This season shows us a glimpse of the unceasing cycle of birth, life, death and rebirth which governs the natural world, and it is therefore unsurprising that it is during this season that we remember. Memories, and remembering, are such central parts of our personalities and character, and in many ways make up part of who we are.

November seems to be the month for remembering. We share in a service of All Souls at the beginning of the month, a chance to remember with thankfulness those whom we have loved but see no more.



And, of course, there is also our national act of Remembrance, on Remembrance Sunday 10th November: That remembrance is even more poignant today as the reality of war and its human cost is once again apparent and sadly dominates our news. To mark and commemorate this significant day we will be having a short Remembrance service with communion at 8.30 am at All Saints, before joining with villagers, local councillors, uniformed groups and local schools for a Village Act of Remembrance.

We will remember with grateful hearts those who gave their

everything for our today and future. Please gather at 10.45am at the village green for this important event.

There is no single thing in our created world which lasts forever, this is true both of all individual human beings, and also of our human endeavours.

None of the first Christian congregations established by St Paul and the Apostles still exists today, yet those communities were the initial sparks which set the world on fire with the Gospel of Christ. All earthly things are transitory and fleeting, and so we must focus on the good that they can bring about during their limited lifespan. This is true of every human being and every relationship. we must focus on the good that they can bring about But if all human beings and all human endeavours are temporary, so too is human suffering. As Christians we believe that suffering never has the final world; that isn't to minimise the great pain of suffering, but it is to emphasise the even greater power of God who promises that a time is coming when he will "Wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away" Revelation 21:4

For Christians, the most significant act of remembering is when we come together to remember in bread and wine the death and resurrection of Jesus. Jesus' willing sacrifice of himself on the cross for the sake of others is, for Christian believers, the ultimate expression of the self-giving love at the heart of God, when Christ's hands were marked by the nails of the cross.

pause, reflect, and be thankful Just as through the death of Jesus Christ on the cross, we know that the power of death has been defeated. We can trust in a God who has defeated death, and who has opened the gates to eternal life for all who trust in him, that God's faithfulness endures forever.

So, in this season of Remembrance, as we remember with candles, poppies, or bread and wine, may we all take time to pause, reflect, and be thankful.

DVA increases Cyber Awareness

The Chair opened the Village Association meeting by reminding members of the importance of the Neighbourhood Plan, which is being updated, and that the role of DVA is to ensure that views are known to the planning authority.

He continued by updating members on news including the launch of a newsletter, the re-launch of the Fitness Trail at the end of August and the first meeting of the Drama Group, which was well supported. At the next meeting, the AGM, will be a speaker from the Mary Rose Trust and, if sufficient interest, a visit will be arranged next year. The Chair reminded members of the opportunity to nominate officers or committee members to be voted in at the AGM, these should be forwarded to the Secretary. DVA has also introduced a village diary and the Greening group has conducted a Bat Walk, which 50 people attended.

The speaker at October's meeting, Claire Wills, is a Cyber Champion, introduced in 2020 to advise on crimes committed electronically. In 2021 losses through cybercrime totalled £2.25bn. She advised on Cyber Awareness – for instance when phone calls don't 'feel right' and

recommended ending the call. Never give personal details to an unknown caller as a scammer can use these to build a picture. One extremely important item was strong passwords (not containing personal information!) and for emails, google and bank accounts to create a passphrase of three random words. She confirmed that fingerprint technology is secure. Claire recommended that we use Password Browser or Browser Password Store, backup data regularly and update software as soon as possible. Social media information should be shared with as few people as possible. All fraud and cybercrime should be reported to Action Fraud.

The AGM will be held on 15th November. Meetings are at 7.30pm in the Church Hall and take place on alternate months. Annual membership is £8.

Denmead Walks

This walk can start either at Denmead Community Centre or Kidmore Lane CP in the centre of the village. The outward route is along Wayfarers toward Hambledon, over Speltham Down then up the other side of the valley before heading back in an anticlockwise direction passing through two local farms. Stunning views will be enjoyed from several high points above Hambledon.

WALK DETAILS: Length 10km/6.25 miles Time 2h 30m Stiles 4 (2 from K Lane) WALK GRADE 3/5

Leave Denmead Community Centre car park (CP) by the rear gate and turn L going uphill on the Hambledon road. At Lincoln Green nursery cross the road and head along the footpath. On reaching woodland either take the path on the L by going over a stile, or, if underfoot conditions are poor, take the parallel route through the woods – each path joins Wayfarers Walk in 300m.

From Kidmore Lane CP go R then after 150m bear L into Cemetery Lane. Turn R just before the end of the lane and follow the WW signs first on a dog-leg then along the side of a field. The two starting routes meet at the first metal gate. If taking this route go straight on after passing through gate.

I km/0.6mile Turn L and walk along the side of the field eventually going through a second gate.

I.5km/0.9mile Go L after passing through the gate then R into Harrowgate Lane. After a further 80m bear L passing through another gate and head diagonally across the field on a well-marked FP. Go through a gap in the hedge on the far side, turn L then stay on the path until the lane connecting Rookwood and Rushmere is reached.

2.3km/1.4miles Turn R here and walk exactly 100m



before turning L following the green WW path signs. Go R about 50m ahead at the telegraph pole and head along the first of two fields keeping to the RHS. At the end of the second field the path goes L, then R before passing a mounted blue painted metal press which is on the LHS.

3.2km/2miles At Bury Lodge Lane go L, then after about 25m turn R picking up a FP which runs along the RHS of a field. This leads to a narrow copse and on leaving the latter there is a junction of paths; here turn R and walk along the path which has a hedge on the LHS continuing downhill as far as a gate that leads onto Speltham Down.

3.6km/2.25miles This is the first of several gates on the Down; the path continues downhill, but maybe pause for a moment or have a short rest on the bench situated on the side of the FP enjoying the first of several stunning views over the village. At the bottom of the hill pass through another gate then fork L on the path through a third gate. Head across the meadow eventually coming to the penultimate gate in this section of the walk – often the adjacent five-bar gate is open. At this point go R passing through the final gate and exiting the Down. A series of steps lead into a lane that comes out onto the Hambledon road opposite Weaverfield House.

4.1km/2.6miles Cross the road then turn R. Walk almost as far as the point where the road bears L; here pick up the FP on the L. Continue uphill for some distance eventually turning R through a gate made from a recycled pallet. Again, enjoy the panoramic view over the village, this time from the other side of the valley. Walk the short distance to a wide gap on the LHS at the top of the field and go L almost back on yourself. Follow the wide track which has Boarhuts



Copse on the L as far as a second pallet gate giving access to Cams Hill Lane.

5km/3.1 miles Go R onto the lane immediately passing the murder stone and walk about 300m before turning L onto the Alan King Way FP opposite Headstone Stud Farm. The path borders a garden, then goes across a wide cultivated field as it heads for Hole Farm – aim for the LH end of the fence on the far side of the field. Take the permissive path to the R around the property by passing through a series of gates, cross the access road to the farm, pass through another gate then bear L downhill. Pass through another gate into Hole Lane then head uphill keeping the garden of Hole Farm on your LHS.

6.4km/4miles Pass through a final gate into woodland at the top of the rise, go through a short S bend then bear L through the narrow strip of wood before passing through another gate. Walk obliquely to the R across a narrow field before going through the final gate in this section of the walk. Keeping the wood, Shepherd's Croft, on your RHS make around its perimeter and where it bends to the R follow the line of the trees finally entering the wood itself then a short path leads to Menslands Lane.

6.87km/4.3miles Turn L and continue along the lane eventually passing Glebelands Farm after just over 400m. About 30m further on bear R following a well-marked FP through Madam's Copse. At the end of this woodland path exit the latter through the first of a series of gates. Enjoy the view toward Bury Lodge to the L when heading downhill before going through several gates soon reaching Fareham Road that connects Hambledon with World's End. Note that is maybe necessary to unhook a fence just before the second gate – make sure the hooks are repositioned!

Take care crossing the last stile as the drop is straight onto the roadway. Cross the lane and pass through the first of three further gates; the first gives access to a field in which horses are kept, while the final two are either side of a shallow ditch – be warned that after heavy rain this area acts as a flood plain and can be impassable. After the last gate of the walk the path starts to rise and heads toward a metal gate alongside the B2150.

8.1 km/5.1 miles Do not go through the gate adjacent to the road but turn R toward the woodland. After going uphill through the narrow copse follow the yellow FP sign across the field eventually passing through the gap in the hedge on the far side. Straight after passing through the gap turn L and stay on the path with hedging on the LHS. Just before the ground starts to rise in front continue on the distinct FP diagonally across the field to the R, cross a short bridge and head up a narrow FP that leads to Uplands Road.

9.1 km/5.7 miles On reaching this road go L, then immediately R down Thompson's Lane. At the bottom of the hill turn L into School Lane and continue to the end of this road where the community centre is on the LHS. For those who started at Kidmore Lane turn R at the end of School Lane and walk toward the village centre – the distance to Kidmore Lane is about 800m.

In the period covered, high numbers of road defects continue to be fixed, alongside the completion of larger resurfacing and planned maintenance.
