Summer beckons...

As we enter June, the summer months beckon. Summer is often a time where we slow down a little; when we try to make the most of the longer, lighter evenings, or we make more of an effort to be outside for a walk or a bike ride, or when many of us will take our holidays. Summer is a time for healthy disengagement from some of life's routine, such as schools and colleges, and of course parliament go into recess. It can of course, still be busy — with children's activities, social events, and family gatherings on top of the usual patterns of work and rest can mean we end up trying to fit in too much!

In the church year, summer is part of a long stretch that we call 'Ordinary Time', beyond the celebrations of Easter, Pentecost, and Trinity, leading us right the way through to Harvest, Remembrance and on into Advent. Ordinary Time is a season in which we mark time, free from significant events, recognising God's presence, love, and truth with us in the ordinariness of our everyday lives. Ordinary time is not dull; rather it provides opportunity for us to reflect and ponder on the vastness of our extraordinary story – and its significance to you and me.

At All Saints, during June and July, we will be focussing on a short series Encountering Christ: the I Am Statements. Beginning on the 2nd June, over seven weeks, we will be considering who Jesus said He was by looking at each of the 'I Am statements' which can be found in John's gospel. From "I am the bread of life" to "I am the true

vine," Jesus reveals himself as the eternal Son of God and leaves no doubt as to His true identity.

The passages are:

John 14: 1-14

John 6: 25-59 I am the Bread of Life
John 8: 12-20 I am the Light of the World
John 10: I-10 I am the Gate
John 10: II-18 I am the Good Shepherd
John II: I7-44 I am the Resurrection and the Life

John 15: I-17 I am the Vine

So, can I encourage you to read each of the passages, to think and pray about them, and join us on a Sunday (either at the 8am or 10am service) as we explore the passages in more detail and find out what they mean for us today.

Denmead Infant & Juniors Schools are hosting an Olympics-themed Summer Fayre bursting with attractions on 15th June including engaging arena performances, two bouncy castles, a trolley dash, delicious hot food and cakes and heaps of games, entertainment and craft stalls.

Held at the Junior School site on Bere Road between 12 – 3pm, visitors from the entire community, ranging from local pre-schools to rest homes, are invited to enjoy rousing musical performances from Denmead Brass, TADAA (The Alternative Dramatic Arts Academy), Claire Louise School of Dance and both school choirs.

Denmead Walks

This is yet another route that can start from anywhere in the village, however directions are from Denmead Community Centre. Initially it passes through Harts Copse before heading along Wayfarers Walk then onto Pithill. Lovely views across the valley can be seen while traversing the path on top of the hill and a further vista is available when walking Sawyers Hill opposite. The return route is via several footpaths including a section of the Denmead Millennium Trail.

WALK DETAILS:

Length: 7.4km/4.6 miles

Time: 2h Stiles: 3

Walk Grade: 3

Leave Denmead Community Centre CP by the main entrance, turn L and walk to the end of School Lane. Bear R toward the village and after 150m take care crossing the main road into Harts Copse. To access the woodland path walk around the RHS fence that is adjacent to the gate.


Stay on the main wide path that runs through the woodland and at the end of the second section go R downhill before continuing along the path bordered by a fence on the RHS. On reaching Wayfarers Walk FP go L through the gate and remain on the path until you pass through another gate onto the lane.

1.5km/0.9mile Here turn L then shortly after bear R into Harrowgate Lane. Stay on the lane but take the L fork at Pithill up the hill. Part way up the incline stay on the lane as it goes through a LH bend.

2.6km/1.6miles At the top of the hill where the lane again goes L, turn R onto a path from which there are wonderful views across the valley. Stay on the path until

a line of trees appears on the RHS and on reaching them turn R downhill. At the end of the tree line follow the well-trodden FP down to Harrowgate Lane and step over a low stile on reaching the junction called Fiveways.

3.3km/2.1 miles After you step over the stile go uphill on the green lane which is diagonally to the R. Continue over Sawyers Hill, but do pause near the summit to enjoy the views back



4.2km/2.6miles After going steadily downhill for some distance go L off the green lane following the FP diagonally to the R across the field and soon come to the lane. Here go L and continue the short distance to Crossways junction.

4.6km/2.9miles Go R around the house then immediately after turn R again heading along another FP across the field.

5.1 km/3.2 miles On reaching White Horse Lane opposite Little Denmead Farm, turn L and walk as far as the junction with Tanners Lane continuing along the latter a short distance until a FP sign is seen on the RHS.

5.5km/3.4miles Go over the stile and follow the direction shown by the finger post diagonally to the L across the field.



5.9km/3.7miles Go over

another stile on reaching Kidmore Lane, turn R, then almost immediately L through a gate. Continue along the RHS parallel to the hedge before bearing L with the FP as far as the sprung electric fences. Carefully unhook then replace the two sprung fences before remaining in the same direction and eventually dropping downhill and crossing a stile onto Wayfarers Walk.etween two fenced off fields. On reaching the end of the fencing go L along the farm track keeping the perimeter of the wood on your RHS. After initially passing a former marl pit continue further until a path appears into the woodland; access the wood through the same and follow the winding path initially to the L which eventually leads to the main path that bisects Harts Copse. Turn L on coming to this main path and walk the short distance downhill to the gate, walk around the same on the LHS and take care crossing the busy B2150 retracing your steps back to the starting point at Denmead Community Centre.

Hampshire County Council - Schools, Roads, Buildings & Grants

Primary School Places

Hampshire County Council has processed more than 20,500 applications for children to start school in reception year and to move from infant to their first year of junior education.

Over 99% of parents have been offered a reception place for their child in one of their three preferred schools, with over 93% allocated a place at their first preference. Of pupils transferring from infant to junior school, over 99% received a place at one of their three preferences and over 97% obtained a place at their first preference. Pupils who did not secure a place at one of their preferred schools have been allocated a place at their catchment school or the next nearest school with a place available. In these cases, HCC has advised parents about the right to appeal and their preferred school's waiting list. Places can become available for various reasons including parents changing their mind or families moving home. Parents who applied online have been notified of their offers by email. They can also view their offer by logging into the secure, online portal using the same log-in details provided when making their online application. Those parents who applied on paper have been notified by email if an email address was provided or by post where no email address was provided and should receive their letters in two to three days. Further information including a set of FAQs, is available on the Council's Admissions webpage - https://www.hants.gov.uk/ admissions. For information about school transport assistance and the eligibility criteria, visit the Council's Travel to School webpages - https://www.hants.gov.uk/ educationandlearning/schooltransport (application deadline 31st May).

Highways Improvement Schemes

Nineteen projects, including road resurfacing schemes, have been given the go-ahead using HCC's share of the Government's reallocated 'Network North' HS2 funding. In October 2023, the Government confirmed that Hampshire would receive an additional f4.225m in 2023/24 and f4.225m. in 2024/25 to be ringfenced for the maintenance of local roads, pavements, cycleways and bridges. These improvements will make the sites more resilient to extreme weather, helping to prevent the recurrence of potholes and other defects. In addition, HCC is also investing more money into road repairs. Since April 2023, HCC has deployed this additional resource to fix over 142.000 defects including potholes.

Local areas / roads where work is planned include:

Purbrook Way, Havant Aston Road, Waterlooville Havant Station Footbridge, Havant (a contribution to the bridge renewal).

Buildings for Sale

HCC is selling buildings in Winchester Three Minsters House on the High Street,
Four Chimneys Family Centre near the
Andover Road and property on the
Council's Monarch Way site, near the
Romsey Road. These buildings will close to
staff later this year and services run from

these sites will be relocated to other County Council buildings in Winchester.

Many of the people working in Council offices spend a significant portion of time working directly in the community – delivering services such as social care to vulnerable children and adults, enabled by technology. Some staff also work remotely which has become more frequent since the Covid-19 pandemic. These changes have made it possible to accommodate the same number of staff in fewer buildings, providing an opportunity to save on running costs and ensure that the facilities keep pace with changing patterns of use.

Most of the services to be relocated are office functions that are not generally visited by the public. However, there are a few services in these buildings that are currently visited by local people. These services will be moved to other locations within Winchester accessible by public transport.
