Afternoon W.I. reads Churchill's Letters

After the August break the Afternoon W.I. was delighted to welcome six new visitors to its September meeting along with John Richards to learn about the Life of Winston Churchill seen through letters to his mother and wife.

Churchill was a prolific writer – exchanging over I,000 letters with his mother and I,700 with his wife. His letters span the period from the age of seven when he was on holiday at Ventnor on the Isle of Wight to his death. His letters to his mother were from the boarding schools he attended and often included a request for a food hamper or a sum of money!

He met his wife, Clementine, at a ball in 1904 and they married in September 1907. As was the custom in those days they had separate bedrooms and still wrote to each other every night.



The monthly competition for a small vase of wild flowers was won by Angela MacNee and the flower competition by Joan Downing, with Angela MacNee second. This month the group is looking forward to a visit from Julian Le Good when he will give a talk entitled "A Portrait of the Architect as a Young Man" and the competition will be for a picture or photo of a favourite building.

Scouting for All: Isaac's Journey to Volunteer

As Scouts, we want our young people and adult volunteers to be just like the places we serve - full of amazing, interesting and diverse people from all corners of our community. It doesn't happen overnight and takes effort to find and connect with those people who may not see Scouts as being where they fit in.



So many Scout volunteers work hard, often behind the scenes, to make Scouting more welcoming to more people. For one new volunteer, this effort has paid off.

Meet Isaac, who starts this new term as a new volunteer as part of the Beaver Leader team at 1st Denmead Scouts. Like so many new volunteers, Isaac enjoys volunteering, has prepared for the role and the 6-8 year old Beavers see him as a fun leader.

What our young people don't notice, but others might, is that Isaac has Down Syndrome.

While he may have been born with an extra chromosome, Isaac knows what he likes and since the age of six, the skills for life that the Scouts brings has been a part of his life.

Tracy is the Lead Volunteer at 1st Denmead:

"Isaac is no stranger to Scouting as he started as a Beaver Scout with Ist Denmead as a happy 6 year old and continued his Scouting journey through to Scouts. After leaving Scouts he would pop in on occasion with his Beaver Leader Dad and help out.

"Once Isaac turned 18 years old, he approached me about volunteering with us. After careful consideration of both Isaac's needs and the needs of the Group, I decided to grab this opportunity with both hands."

At the Scouts, we live by our values and respect and support for others has been shining throughout Isaac's story. Together, the Scouts are committed to representing our communities and giving our young people positive role models to help them learn skills for life. But that aim is really hard to do if we, as Scouting volunteers, don't reflect society.

It's also true that nationally there are over 100,000 young people who want to join Scouting, but are stuck on waiting lists (2024 census). We need more volunteers if we want to offer them the skills for life that Scouting brings and which can change lives for the better.

"I was really pleased and excited when Dad told me I could be Twig [Isaac's Scout name] again". I really enjoy playing the games with the Beavers and also helping Oak [Dad, Chris] and Acorn with the activities. We especially like going outside."

Isaac's story shows us how playing an active role in the Scouts as a young person has helped him in life, and now he is ready to give back to the next generation, prepared with the skills to lead and inspire himself.



It's also the power of bravery of others to believe in him and to see the bigger picture of how this benefits our young people and society as a whole.

"Isaac brings his infectious appetite for Scouting to life each week, helping and supporting our young people in any way he can. He is amazing with the Beavers and they think he is great. Having Isaac in the Group has shown how truly inclusive we are, how we can adapt to meet the needs of our youth members and the needs of our volunteers. It has shown that as a Group we embrace flexible volunteering and offer support when necessary so our volunteers can complete their training."

Because our Scout volunteers come from all walks of life, it's right that we are flexible to their needs and find a role that suits any potential volunteer. Isaac was successfully supported by his dad, Chris, who also volunteers within the Beaver team to make sure that he understood every step of the volunteering process and was ready.

While there is much to celebrate about the Scout movement and the many volunteers who play their part, there is still much to do. While many adults who knew Isaac were confident he'd make a great



volunteer, there were still some who were cautious and wanted Isaac to prove himself before he started volunteering which is not how the volunteering journey usually unrolls. The grit and determination Isaac showed in proving the doubters wrong only adds to his credit.

"It is great to see Isaac develop in confidence and an absolute pleasure to see the Beavers learn that everyone can make a positive impact in Scouting and in the wider community.

We are lucky to have him."

Ally Chatterley, Operations Manager at Citizens Advice Winchester District gives advice on changes to the Winter Fuel Payment, and how to access it.



Q I'm a pensioner and am really worried about how I'm going to pay my energy bills this winter, especially now the Winter Fuel Payment is only going to people on certain benefits. I don't currently receive any benefits, but my income is limited and I'm wondering if there's anything I can do.

A Previously the Winter Fuel Payment, which is worth up to £300, has been given to all pensioners regardless of income. However, this winter you'll now only get the payment if you or your partner get certain benefits, including Pension Credit.

Pension Credit is one of the most underclaimed benefits there is – in Hampshire alone an estimated £2.5million of Pension Credit goes unclaimed each year. If you're of pension age and on a low income, then it's worth applying for Pension Credit even if you don't receive any other benefits.

If your application for Pension Credit is successful, then as well as receiving a monthly boost to your income, you'll also be able to access other support including making a claim for the Winter Fuel Payment.

You have until the 21 December to apply for Pension Credit and still receive the Winter Fuel Payment if successful. To find out more about the eligibility for Pension Credit and how to apply you can go to the national Citizens Advice website:

Denmead Walks

This is one of the shortest in the series of walks and should take about an hour. It is ideal for a pleasant evening stroll from Kidmore Lane car park heading toward Sawyers Hill before bearing left off the green lane and dropping down a steep field into Pithill before returning to the village along Wayfarers Walk footpath. For the more energetic an extension to the main route is on offer that will add between 20 to 30 minutes onto the walk.

WALK DETAILS:
Distance 4.3km /2.7 miles
Time Ih
Stiles 3
Walk Grade 2/5
Extension: 5.8km/3.6 miles
Time Ih 20m
Stiles 5

Leaving Kidmore Lane car park go R up the lane then turn R into Tanners Lane. At the end of Tanners Lane bear L going steadily up White Horse Lane passing several dwellings including Little Denmead Farm.

I.33km/0.83mile On reaching the Sawyers Hill junction at the end of White Horse Lane, cross the road and continue on the uneven surface of this green lane. (NBThe Public entrance to the green lane is very muddy, can be impassable after rain and is particularly bad during the winter months.)

I.55km/0.97mile Part way up the lane go L over a stile, but before doing so take note of the footpath direction from the yellow sign adjacent to the stile. If in doubt head slightly to the right of the electricity pylon ahead which will take you toward a second stile on the other side of the field. Cross this second stile and pause to enjoy the view before walking carefully down the steep field into the hamlet of Pithill. After going over this latest stile turn R then go L at the junction heading back to Denmead along



Harrowgate Lane. Nearing the end of this lane the route joins Wayfarers Walk as the gate on the R is passed.

Extension to walk (adds 1.5km/0.9mile to main route)

If you wish to extend your walk turn R at the Harrowgate and Mayfield Lane junction and head uphill as far as Rookwood Cottage. Here turn L and continue as far as Forest Gate at the main road. Take care crossing the road before bearing L and heading back toward Denmead. Partway down the hill, opposite Lincoln Green Nurseries, cross the road onto a FP and walk 200m/2 I 8yards before coming to a stile.

At this point it is possible to go via the official FP by crossing the stile and heading




Official footpath leading from footpath adjacent to Lincoln Green nurseries to Wayfarers Walk

down the field to another stile and shortly after meeting the WW FP, whereupon go through the gate. An alternative permissive path runs through the woodland parallel to the official FP.

2.62km/1.63miles A little further on turn L at the junction of Harrowgate Lane and Maysfield Lane then go R after 20m passing through a gate. Stay on Wayfarers Walk footpath as far as the next gate before continuing in the same direction.

3.8km/ 2.4miles The footpath eventually bears L then R before passing the west boundary of the cemetery. With the high garden fence/hedge in front, turn L and head back along Cemetery Lane turning R at the junction with Kidmore Lane. The CP is a short distance along the lane on the LHS.

HCC plans for a Smokefree Hampshire

Smokefree Hampshire

With ambitious plans to increase the number of Hampshire smokers quitting each year by 2030 from the current 3,500, Hampshire County Council has signed a new pledge to take more action to reduce harm caused by smoking.

Smoking is the single biggest preventable cause of ill health and premature death in England, costing the taxpayer millions and placing a huge burden on the NHS and social care. Helping people to quit is vital and one of HCC's key legal responsibilities.

In 2022, it was estimated that 10.5% of adults living in Hampshire smoked and around 4,500 residents die due to smoking each year, with a further 8,600 admitted to hospital.

The Council's action plan includes working with local GPs, hospitals, social housing and adult social care providers, as well as the voluntary and community sector to boost referrals into the county's free quit smoking service - <u>Smokefree Hampshire</u> as well as outreach work to engage those who do not seek help from formal quit-with-support services. Going forward, there will also be greater support for pregnant mums, children and young people to quit electronic cigarettes (vapes) via a free service working through schools and colleges, building on current work to create smokefree sites and provide resources for teachers, parents and carers.

Prestigious Green Flag Awards

Visitors to HCC's five country parks are guaranteed a quality day out thanks to the parks being, once again, given Green Flag awards for 2024. Lepe, River Hamble, Royal Victoria, Queen Elizabeth and Staunton Country Parks have all regained Green Flag status for their excellent facilities and outdoor spaces. Staunton and Royal Victoria have again won Green Heritage Accreditation for the

management of the sites' unique historic features – with Lepe securing the heritage accolade this year for the first time.



Increase in Annual Road Repairs

An unprecedented number of potholes and road defects have been fixed between April 2023 to April 2024, according to the latest figures from HCC, with 180,909 repairs delivered - a 37% increase. A year ago, HCC allocated an additional £22.5 million to tackle the issue.

With unprecedented volumes of reported potholes, Hampshire is not alone in facing the challenge of keeping roads in a good condition. The impact of colder, wetter winters takes a heavy toll and higher costs due to inflation mean that the Council must make its budget stretch further so it now costs the taxpayer around 44% more to repair a pothole.

Tap into solar power to save on bills and tackle climate change

An opportunity for Hampshire residents to benefit from competitively priced, high-quality solar panel installation and save on future energy bills is once again available through the 2024 Solar Together scheme.

The solar energy group-buying scheme, offered by independent experts iChoosr, enables residents to invest in solar panels fitted by pre-vetted installers, to reduce reliance on the national grid and lower energy bills, as well as boost local renewable energy generation.

Through Solar Together, over 28,400 solar panels have already been installed in Hampshire – it's estimated these installations will reduce carbon emissions by 59,205 tonnes over 25 years – equivalent to taking 32,600 cars off the road during the same period.
