to build up without disturbance. To find out more about starting "No Dig" I can recommend Charles Dowding's website, he has written books and runs courses on the subject, his methods are very successful and are widely adopted.

On 2nd May Matthew Phelps will talk on The Rewilding of the Knepp Estate. Farming of the 3500 acres ceased in 2001, grazing animals were introduced and the natural water courses restored. The project has seen an increase of rare species in the area, including nightingales, peregrine falcons, turtle doves and purple emperor butterflies. Matthew will also tell us about the more recent rewilding of the walled garden as an experiment to find plants that will cope with climate change. Join us at 7.30pm at the Church Hall, visitors welcome £2.

We will be at the Coronation street party on 8th May to talk to people about our activities and hopefully recruit some new members. We will have pumpkin plants for sale and look forward to seeing some giants at our Pumpkin Show in October.

This takes place in the **Barn Green Room** in the main building.




