he month of October always reminds me of the first line of John Keats poem "Ode to Autumn" written just over 200 years ago. "Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness." Sadly, I can never remember any more of the poem without having to read it! The poem is believed to be inspired by Keats taking a walk in the water meadows behind Winchester College near his home. The story told is that he only went on the walk to escape from the sound of his landlady's daughter practising the violin. Fortunately, on his return, she had finished playing and he had been inspired to write what is considered one of the finest poems in the English language.

I am not sure I ever really truly understood what mellow fruitfulness means, but I do know that October is a season of thanksgiving for all the things we have, and an opportunity for reflection. The darkness creeps back into our mornings and evenings as the season of Autumn tiptoes in and gives us an opportunity to climb into our pj's early and hibernate each evening (or maybe that's just me!).

For some, the lack of sunlight can be difficult and challenging. But I think we can view darkness in a different light. Darkness is not something to dread as it can be a place of germination which gives us time and space to grow.

Darkness calls us to leave behind who we thought we were and to wait for new shoots to sprout and feel their way to a new place. As the trees start to lose their leaves, and it looks as if they are readying themselves to sleep through the winter, take note, we can learn from them. They are only letting go of all that no longer gives them life and moving their energy into something new that will bring new beauty, new growth, and a new harvest.



By the time this newsletter comes out All Saints will have celebrated Harvest and given thanks for all that God provides to nourish and sustain us – allowing us the opportunity to give to those who need a helping hand. symbolic meaning of harvest in the bible encompasses two main areas: God's provision for us and God's blessing for others. While we celebrate a harvest season just once a year, we experience the spirit of harvest all the time. Jesus reminds us in Matthew 22:37-39 "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: Love your neighbour as yourself."

Have you ever heard the expression, what goes around, comes around? The sentiment of the saying is often true. One of the first things we noticed as a family when we moved into the village was that everybody smiles at you when you're walking down the road. If we smile, it encourages others to smile too, if we do a good deed, it may encourage someone else to do one too. If we always think about others, acting towards them with consideration and kindness, it may bring a change to those we interact with and also within us. What a beautiful harvest that could be if we allow ourselves time to reflect and flourish this Autumn sowing new ways of thinking of others and sharing the good things that we have been blessed with.

#### A rose by any other name...

Gillian Taylor began the Horticultural Society's September talk on roses by showing pictures of amethyst-coloured Rosa Twilight Zone, a Grandiflora type and Rosa Narrow Water, a pale pink rambler, both beautifully scented and with a long flowering period, just two of her collection of 250. She recommended roses in the Flower Carpet series as they don't need dead-heading and hybrid musk types such as Buff Beauty and Moonlight with good glossy foliage are also firm favourites.

Gillian recommended growing roses in mixed borders rather than a dedicated rose bed: she brought a selection of cut flowers to show us which are good companions for roses including sedums, alliums, phlox, salvias, persicaria and asters. Species roses such as Rosa  $\times$ odorata mutabilis with their open single flowers are good for wildlife and Rugosa roses form good hips and are deer resistant. We saw pictures of the old roses collection at Mottisfont, important for maintaining genetic material and roses expertly trained over hazel structures at West Dean. So many beautiful flowers - we were all inspired to add more roses to our own gardens.

On 3rd October Alan Horgan will talk about Soft Fruit Growing at 7.30pm in the Church Hall and the Pumpkin and Apple Show will be held on 25th October.

## **Denmead Walks**

This walk follows a gentle, level route through Creech Woods heading west as far as Beckless Lane close to the Chairmakers pub. The return leg is along the main track through the west side of the woods. Please note this route rain.

#### WALK DETAILS

Distance: 6km/3.75miles Duration: 1h 30m Walk Grade: EASY (2/5) Stiles: 0

is only suitable for walks when the ground is firm – it quickly floods after heavy



Leaving the Harvest Home pub car park go R then cross the roundabout heading up Bunkers Hill. Branch L onto the footpath on reaching the edge of Creech Woods at the 40mph sign. Stay on the narrow footpath (FP) until it emerges onto the road leading into the car park. Go L here, walk through the car park (CP) maybe pausing to look at the information board that gives details of the occupation of Creech Woods during WWII.

Continue to the end of the CP and bear L onto the wide track through a short section of the woods as far as the first junction.

0.8km/0.5mile Turn R at this point and follow the wide straight track steadily downhill, go straight on at the first crossroads, and at the second junction with the 5.2m height warning signs on the RHS, follow the track slightly L; do NOT take the immediate L turn at this point. Stay on this path until there is a telegraph pole in front of you and here go R on a narrow path into the wood. Remain on this path as it winds its way parallel to the southern boundary of the wood. At any point where the path divides take the L fork.

2.3km/1.4miles On reaching Bunkers Hill, the road connecting Denmead with Southwick, take great care as fast-moving traffic moves along this road. After crossing the road go L (do not enter the wood by the path opposite), obviously keep well off the road on the narrow verge and after about 40m go around the gate on the RHS; continue along the FP through the woods. This wide path eventually crosses two narrow bridges before

exiting the woodland. At this point go slightly R heading for the handrail that protrudes over another bridge. After crossing the latter aim for the top RH corner of the field (one o'clock.)

2.9km/1.8miles Bearing R between two trees walk parallel to the hedge that runs along the LHS and further on go to the R of the

hedge that seems to divide the field. After passing to the R of a wooden gate a short distance ahead, you soon come to the end of the FP where there is access Beckless Lane through a kissing gate. At this point you will find yourself opposite a property known as The Old Stables. Turn R, then continue along the lane as far as the western entry point to Creech Wood which is on the RHS, a distance of 400m/436yards.

3.75 km/2.3 miles Turn R into the west end entrance of Creech Wood and after 100m, fork R along the main track and continue for 0.7 km/0.4 mile. At this next junction take the L fork and after a further 0.9 km/0.56 mile mile you will hear the

traffic. Again, take the L fork on a path that leads to the pedestrian gate through which you exit the woods. Great care is again needed when crossing this busy road.

5.6km/3.5miles Continue along the path into the east side of the woods then turn L through the car park. Slightly further on bear R on a narrow path close to the vehicular entry gate and retrace your steps out of the woods thereafter continuing down Bunkers Hill back to the Harvest Home pub.

Ally Chatterley, Operations Manager at Citizens Advice Winchester District gives some top tips on buying a second-hand car.

**Q** I need a new car but can't afford to buy a new one, so I've been looking at second-hand options. I've heard so many horror stories about people buying cars that turn out to be faulty. I'm worried that I won't know what to check, especially as I know very little about cars. How can I make sure I don't buy a dud car?

A For many people, buying a car is a major purchase and whether it's new or second-hand, the process can seem daunting and complicated. But don't worry, there's lots of information on the steps to take when buying a car and what you can do afterwards if something goes wrong on the Citizens Advice website.

First, where are you going to buy the car? If you're buying from a trader, choose a trustworthy one with an established name with a good reputation. Ideally, they will be part of a trade association or follow the industry's code of practice. If you're buying via an auction, this is much riskier as you'll have fewer legal protections like the right to returns or refunds so carefully read the terms and conditions before you bid.

If you buy from a private seller, there's a few extra steps to take. For instance, try to inspect the car at their home address so if something goes wrong later, you have a record of that. Make sure the car's details are correct by using the DVLA's free online vehicle information checker. You'll need the registration number, MOT test number, mileage and make/model of the car to do this check.

Also, check the car's MOT history for free on gov.uk. Keep a copy of both these results (take a screenshot or download the information) as well as the original advert or description of the car. You might also consider getting a private history check to see if the car's been reported stolen, still has money owing on it, or has been in a serious crash. This will cost about  $\pounds 20$ .

Before buying a car, it's good to check if it meets emissions standards as it could mean paying extra charges when driving through London's ULEZ or clean air zones across the UK.

Inspecting the car is crucial before buying. Ideally, do this during the day when it's not raining (scratches are harder to see on a wet car) and take it for a test drive for at least 15 minutes and on different types of roads, if possible.

Check you have the appropriate insurance for a test drive (either your own or the seller's policy might cover you). Once you've decided on a car, don't be afraid to negotiate on the price. If you take out a loan or finance to buy it, make sure you can afford the repayments over the lifetime

#### HCC Tackles Teen Vaping

HCC Public Health has written to families of children in secondary schools about vaping and vape products highlighting the risks and the support available. It is also renewing its smoking and vaping prevention programmes with schools and developing education and awareness schemes to encourage behaviour change and reduce uptake. Additionally, its Trading Standards team will carry out enforcement operations to deter underage sales of vapes and tackle illegal vapes. Nationally, the proportion of children experimenting with vaping has grown from 7.7% in 2022 to 11.6% in 2023. In total. 20.5% of children have tried vaping, up from 15.8% in 2022 and 13.9% in 2020.

A recent survey across secondary schools and colleges in Hampshire shows a large increase in young people experimenting with vapes. It shows that youth experimentation with vapes increases from 4% in Year 7 to 53% in Year 13. Similarly, vape use increases from 7% in Year 10, to 18% in Year 13.

The Local Government Association (LGA), which represents councils in England and Wales, has called on the Government to ban the sale and manufacture of single use vapes by 2024. With the EU proposing a ban in 2026 and France rolling out a ban in December this year, the LGA has flagged the potential risk of vapes flooding the UK when these other markets close. Members of the public can report illegal vapes and underage vape sales to Hampshire Trading Standards –

#### Pan Hampshire Deal

The once-in-a-generation plans to potentially secure new powers and investment of  $\pounds$ 1.14 billion to the region from a Pan-Hampshire County Deal, which included Portsmouth City Council, Southampton City Council and Isle of Wight Council, are now in question after unitary councils withdrew from planned discussions with Government. This now means that it is unlikely a devolution deal can be taken forward for Hampshire, which is a huge blow in terms of lost opportunity for residents and the extra powers, funding and investment that could have come to our communities in the years ahead.

#### **District Council News**

Cllr Read and I met with Cllr Jackie Porter (Portfolio Holder for Built Environment), and Winchester City Council (WCC) Planning Officers on Thursday 31st August to discuss the housing allocation for Denmead.

WCC have allocated a further 100 homes to be built in Denmead for the Local Plan period to 2039. They have advised that no 'green field' land will be used before 2030, and, as Denmead has little 'brownfield land', that would mean no further developments (such as Carpenters Field) before 2030. Green field is our countryside and brown field is land that has previously been built on.

As requested by The Parish Council, we presented that Denmead had already had an additional 98 dwellings (outside of The Neighbourhood Plan) created at Parklands as office to residential conversions and therefore our allocation should be zero. The Officers advised that because this development had already happened, the Planning Inspector would not allow the Parklands conversions to count towards Denmeads' allocation, despite advising us previously that it would!

With the agreement of The Parish Council and The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group I suggested that WCC should adjust the figures for Denmead to reflect what has been developed at Parklands and also any new allocation so that an honest and transparent development figure is stated.

WCC have agreed to rework the numbers and we will meet again in a couple of weeks time to discuss the matter further. Whilst we do appreciate that new homes are needed we need to be sure that Denmead is not being burdened unfairly compared to other settlements of our size and facilities!
