I must ask.... did you remember that the clocks changed on Sunday 31st March? I have such mixed emotions about it, firstly that I lose an hour of very precious sleep!

This year the clocks changed during the early hours of Easter Sunday, making our Easter sunrise service on the green exceptionally early in the morning. However, the sunrise service never ceases to delight my soul as we come together as a community to celebrate the risen Christ. It's easy to forget when we are mourning the loss of an hour's sleep that the clocks changing herald the joyous revelation that our evenings will soon become lighter and lighter, and we will no longer feel the need to huddle indoors, sat in our pjs in the warm, but can enjoy the beauty of creation in the warm evening sunshine.



I love the season of Spring, it is a beautiful time of year when the winter weather subsides, and the flowers begin to bloom. It brings with it new hope, colour, and joy. Everywhere that we look there are new signs of life all around us. Snowdrops, narcissi, crocuses, and daffodils wave to us in the sunshine, buds and blossom appear on the trees, the grass starts to look green once more (and if your grass is anything like mine hopefully will no longer be a patch of muddy bog!)

Metaphorically speaking, spring reminds us that even after a hard season, something brighter, better, and more beautiful can bloom as a result. Regardless of what season happens to be your favourite, the first signs of spring can bring a sense of hope, rejuvenation, and fresh feelings.

As a Christian, spring is a reminder to us that God is all about making things new. In fact, Jesus promised to make everything new one day.

And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new. Also, he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.' (Revelation 21:5).

While each season proclaims God's faithfulness in its arrival and unique characteristics, spring showcases the Creator's faithfulness most extravagantly. Spring demonstrates of life after death, as we watch year after year life emerge from the depths of dark earth, bare branches, and broken seeds.

This is highlighted as we celebrate the life, death and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ throughout Lent and Holy Week. Pondering the reality of the resurrection's place in the season of spring, I wonder at God's design in spring's

During this time of year for Christians it is an opportunity for us to be refreshed and restored, both in our lives and in our faith. As we shake off that winter chill, it is an opportunity to start a new positive habit or perhaps recommitting to our prayer life. This year I have found the Lectio 365 app a good way to start and finish my day. It reminds me to look for the things that bring me joy in my life and makes me acknowledge the things that I struggle with and need to think about.



This Spring has brought a new arrival in the Langdown household that personifies the joy that new life and change can bring. He is full of excitement at the simplest of things, as the world opens to him every day, bringing new experiences and revelations. Who knew that an empty box could be so exciting. (I won't lie, it has also brought us sleepless nights, puddles to avoid on the kitchen floor and a necessity to be tidy!)

It seems a little unfair to label him a new habit we have all started in our household, but he is; whatever the weather, he encourages us (okay insists) that we venture out and delight in the rising and setting of the sun each day and have plenty of opportunity to delight in the beauty of nature around us.



This Spring I encourage you to think about what you can change to bring something positive and joyful in your life, it might be the courage to go and meet new people, to start a new hobby, to sort the box of stuff that is perpetually ignored living in the corner of the room, to reconnect with Jesus. Whatever you decided to do remember, be strong and courageous, for the Lord our God is always with us.

Denmead Horticultural Society

In February we attended the Hampshire Federation of Horticultural Societies Federation Day and AGM at Sparsholt College. In the morning there were talks from Rosy Hardy of Hardys Cottage Garden Plants and Kelvin Mason on organising a show and steward's duties. In the afternoon we took part in the quiz and were delighted to come second and win the Don Bishop trophy.

Our March meeting was a Gardeners' Questions evening with a panel made up of three of our committee assisted by horticultural author and journalist Martyn Cox. Questions covered a wide range of topics including growing tomatoes, supporting beans and climbers, essential tools, companion planting, how to keep an amaryllis to flower again, pruning raspberries, moss on paths and a non-flowering wisteria. We also had a seed share table which was popular, and we will continue this at future meetings.

On Tuesday 2nd April our speaker is Andy McIndoe, and his subject is 'Permanent and Seasonal Planting for Pots and Containers'. During his long career with Hillier Nurseries Andy was responsible for the development of the Company's chain of garden centres and for 25 consecutive Gold Medal winning exhibits at RHS Chelsea Flower Show. He has written several books including The Creative Shrub Garden and his talk will suggest shrubs, perennials, bulbs, and seasonal plants to make the most of pots and containers around your garden. Looking ahead to 7th May Nicki Gibbons talk is 'Grow Your Own Cut Flowers'. Both talks will be at 7.30pm in the Church Hall.

Our Spring Show (see page 14) on Saturday 6th April opens at 1pm in the Church Hall. The schedule is on our website and paper copies are in Parkers – the deadline for entries is Wed 3rd. Do see what you could enter - there is something for everyone with classes for handicrafts, cookery, photography, and floral art as well as flowers, vegetables and junior classes. Do visit the show in the afternoon and stay to enjoy a cup of tea with home made cake and perhaps win a prize on the tombola – hope to see you there.

Ally Chatterley, Operations Manager at Citizens Advice Winchester District gives advice on council tax reductions.



Q *My council tax bill is coming out soon and I am dreading opening it as it always goes up. My income has stayed the same but everything else is more expensive and I have hardly anything left over - how will I cope if my payments keep going up?*

A Many of us are feeling overwhelmed as we see our basic bills and essential costs go up. You're not alone in finding things difficult and, crucially, there's support available.

First off, council tax discounts are available to some people depending on your circumstances. For instance, if you're the only adult in your home, you should get a 25% discount on your council tax bill.

When working out how many people live in a property, some people aren't counted - they're called 'disregarded people' and include under 18s, a student nurse or someone on an apprenticeship scheme and many more. If everyone who lives in the property is disregarded, you will still receive a council tax bill, but it will have a 50% discount. However, if everyone in your home is a student or severely mentally impaired, you won't pay any council tax.

Additionally, if someone has moved out, tell the council as this might change your eligibility. If you are entitled to a discount as a result, it will be valid from the date when the person moved out, even if you told the council after the event, and the reduction may be backdated.

You mention that your income hasn't

increased. If you are on a low income, you might also be able to get your council tax reduced. Your local council will ask you details about your income and your circumstances, so they can work out if you're entitled to a council tax reduction. They will then calculate your new bill and tell you how much council tax you need to pay.

You may also be eligible for additional support if you've reached State Pension age, though the 'working age rule' will still apply if you or your partner receive certain benefits including:

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Income Support

Even if none of the reduction criteria applies to you, your local council can still reduce your council tax bill or cancel it altogether; this is called 'discretionary reduction'. They'll normally only do this if you can show that you're suffering severe hardship and can't afford to pay council tax.

We know that times are incredibly tough and council tax is a priority bill so it's important to keep in contact with your council if you can't keep up payments.



Denmead Walks

WALK DETAILS
Length 10.4km/6.5miles
Time 2h 45m
Stiles 1
Walk Grade 3/5

This is a fairly long walk but there are no steep inclines. Starting at the Harvest Home it first heads west through Creech Woods before bearing south on Beckford Lane then south-east in the direction of Southwick. After passing through woodland either side of the Denmead-Southwick road some of which forms part of the Southwick Estate, the route continues past the solar farm, along Belney Lane and the golf course, before the final leg passes through the east side of Creech Woods. The best time to tackle this route is when the bluebells are out in Assells Copse.

Turn R from the Harvest Home car park, cross the roundabout and head up Bunkers Hill in the direction of Southwick. At the 40mph sign cross the road with care before entering the west sector of Creech Woods on a winding, narrow path that leads to the main wide track. On leaving the narrow path go R and stay on the main track as far as Beckford Lane at the end of the woodland.

2.2km/1 mile Here go L and continue for 800m/872yards passing FP finger posts both on the L and R. As Beckford Lane bends to the right, go L onto the track leading to Beckford Green Farm. Stay on this gravel track for just under 300m/327yards until a gate appears ahead just as the lane veers L.

3.5km/2.2miles Pass through the space to the side of the gate, cross a field, then go through another gate into a larger second field at the same time walking almost parallel to Goldsmith's Copse on the RHS. At the end of the second field go into a third and bear slightly L toward the gate ahead. Follow the footpath direction sign slightly to the R keeping to the lower path through the sloping meadow with the stream on

your R. (NB This meadow floods in wet weather so it may be necessary to cross this meadow further up the slope.)

4.3km/2.7miles Eventually enter Assells Coppice then follow the distinct path for some distance, finally crossing a plank/bridge just before emerging from the wood. Go L following the path toward Denmead Lane, the road that connects Denmead and Southwick.

4.9km/3.1miles After passing through the gate cross the lane with care then head along the footpath opposite keeping the brick boundary wall on the R. Near the end of the wall bear slightly L and cross the narrow ditch farther up on the LHS to avoid the mud near the wall. Cross the ditch to enter Place Wood before going L and continuing uphill on a well-marked path. Go straight on at the two crossways - yellow direction signs may be in place.

6.1km/3.8miles On exiting the wood go L around the perimeter of the field turning R on reaching the left-hand corner. At the top of the field the path comes out onto a farm track. Here pause for a moment to admire the view toward the top of Portsdown Hill on the RHS.

Turn L then pick up the FP that runs parallel and to the R of farm track but at a slightly lower level. Remain on the path but where the farm track is in front, turn R into a field which is at the boundary of a section of Southwick Solar Farm. Keeping the hedge on the LHS continue past the solar panels.

6.9km/4.3miles At the end of the field cross the only stile on this walk, bear R around the barn and follow the long farm track as far as Belney Lane, a distance over around 400m/436yards. Go L and remain on this lane as far as Three Ways junction with Sheepwash Lane.

8km/5 miles At the next junction go L into Furzeley Road, then, a short distance beyond the entrance to the west side of the golf course, take a L turn onto the FP into Creech Wood. Stay on the path continuing in a straight line as far as the car park (CP) at the other end of the wood. Go R here, cross the CP then take the FP to the R about 30m before the entrance gate. Emerging onto Bunkers Hill bear R and head back to the starting point at the Harvest Home.

The Afternoon W.I. Carve Her Name With Pride

In March the Afternoon W.I. welcomed Lt Col Jeremy Prescott who gave a most interesting talk about Violette Szabo, one of only four women to receive the George Cross, many may remember her story from the film *Carve Her Name with Pride*.

Born in Paris on 26th June 1921 of Anglo-French parents, Violette moved to England as a child. She met her husband Etienne in 1940 when her parents asked her to bring a soldier home for lunch at the end of the Commemoration parade by the French Army, they married after only a few weeks and their daughter Tania was born on 8th June 1942. Etienne was deployed to North Africa where he was killed by German forces and, wanting to avenge his death, Violette joined the SOE (Special Operations Executive) F Section which operated in France. She was captured and sent to Ravensbruck Concentration Camp where she was executed and was awarded a posthumous George Cross on 28th January 1947, presented to her daughter.

At the meeting the ladies enjoyed delicious chocolate cupcakes made by Lily and Lime. The competition for a Family Heirloom was won by Helen Dore-Dennis with Joan Downing second. Sue Packham's flower was voted first with Angela MacNee second.

This month John Richards will be speaking about the Winchester Talking Newspaper.

Future events include the Group Round of the County Quiz which the Denmead group is hosting.



HCC Report

From School Places to Potholes

First Preference Secondary School in Hampshire

More than 98% of parents in Hampshire (14,312) have been offered a place for their child at one of their three preferences for September 2024. Of those who applied for a Year 7 place by the deadline, 90.71% (13,232) have been offered a place at their first preference. Hampshire County Council received 14,587 on-time applications – a decrease of 306 compared with the number received for places in September 2023. For those parents and carers who have not secured a place at one of their preferred secondary schools this year, please visit the website for advice <https://www.hants.gov.uk/educationandlearning/admissions>

Pupils who did not secure a place at one of their preferences have been allocated a place at their catchment school or the next nearest school with a place available. Parents have the right to appeal against any refusal in these situations and their child's name will be added to the waiting list for their preferred schools.

Parents who applied online have been notified of their offers by email. They can also view their offer by logging into the secure, online portal using the same log-in details provided when making their online application. Those parents who applied on paper have been notified by email if they provided an email address or by post where no email address was provided and should receive their letters in two to three days.

FAQs to help with parents' queries has been published on the Admissions webpage - <https://www.hants.gov.uk/educationandlearning/admissions/year-seven-offer-day-faqs> including information on school transport assistance which may be available where the national eligibility criteria is met (application deadline 31 May).

The Admissions Team is now busy processing main round infant, junior and primary school applications with school place offers due to go out to parents on 16th April 2024.

Budget

£2.6 billion of public spending on the ongoing delivery of important local services to Hampshire's 1.4 million residents in 2024/25 has been approved by HCC. From 1st April 2024, HCC's portion of council tax increased by a total of 4.99%, of which 2% will go specifically towards adults' social care and supporting the County's higher numbers of older people and adults with complex needs and disabilities - in line with Government policy. This equates to an annual charge of £1,533.24 for a Band D property – an increase of £72.99 per year or approximately £1.40 a week. The increase will generate an extra £39 million of vital income towards the delivery of crucial services to the people of Hampshire.

The Council has also approved new capital spending of £880.6 million over the next three years.

Funding Approved to expand Childcare

HCC has approved funding of £5.9 million to help more parents access childcare before and after school. The funding has

been granted by the Department for Education to support schools and Local Authorities to set up or expand the provision of childcare which 'wraps around' the school day, enabling parents and carers of primary school-aged children to access and pay for term time childcare from 8.00am – 6.00pm.

The funding will be allocated from September 2024 over two academic years until April 2026. The expectation is that after this point, settings will be able to run successfully on income from parental fees, without the need for further financial assistance.

Volunteers Plant 950 Trees Creating Mini-Forest

A new woodland has been created in Havant thanks to local volunteers who have planted 950 trees in Havant Rugby Ground - boosting wildlife and biodiversity. A team of around 30 people planted species including oak, beech, field maple, hawthorn, blackthorn, wild cherry and hazel. The project was organised by HCC's Hampshire Forest Partnership.
