During November we gather to remember at All Saints. We remember loved family and friends who have died whom we miss dearly, we remember those who have given their lives in service, and we remember and proclaim afresh that Jesus Christ is King.

On Friday 3rd November at 7pm we will hold our annual All Souls Service. This is a quiet, contemplative service at which we remember



family members and friends who have died. Some who come to the service will have lost a loved one recently. For others the loss will be more distant, but the pain still felt greatly. In hymns, prayers, and silence we will give thanks for times past and pray for strength in times to come. This is a service that gives time and space, so we can remember those who were dear to us and there is opportunity to light a candle in memory of a loved one if you wish.

On Sunday I2th November it is Remembrance Sunday. To mark and commemorate this significant day we will be having a short Remembrance Service, with Communion at 8.30am at All Saints before

then joining with local councillors, uniformed groups, local schools and adults and children from across the area for a village Act of Remembrance at 10.45am. We will remember with grateful hearts those who gave their everything for our today and future. Please gather from 10.45am or thereabouts at the village green for this important event. 'At the going down of



the sun and in the morning, we will remember them.' (Laurence Binyon)



And then at the end of the month, Sunday 26th we celebrate Christ the King. Now this is not an ancient festival in the Christian calendar, in fact, it was only established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, so it is a recent innovation! It was established at a time when Europe was in chaos. There was devastation after the first world war. Inflation was rampant, and colonialism was at its worst. The seeds of evil that would

eventually grow into the Holocaust and World War II were being planted in rising nationalistic movements and dictatorships. And so, Pope Pius established this festival of Christ the King to declare that Jesus Christ is King over all the world.

You see Pope Pius declared that Jesus is the goal of human history, the joy of all who hear, and the fulfilment of humanity's aspiration. Pope Pius hoped that proclaiming Christ's ultimate authority would function as a wake-up call to Christians and to nations not to be taken in by dictatorships or false ideas. He also hoped that in proclaiming Christ as King it would act as a reminder to Christians everywhere that Christ must reign in our hearts, and minds, our wills, and bodies.

Well today, nearly a hundred years later, we too need to heed this call. This message – that Christ is King - is a sure and certain hope, that we can trust in, particularly in the light of the awful, desperate situation in Israel and Gaza and with so many other parts of our world torn apart by war, corruption, disasters, and strife. As we recognise and honour Christ we call out in prayer, Lord Jesus, have mercy, send peace, bring calm and reconciliation in our time. Amen. ## **Denmead Walks**

This is the another walk that can be undertaken during the winter as it is totally on the lanes around Denmead, however after sustained wet weather a section of Kidmore Lane adjacent to Pyle Farm (about 150m beyond the junction with Tanners Lane) is liable to flood.

WALK DETAILS Distance: 5.6km/3.5 miles Duration: Ih 20m Walk Grade: EASY (1/5) Stiles: 0

Leaving Kidmore Lane car park go R up the lane then turn R into Tanners Lane. At the end of Tanners Lane bear R into White Horse Lane. Continue past Merrills Farm as far as the junction with Edneys Lane (1km). At this point turn sharp L and walk to Crossways where Edneys Lane gives way to the



start of Old Mill Lane.

2.1km/1.3miles Go L in the direction of Forest Gate and Hambledon along Mayswell Lane. Go straight on at the junction with Sawyers Hill but turn R at the Mayswell crossroad head toward Pithill.

3km/1.9miles A shortened version of this walk can be taken at this

point by turning L and heading back to Denmead at the Mayswell junction.

3.5km/2.2miles After dropping down a steep hill into the hamlet of Pithill, turn L at the junction heading back toward Denmead along Harrowgate Lane.

4km/2.5miles Just after passing the Wayfarers Way footpath on the RHS go L at Mayswell Lane then walk uphill going as far as the Mayswell crossroads.

4.3km/2.7miles Go R at this point heading back on Kidmore Lane heading back to Denmead and eventually the starting point at the car park will be reached.

If the ground is firm, it is possible to return to Denmead via the Wayfarers Walk FP which is to the R through a metal gate on the RHS about 20m after the L turn into Mayswell Lane at the 4km point of the walk. Remain on the

some of the items published in the recent Denmead Scene, which should be delivered to every house in the village, although it appears that some members had not received a copy. Any member who has not received a copy should contact Denmead Parish Council. Following this he introduced the quiz which has become part of each meeting.

At the September meeting of the Village

The Chairman introduced Melody Jones, the Treasurer, who talked about Carrie Morrison, the first woman solicitor in England. By the time Carrie was born, her father had business interests all over Europe and travelled extensively. As a result, Carrie spoke and read several languages. The family travelled to Australia, returning in 1900 via the Pacific, giving Carrie an invaluable addition to her education. In 1904 she joined Manchester High School for Girls, where Carrie became one of the most proficient. In 1907 she entered Girton College, Cambridge to study modern and medieval languages. Following which, up to 1914 she undertook several teaching roles, which she hated. Carrie then moved to MI5. where she met Alfred Baker, who told her he would give her a post in his law firm after the war. However, the War Office offered her a post in Constantinople (now Istanbul), which she accepted. In 1923 Cambridge introduced titular degrees but Carrie didn't apply for her MA until 1928.

By the end of the 19th century the medical and teaching professions allowed women to gualify and work alongside men, but the legal profession refused. It was 1919, following the Sex Disgualification (Removal) Act, when women were permitted to take the preliminary examinations and consider a legal career. Carrie became an articled clerk to Brown & Baker (the same Afred Brown) and passed the Law Society exam in December 1922. In that year Carrie was the first woman to become a solicitor.

Carrie used her law qualification to support the underprivileged as well as women but equal treatment for men and women was paramount in her dealings with both. In 1929 Carrie, 41, married her

26-year-old husband. They worked together on several high-profile cases and, as principled philanthropists, continued to support those in need. In 1936 they were divorced although they continued to work together.

Carried died in 1950 working to the end; she had devoted her life to helping those less fortunate than herself – a true philanthropist and humanitarian in all that she did.

The DVA meets on alternate months in All Saints church hall at 7.30pm and offers an opportunity to have your say on village matters and concerns. #### Soft Fruit advice at Denmead Horticultural Society

At the time of writing, we are looking forward to our Pumpkin & Apple Show, apologies for the wrong date last month – hope you realised it was Tuesday 24th!

Alan Horgan began his talk on Soft Fruit Growing at our October meeting with strawberries. He explained how commercially they are now mostly grown under cover on a table top system to avoid soil borne diseases and slugs. From his many years advising the industry he told us about the pests and diseases that can afflict strawberries. For the home grower he recommended growing in pots and using a trickle irrigation system. When growing in the ground rooted runners can be kept in a waiting bed, replant in a fresh patch after three years to avoid a buildup of diseases.

Raspberries come in many colours, yellow and black as well as red. Remove spent canes of the summer fruiting floricane varieties as soon as they have finished fruiting,

the new canes will fruit the following year. Primocane varieties such as Autumn Bliss can be double cropped by leaving some canes when pruning in February. Always buy certified plants from a reputable source to avoid problems such as viruses and rust which may be passed on in replanted runners. Alan also talked about the other varieties of soft fruit and recommended taking



hardwood cuttings in autumn and planting raspberries, blackcurrants and gooseberries in winter so now is the time to plan your fruit patch.

On 7th November we have our AGM followed by cheese and wine, 7.30pm in the Church Hall, all welcome. Our Craft Fair is on Saturday 11th November, 10am to 2pm - we have an excellent selection of crafts people so do come and see what they have to offer, also cakes to take home, or enjoy with a tea or coffee and filled rolls, soup, and jacket potatoes at lunchtime – hope to see you there.

# HCC Conservation and Support

# Conservation Funding to save UK's Rarest Orchids

Hampshire County Council has secured a  $\pounds$ 98K funding boost to help rare helleborine orchids to thrive. The conservation project aims to create protected habitats for the endangered plants at sites in East Hampshire.

The chalkland areas of the East Hampshire Hangers and nearby woodlands already provide a home to some of the UK's scarcest helleborine orchids but their numbers have been in decline. This project will protect these fragile locations and nurture the threatened orchid back from the brink of extinction. Conservation work such as this is a key priority for the Council enabling us to preserve precious natural landscapes for wildlife, develop resilience to climate change and ensure that the delicate ecosystems can spread and survive.

The Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust will focus on orchid preservation at a nature reserve east of West Meon. In June, the Council was appointed by the Government to prepare a Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Hampshire including the areas of Portsmouth and Southampton. The aim is to work with organisations and communities to improve the environment, protect wildlife and combat climate change, now and in the future.

#### Residents Hosting Ukrainian Families

HCC has announced that it will be paying an extra  $\pounds200$  per month to all Hampshire

residents hosting Ukrainian guests, as part of the Government's Homes for Ukraine Scheme, until the end of March 2024.This takes the monthly payment to £700.

#### Did you know that

- HCC has a County Smallholdings Service to support entry into farming, produce more food and provide rural employment
- Hampshire is one of 43 smallholdings authorities in England and Wales
- Hampshire provides farm tenancies to enable new entrants to establish their own farming businesses and existing tenants to take the next step
- The County Farms Estate has equipped more than 30 farms across some 4,600 acres of land throughout the county
- The Council is undertaking a new collaboration project with CPRE starting this autumn
- It is proposed to build a new Materials Recycling Facility [MRF] in Eastleigh as present ones at Alton and Portsmouth are not suitable to process an expanded range of modern materials.
- Planning permission has been granted for the new MRF. HCC has approved its share of capital funding [c£23 million] with Portsmouth City Council and Southampton City Council also investing.
