One Year! One whole year!!

By the time this newsletter gets published, my family and I will have been living in Denmead for a year, and I will have completed the first year of my curacy at All Saints. Time seems to have flown by so quickly, it only seems like yesterday that we were living in a sea of boxes (all boxes are finally now unpacked!!). We are loving being part of such a welcoming community. Our family has grown by the addition of Wilf our very well-behaved puppy... (you may have seen me being taken for a walk...)

On the 29th June something exciting will have hopefully happened. I will have been ordained a priest at Portsmouth Cathedral with 5 of my curate colleagues.

"I am now a Priest" feels like a strange and complicated sentence to say despite its short nature. Nevertheless, after a journey, one which I can assure you is not yet over, it will now be a statement of truth. It feels like a peculiar thing to say, and responses vary. Some ask why that wasn't the case when I was ordained Deacon last year, will I still be a curate, (yes!) will I now be leaving Denmead (nope you can't get rid of me that easily!) others want to know if I will still be a Revd (yes, I will), and some just want to know if I will still be available to meet for coffee and cake!

In case you were wondering....

The Church of England has three stages of ordination – or three orders of ministry – deacons, priests and bishops; in practice the newly ordained have a sort-of probationary year in which they preach and lead and do, but they do not preside at Communion and there are some other things they are not able to do. After a year as a deacon, they are usually ordained as priests. Last year I was ordained as a deacon, and I do not stop being a deacon, but take on the added roles of a priest.

Last year, I was surrounded by family and friends and my Godparents at the Cathedral. These were people who have supported me throughout my journey from the beginning, and indeed my entire life. I had only met Revd Emma on a few occasions, and I was essentially stepping into a whole new life: new home, new 'job' and new people to meet. However, this year, I will be being supported in prayer by new faces that now know me, that have contributed to my formation over the last 12 months, people who have prayed for me, helped me learn about the parish of Denmead, new colleagues, new friends. It will be like having an extended set of family with me. I didn't head into ordination as a Deacon last year alone by any means, but this year it feels like it won't just be about me and the point I've reached on the journey; rather it will be about all of you in the parish that I serve, about having those additional priestly elements added to what I am able to

offer to All Saints.

So, when it comes to presiding at the Eucharist for the first time on Sunday 30th June, just what that 'serving' means will come into a much sharper focus. Being a Priest is not about me, although it now forms part of who I am; rather it is about being able to serve the people more fully in the places where I have been called. The three actions that are reserved for a priest (the pronouncing of the absolution (forgiveness), the pronouncing of blessing and presiding at the Eucharist) are all actions that draw us together as a community of worshippers and it is such a privilege to be one of the people now able to do this for the parish.

Highlights from my year in Denmead include, being part of the Holiday Club team, making rock pets at the DHS, hot chocolate and carols, playing and singing with our Little Stars, getting covered in paint at Messy Church, serving more pancakes than I have ever seen, welcoming in Easter Morning with sparklers on the green followed by delicious bacon butties (getting up at 4am because the clocks went forward wasn't quite so enjoyable), dodging enormous puddles and running the Kidmore Lane gauntlet. But most of all having had the opportunity to spend time with and getting to know the people of Denmead. The cups of tea and coffee I have shared with people and the calories I have

consumed from the lovely flapjacks at Barnard's. Walking alongside people in times of sorrow and rejoicing in times of celebration and joy.

What this occasion represents overall is a waypoint on the journey. It marks the beginning of a new season, it marks an ending to some parts, it signifies a next step, it opens new horizons, and it leaves some things behind. This new added priestly 'sparkle' that I will have will take some time to grow into and become more familiar as a part of who I am. But as I

continue to grow, I'll be formed and changed and encouraged and learn new things and it won't ever be just me doing the work. "I am now a Priest" is true, but a better one is "I am now a Priest at All Saints in the parish of Denmead". It does a better job of filling out the reality. I am a Priest in, for, learning from, being formed by, and serving the people of Denmead. I have loved my year among you all and can't wait to see what the next 12 months brings.

When you pause in His presence, you create space for peace in a busy and complicated world.

Nearly There...

An update on our Ghana link

23 years ago, a group of parishioners from Havant Deanery were invited to Koforidua diocese in Ghana. The purpose of this visit was to create some parish to parish friendship links so that each could learn about the others culture, and support one another with prayer.

Denmead linked with St Pauls, at New Tafo Akim and I was asked to be the link coordinator. My Ghanaian contact was Mrs Dorothy Mills-Robertson, with whom I still correspond regularly. That first visit was amazing and I couldn't wait to return as I felt I hadn't even scratched the surface of their culture and parish ways.

St Pauls was an old wooden church, built in 1934, with holes in the roof (which made worshipping in the rainy season impossible)! The congregation were desperately trying to re-build a new church – and they have succeeded! We helped financially with their roof and on one visit, Paul Hillyard and his son Adam spent their whole time working on the building.... Over time I returned almost every year, taking members of All Saints and other churches in Havant deanery. I had definitely become addicted to their wonderful way of life – their

culture, their faith and optimism and I kept going back. On 2 occasions parishioners from St Pauls visited us (including Dorothy) but visas have been difficult for them to obtain and have been refused far too often.

By 2006 St Pauls new church was finished! And they now set their sights on building a Mission House (vicarage) for their priest. Their vision was also to build a school, which would attract and recruit new church members. They had land behind the church, taken up by a beautiful large tree where the Sunday School used to meet. Sadly the tree was felled, the foundations for the Mission







House were laid and by 2017 it was built! All Saints helped in prayer and sometimes financially, when donations were given. In 2012 a bequest was given to All Saints for the Ghana fund and through the vision of one particular Ghanaian priest, plans were drawn up to put an upper storey above the Mission House, to be used as a church hall and maybe to start a daily, fee paying, creche.

The construction of the hall was not started until 2019 and with the help of the bequest it was finally finished in 2023.... On our visit in 2023 the hall accommodated over 50 children and adults for a messy church afternoon. It was great fun, we took

out craft supplies with us and the afternoon finished with refreshments, singing and dancing – so joyful!

So in 2024 we are NEARLY THERE... The hall has been converted into 2 classrooms, the walls have bright posters on them, they are beginning to recruit children for a September intake BUT the rooms are empty, there is

no equipment, no chairs, tables or even a fridge for storing milk and food. They have appointed 2 teachers for September (and a cleaner) – all the stationery/crayons have been promised as a donation from the incumbent priest. They are hoping to have a fund raising service in June or July but this will only produce a fraction of the cost needed for equipment.

I have not promised any money but I have said that I will ask, pray and hope that some of our villagers, here in Denmead, might respond..... What I CAN promise is that every penny donated will only be spent on school equipment and when I visit in October I will take more photos of the classrooms and the children.







Denmead Walks

This walk follows a gentle, level route through Creech Wood, then along the outlying lanes and footpaths to the south of Denmead. The return leg is on Wayfarers Walk which is picked up at Sheepwash Farm, continues across the local golf course then finishes on the village Greenways.

WALK DETAILS:

Length: 7km/4.4 miles Time 1h 30m Stiles 6 Walk Grade 3

Leaving the Harvest Home (HH) pub car park (CP) go R then cross the roundabout heading up Bunkers Hill before branching L onto the footpath (FP) on reaching the 40mph sign on the edge of Creech Woods. Ignore the path on the L and continue uphill as far as the road leading into the CP. Walk through the CP before turning L in front of a sign denoting the Creech Wood Walking Trail. Stay on this straight route through the woods for some distance which finally emerges from under a canopy of trees. The final section has a FP and bridleway running parallel to each other:

I.6km/I mile At Furzeley Road go R then bear R again at Furzeley Corner in the direction of Sheepwash. 2.km/I.5miles Turn R into Belney Lane at Threeways junction soon passing a section of the Southwick Solar Farm on the RHS.

2.8 km/1.75 miles On reaching two dwellings on the LHS turn L off Belney Lane passing between the house and bungalow following the direction indicated by the finger post - the latter is positioned on the RHS of Belney Lane. The footpath here is

not clear but after walking through a wide yard cross a field going very slightly L.

On the far side of the field go over a stile then follow the enclosed path which soon widens into a farm track. On reaching a wide metal gate go L as indicated by the yellow FP sign and walking parallel to the hedge on the R. After about 60m turn R, again keeping close to the hedge whilst heading for the metal gate.

3.5km/2.2miles Turn R onto Sheepwash Lane, pass the main farm building on the RHS then cross a small bridge. Staying on the lane which bears slightly L, pick up the Wayfarers Way FP about 20m further along the lane on the LHS. The FP has two bridges and several stiles to cross before passing through Closewood Farm.

4.3km/2.7miles Emerging onto a potentially dangerous section of Newlands Lane after climbing over the final stile, turn L but it is important to keep to the right-hand side of the road. In 400m/364yards turn R at Pipers Hill junction. Walk 200m/ 182yds along Closewood Road before picking up the footpath on the LHS that soon opens out onto a field. If there are crops in the field please go around the perimeter in a clockwise direction, however the official footpath cuts diagonally across the field slightly to the R.

Great care is needed crossing four fairways on the golf course. Firstly, head for the footbridge then follow the direction of the yellow footpath arrows and continue to the other side of the course heading for what looks like a tall fence on the edge of woodland. Remain on the well-marked

narrow footpath passing a paddock then stables on the RHS. On reaching Furzeley Road go R. $\,$

5.7km/3.6miles At the junction with Forest Road again be alert in crossing this busy road and continue along the path opposite as far as Mead End Greenway. Turn L and on the Greenways heading west through Forest Mead, Home Mead then into Creech View after crossing a narrow bridge. Roman Green, in front of the Harvest Home is soon reached after crossing two side roads leading into the estate.

Home Library Service

If you can't get to the library due to ill-health, disability or caring responsibilities the library can come to you. Report a Pothole

If you see a highway issue which needs urgent attention telephone 0300 555 1388 (8.30am to 5.00pm Monday - Friday. Outside of office hours, phone 101 (emergencies only).

Emergency defects are usually made safe within two hours. These repairs may be temporary with permanent repairs being made later. Other defects become part of the maintenance programme and are usually repaired within two months. Larger or more complex works, such as major resurfacing, are generally scheduled separately.

Safeguarding Adults

If you, or a vulnerable adult you know, is being harmed in any way by another person please do not ignore it. If you have concerns or want to report abuse phone Hampshire Adult Services on 0300 555 1386 or the police on 101. In an emergency, or if you suspect you or someone else is in immediate danger, phone 999.

Free Shingles Vaccine for 70 – 79 Year Olds

A vaccine to prevent shingles, a common, painful skin disease, is available on the NHS to people in their 70s. Unlike the flu vaccine, you'll only need to have the vaccination once and you can have it at any time of year.

The shingles vaccine is expected to reduce the risk of getting shingles. If you go on to have the disease, your symptoms may be milder and shorter. You can also have the shingles vaccine if you've already had shingles. It works effectively in people who have had shingles before and boosts immunity against further attacks. Your GP will tell you how long to wait after you recover from shingles before having the vaccine which may be up to a year.



The shingles vaccine is not available on the NHS to anyone aged 80 or over as it is less effective in this age group.

Once you become eligible for the shingles vaccination a GP or practice nurse will offer you the vaccine when you attend the surgery for general reasons. However, if you are worried that you may miss out on the shingles vaccination, contact your GP surgery to arrange an appointment to have the vaccine.
