Denmead Walks

This is a route that can start from anywhere in the village however directions are from Denmead Community Centre. Initially it heads toward Hambledon where great views can be seen toward Bury Lodge. It continues along several different

WALK DETAILS

footpaths and lanes eventually passing the large Kellanne Stud off Hoe Street. The return leg is through woodland, along a short stretch of the Fareham Road and finishes at the village end of School Lane.

Leave Denmead Community Centre car park (CP) by the main entrance, turn R and head up School Lane. Bear R into Thompsons Lane and at the top of this road pick up the footpath (FP) on the other side of Uplands Road, to the left of 'Wimborne'. Emerging from this narrow FP, cut diagonally to the R across the field then keeping to the path alongside the hedge continue to the far end. After passing through the gap in the hedge go diagonally L on the FP across the field before dropping downhill through a narrow copse while aiming for the metal gate which borders the B2150

road into Hambledon.



View from footpath toward Bury Lodge

2km/I.25miles A short distance from the gate bear L toward the electricity pylon going slightly downhill before passing through the first of three gates. A narrow plank acts as a bridge across a stream that is fast-moving after heavy rain and during the winter months. After passing through a third gate take care crossing the Fareham Road before heading up through the fields opposite passing through a further three gates. It is possible a temporary electric fence will be in place after the second gate. If this is the case, simply unhook it then replace after passing through.

After the third gate which borders Madam's Copse, follow the FP through the woods to Menslands Lane and on reaching the metalled surface go L then almost immediately R over a stile before heading through Glebelands Farm.

2.7km/1.7miles Follow the well-marked FP toward a line of trees after which

continue in the same direction and soon the path skirts around the perimeter of Shepherds Copse which is on the LHS. Just after passing a former marl pit at the end of the woods cross a stile before heading obliquely R across a small field.

Cross another stile before walking through a narrow stretch of woodland and a metal gate soon appears on the RHS. After passing through the latter walk downhill keeping the fence on your RHS (see Fig 2) At the bottom of the hill with Hole Farm on the RHS, turn L and head along Hole Lane passing through two further gates. After the second gate which leads into Haben Lane, bear R then walk the short distance to the junction with Hoe Street.

4km/2.5miles Bear L at this point heading down hill

passing a series of properties including the newly built Silk's Repose eco house and Hoegate Farm. Exactly 200m after passing the latter turn L onto a woodland path that leads around the boundary of Rudley Mill grounds.

5.25km/3.3miles On reaching Bent Lane continue straight across into further woodland and after approximately 80m bear L at the junction of paths. Stay on the same finally leaving the woods and bearing R along a FP that runs alongside woodland on your RHS. Two stiles need to be crossed at the end of the

field, the second of which gives access to the potentially dangerous Fareham Road. Listen carefully for traffic before bearing L and crossing the road. Pass the entrance to Willow Fisheries just after which go R up Dirty Lane.

6.45 km/4 miles At the crossroads turn R into School Lane in the direction of Denmead

and continue uphill passing the Fox & Hounds pub at the summit of the hill. Remain in the same direction and Denmead Community Centre is at the eastern end of School Lane just before the B2150 road that runs between Denmead and Hambledon.

Green Meadows Care Home

The County Council is to launch a public consultation on 4th September 2023 on proposals that would see some £173 million invested over the next five to six years to transform and expand the future of nursing and specialist care accommodation directly provided by HCC for the county's growing older population. The consultation will run for 10 weeks, closing on 12th November 2023.

Over the next 8 years we expect to see the number of Hampshire residents aged over 85 years, increase by 22% - an extra 62,000 people.

The proposals put forward recommend concentrating on the delivery of specialist nursing care, complex dementia care and short-

term support – to either prevent a hospital admission or support a hospital discharge. This would not only meet the needs of a growing number of older people in Hampshire in the longer term but would be care that could

be provided more cost effectively by the Local Authority.

Specifically, the proposals to be consulted on include:

- Building three brand new nursing homes Oak Park in Havant, Cornerways in Winchester, and a site in the New Forest (location to be determined)
- Significantly modernising and expanding care at three existing County Council homes – Oakridge in Basingstoke, Ticehurst in Aldershot and Emsworth in Havant.
- Withdrawing, over time, from the direct provision of standard residential care, with:
- the permanent closure of two residential

care homes, temporarily closed since 2021 -Copper Beeches in Andover and Cranleigh Paddock in Lyndhurst

- the closure of three existing residential care homes at Bishops Waltham House, Solent Mead in Lymington, and Green Meadows in Denmead
- the closure of two further homes in the longer term (not before the end of 2026) Westholme in Winchester and Malmesbury Lawn in Havant, with the services seamlessly moving to the new local facilities at Cornerways and Oak Park at the point that they are operational
- the ending of standard residential care services at Oakridge, Ticehurst and Emsworth (not before the Autumn 2025 at the earliest).

The County Council's seven remaining nursing and short term 'step-down from hospital' care homes will remain in operation. Any changes would be phased over time and would help to increase the overall number of directly provided Local Authority

beds to around 1,000 from the current position of just over 900 beds.

Findings from the formal public consultation process will be considered by the Health and Adult Social Care Select Committee in January 2024 prior to the Executive Lead Member for Adult Social Care and Public Health taking any formal decisions, on the specific proposals, no earlier than February 2024.

Annually, the County Council sources care home places for around 1,600 clients, more than three quarters of whom go into private care homes. The investment proposals would enable a similar ratio of care provision to be maintained.

If you are aged between 40 and 74 years and have not already been diagnosed with heart disease, diabetes, kidney disease, stroke



high blood pressure, you may be eligible for a health check. If you are eligible you will receive an invitation letter from your GP around your 40th, 45th, 50th, 55th, 60th, 65th and 70th birthdays. If you think you are eligible but have not had an invitation letter, you can contact your GP to request an NHS Health Check. While the NHS Health Check programme is for people aged 40 to 74 years, anyone aged 75 or over can request a general health review consultation from their practice if they have not had one within the last 12 months.

District Council Update

Winchester Local Plan

Over the past two years the City Council have been preparing the rollout of the Local Plan which will have a major effect on the whole district. Potential development sites have been identified and published by the city council (document Reg 18) – the precursor to the final draft plan (Reg 19) showing probable sites which will go forward to form the next 15 year land availability in the district.

At a meeting of the WCC Local Plan committee on 10th August, Cllr Mike Read (a non-voting member), was concerned at the timeline for the document. The original timeline (July 2021 to August 2024) did not allow for the varied work that had to be carried out, Councillor Read challenged the Administration on this and was on a number of occasions and was repeatedly informed that the timeline was correct. Now however the administration is asking to republish its final document some 14 months later. This could put Winchester in a very difficult position as 2025 (proposed new adoption date) would be outside the said time zone by one year and could prevent the proposed plan from meeting the requirements of development in the Winchester District.

Denmead on the other hand is the only Parish in the district that is preparing its entry as it did for the current Plan. The PC have been working with the Community and Winchester

Officers to ensure it is in line with government policies.

The Parish Council recently met with Winchester City Council (WCC) officers and discussed at length the housing allocation for Denmead in the proposed update of the Local Plan. Winchester require Denmead, like the other larger settlements, to take an additional 100 dwellings in the updated Neighbourhood Plan and say that there will be NO greenfield development in the district before 2030, so the additional 100 for Denmead will come after the end of the current plan. Green-field development i.e., that on currently designated Countryside is the only option in Denmead as there are no 'Brownfield' sites large enough to accommodate 100 dwellings.

The Parish have in writing from WCC that all current and future dwellings in Parklands (which are the result of office conversions to dwellings) would be counted towards any allocation for Denmead. There have been 98 built out. But they are now saying that they can't count those, so we need a further 100 dwellings.

Both District and Parish Councillors' position remains that we have already received 100 additional dwellings and therefore if they require an additional 100 from Denmead then they should correctly record our allocation as 200, with 100 already supplied. They declined this idea as this would show that Denmead has been


allocated more than other parishes!

Your three WCC Councillors are continuing to defend the position in asking for meetings with Senior Councillors and Staff.

If you would like to discuss this or any topic further, we would welcome you to visit us at a Local Government Surgery. Surgeries are held on the first Saturday of each month from 10am to 12 noon in the Heath Room, All Saints Church. No appointment is required. There will also be a roaming van in the Newlands Community Centre area from around 11.15am for one hour.


